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FOREWORD

The Government of Rwanda, through the National Institute of Statistics of Rwanda (NISR) conducted the 2022 Rwanda Population and Housing Census to provide updated demographic, social and economic indicators for policy formulation and planning to support the national development agenda and track the implementation of national, regional, continental and global development goals, such as the First National Strategy for Transformation (NST1 2017-2024); the AU Agenda 2063; and the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

The Population and Housing Census in Rwanda dates back to the year 1978 when the first ever modern census was implemented. The second, third, and fourth censuses were carried out in 1991, 2002, and 2012 respectively. The 2022 Population and Housing Census marks therefore the Fifth in the series following the United Nations Recommendations to conduct a census every ten years.

Considering census' crucial importance for the planning process, the Government of Rwanda has made the Population and Housing Census a priority to be undertaken every 10 years and adopted the use of technologies for timely delivery of census results for use.

Results of the 2022 Population and Housing Census provide population numbers from national to the lowest administrative level, as well as demographic and socio-economic indicators at both national and district levels. The census remains the only national data collection exercise that can provide the lowest levels of disaggregation to support decentralised decision making across the country.

I would like therefore to take this opportunity to thank all stakeholders that contributed to the success of the 2022 Population and Housing Census. They include Ministries and other Government institutions, international organizations such as the World Bank (WB), the European Union (EU), the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA), One-UN, UN Women, UNICEF, UNECA, the United Kingdom AID (UKAID), the African Development Bank (AfDB), the USAID, Enabel, PARIS 21 and others for their support in diverse ways.

My special thanks go to the local government leaders from the province to the village levels who contributed a lot to the success of the 2022 Population and Housing Census. CHAPTER 1: POPULATION SIZE, SPATIAL DISTRIBUTION, AND STRUCTURE

1.1 Size and special Distribution of the population

1.1.1 Size and Spatial Distribution of the Population of Western Province

The 5th Rwanda Population and Housing Census (PHC5) has enumerated 2,896,484 residents in the Western Province, which represents 22% of the total population of Rwanda (13,246,394 residents). The population of Western Province is predominantly female; 1,511,849 are women corresponding to 52.9% of the total population of the Province. Rubavu is most the populated district with 546,683 residents in 2022. Its population represents 18.9% of the total residents' population of Western Province. The least populated district in the Western is Nyabihu with 319,047 inhabitants, corresponding to 11.0% of the total resident population of Western Province.

1.1.2 Population Density of the Western Province by District

Population density is a measurement of population per unit land area. Density is the number of the inhabitant per km². The Rwanda Population and Housing Census conducted in 2022 revealed that, the population density in Rwanda is 503 inhabitants per km². The Western province has 693 inhabitants per Km². The district with a high population density is Rubavu with 1,614 Inhabitants per km². The district with a lowest population density is Karongi with 482 Inhabitants per km². The figure below indicates distribution of population density per district.




Figure 1. 3 Distribution of population density by sectors of Karongi District

1.1.3 Size and Spatial Distribution of the Population of the Karongi District

The 5th Rwanda Population and Housing Census (PHC5) has enumerated 374,319 residents in Karongi District which represent 21.4% of the total population of Western Province (Table 1.1). The population of Karongi District is predominantly male: 195,780 are men corresponding to 52.3% of its total population.

The table 1.2 below indicates the number of the population of Karongi District by sector, by sex (count and percentage) across sectors. The population of Karongi District is predominantly male: 195,452 residents in this district are women corresponding to 52.3% of its total population.

Sector with high percentage of females is Murambi (53.1%) and the sector with high percentage of males is Gitesi (48.2%). Bwishyura, Rubengera and Rwankuba are the most populated sectors. They represent respectively 10.9%; 16.0%; 10.8% and 10.2% of the total population of Karongi District.

The two less populated sectors are Ruganda (5.1%) and (5.7%).

1.1.4 Size and Spatial Distribution of the Population of Karongi District by residence area

The results of Rwanda Population and housing census 2022 revealed that, the total population of Rwanda are spatially distributed in rural area that represent 72.1% and urban area represent 27.9%. The Western Province is predominantly by the rural area (77.9%) of the total residents) and rural area (22.1% of the total residents). Karongi District population lives predominantly in rural area (91.0%) while resident population in urban represents 9%.

Almost all sectors of Karongi District (11 out of 13 sectors) are entirely rural. Only Bwishyura and Rubengera sectors have some urban areas.


1.1.5 Age-sex structure of the population of Karongi District

Karongi population is mostly young 64.4% of the resident population of Karongi is under 30 years, as shown by the age pyramid (Figure 4), reflecting the high level of fertility in the recent past. The elderly (60 years and above) represents 7.9% of the total population of the district. The percentage share of the population aged 0-14 represents 38.0%, the population aged 15-29 years represents 26.4% and 30 to 85 years and above represents 35.6%. The table 1.4 below illustrates the results, and more details of sectors are in the annex.

1.1.6 Population share (%) of some specific interventions target groups in Karongi District by sex

The Rwanda population and housing census 2022 indicates the population on specific ages-based programs, policy and strategies interventions in health, education, employment and also indicates the population categories in their respective characteristics such as children, youth, working population, among other things. For instance, children under five years for immunization programs (Under 5 children), children in education (3-17 years), people in the official working age group (16-64 years), etc. Knowing the size of such groups is of great importance for the design, implementation, monitoring, and evaluation of programs targeting such groups.

The results of the census indicate that children under five years represent 12.1% of the total population of the district and the population aged 0-17 represents 45.4% while the population aged 16-30 years represent 25.4%. The economically active population aged 16-64 years represents 54.5% of the same population.

The table above gives the size of the main interventions target groups by sex, and their share in the entire population of Karongi district.

CHAPTER 2: CHARACTERISTICS OF THE POPULATION

2.1 Socio-cultural characteristics of the population

2.1.1 Distribution (Count and %) of the resident population of Karongi district by Nationality and by sector

The results of the 5th RPHC-2022 indicate that the Rwandan population by nationality represent 99.11% and foreigners represent 0.89%. In the Western Province, foreigners represent 0.5% and Karongi districts, the Rwandan by nationality represent 97.12% and foreigners represent 2.99% (10,760). One sector of Karongi District that have the highest percentage of foreigners compared to others is Rwankuba (27.14%).

The table below illustrates the distribution of the population by nationality with their respective sectors of residence.

2.1.2 Religious affiliation of the resident population of Karongi District

In Karongi District, Christianity is the predominant religion: 27.0% are Adventists, 26.6% are protestants, 21.1% are Catholics, 17.9% are ADEPR and 4% are others Christians. Globally, 94.4% of the total population of Karongi District are Christians. Other religious represented are Muslim (0.5%) and Jehovah witness (0.3%) while 3.5% of the resident population declared themselves to be without religion.

2.2 Marital Status of the resident population of Karongi District

2.2.1 Marital status by sector

The results of 5RPHC-2022 revealed that 48.4% of the resident population of Karongi District aged 12 and above are living in union (married officially to one wife/husband, married not officially to one wife/husband and live in polygamous union) at the time of the census while 45.4% are never married, 5.0% are widowed, while divorced and separated are respectively 0.1% and 1.0%. At the sector level, two sectors have the highest percentages of the currently married: Gitesi (50.8%), Ruganda and Rugabano (50.4% each). Rwankuba (50.4%), Rubengera (46.7%) and Bwishyura (46.1%) have the highest percentages of the never married persons. Murundi and Gishyita sectors have high percentage of widowed persons (6.5% and 6.1% respectively).

2.2.2 Marital status by age groups

The percentages of resident population of Karongi District by marital status vary by sex and age: the percentage of never married persons decreases from 99.9% (age group of 12-14 years) to 0.9% (age group of 80 years and above).

The percentage of persons currently married starts by increasing from 0.1% (age group of 12-14 years) to a maximum of 87.7% (age group of 40-44 years) before decreasing to 50% (age group 80+) due mainly to widowhood (49.4%).

The highest percentage of divorced persons (0.4%) is observed from age group 40-44 and 50-54, while the highest percentage of the separated persons (2.1%) is found in age group 45-49 years.

2.3 Educational Characteristics of the Population of Karongi District

2.3.1 School attendance

School attendance among children is presented by education levels according to the official school ages: the preschool-age (3-5 years), the primary school-age (6-11 years) and the secondary school-age (12-17 years).

In Karongi District, 59.3% of pre-primary-age population (3-5 years) are currently attending school while 40.7% have never attended. No child declared being attending nursery school before the time of census and dropped-out during census time.

By sector, has the highest percentage of children currently attending pre-school in Murambi Sector (74.4%). It is followed by Ruganda (72.4 %) and Gashari (70.6 %) and the lowest percentage of children currently attending pre-school is found in Rwankuba (39.0%) and Twumba (38.6%), means that Rwankuba and Twumba are the sectors having the highest proportions of children aged 3 to 5 who have never attended school (61.0% and 61.4%, respectively).

Table 2.6 shows that in Karongi District, 92.4% of children age 6 to 11 years (the official primary school-going age) are currently attending school and 6.3% have never attended school while only 1.3% have previously attended school (which means that 7.6% of children aged 6 to 11 are out of school).

By comparing the distribution of the primary school-age population (6-11 years) in Karongi District, the results reveal the disparities in primary school attendance across different sectors within the district.

Ruganda (96.2%), Gishyita (95.5%) and Murambi (95.1%) demonstrate higher rates of children currently attending school. Lower rates of children who have never attended are found in the same sectors: Ruganda(3.2%) and Murambi (3.0%)

In Karongi District, 20.6% of the population aged 12 to 17 have previously attended school (i.e. they dropped out of school), 77.3% are currently attending school and 2.1% have never attended secondary school.

The distribution of the secondary school-age population (12-17 years) across sectors in Karongi District shows that Ruganda sector has the highest percentage of the population aged 12 to 17 currently attending school at 84.9%. Conversely, Rugabano sector has the lowest percentage of the population aged 12 to 17 currently attending school with 66.9%.

The highest percentage of the population aged 12 to 17 who have never attended school is found in Mubuga (4.4%), Rugabano (2.9%), Rwankuba and Twumba (2.7% each) and the highest percentages of drop out are found in Rugabano (30.2%), Twumba (26.7%) and Gitesi (22.9%).

2.3.2 Gross and Net Attendance Rates (%) Karongi District

Gross and Net Attendance Ratios are used to measure the extent of coverage of an educational program. It gives a comparison of the children attending school with the total size of the school-age population. It can also be used for assessing how far a country has succeeded in bringing to school all those who are eligible to attend.

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 reveal that not all children attending primary school level are of the official age for that level (6-11 years). The gross attendance rate is 141.7% in Rwanda; 139.8% in the Western Province and 148.6% in Karongi District. The Net Attendance Rate (NAR) in Primary school for Karongi District (92.4%) is greater than the NAR of the Western Province (87.8%) and the NAR at national level (89.3%).

A Gross Attendance Rate (GAR) of 148.6% in Karongi District for the population 6 to 11 years indicates a high percentage of those who attended primary schools aged below 6 years and or above 11 years. On the other hand, the Net Attendance Rate (NAR) indicates that only 92.4% of the population 6 to 11 years were attending primary school in Karongi District by 2022 (Table 2.8).

In 2022, students older or younger than the official primary school age range made up 37.8% [(GAR148.6-NAR92.4)/GAR148.6)] of the primary school population of Karongi District. With a NAR of 96.2%, Ruganda Sector has the greatest percentage of pupils that are attending primary school and are of primary school-age. In comparison to other sectors, Mutuntu Sector has the lowest NAR at 85.2%.

The gender parity index is slightly greater than 1.00 in all sectors, suggesting better access to education for female students compared to male students. The table below displays details:

The table 2. 9 provides information on the gross and net attendance rates in the secondary school level (12-17 years) disaggregated by sex and sector in Karongi District.

Karongi District (22.9%) has a higher NAR than the Western Province (20.6%) and the national average (22.3%). Comparing males and females in Karongi District in terms of Net Attendance Rates (NAR), the results indicate that a higher proportion of females (27.5%) are attending school compared to males (18.4%) within the secondary school-age range (12-17 years).

Female students older or younger than the official secondary school age range made up 41.6% [(GAR47.1-NAR27.5)/GAR47.1] of the female with secondary school age of Karongi District, while for male students it made up 49.1% [(GAR36.2-NAR18.4)/GAR36.2]. This shows that females have a higher attendance rate in Karongi District compared to males when considering the overall attendance rates, regardless of age or grade-level eligibility.

Among the sectors in Karongi District, Rwankuba (53.8%), Bwishyura (53.1%) and Rubengera (50.5%) have the highest GAR for both sexes. Rugabano has the lower GAR (27.2%) compared to other sectors.

Also, Bwishyura has the highest NAR for both sexes in Karongi District, with a rate of 30.0% and Rugabano has the lowest (15.9%) compared to other sectors. The table below displays details:

2.3.3 Highest level of school attended in Karongi District

The results of 5RPHC-2022 indicate the total population of Rwanda aged 3 and above is 11,999,691. The highest level of education attended is categorized into several levels: Never attended School, Nursery, Primary, INGOBOKA/Vocational, Lower secondary, Upper secondary, University and Not stated. In Rwanda, 16.7% of the population aged 3 years and above has never attended school while 2.7% have attended nursery, and 59.5% have attended primary school. Other education levels include 0.8% for INGOBOKA/Vocational, 9.6% for lower secondary, 7.1% for upper secondary, 3.6% for university, and 0.0% is not stated.

The total population of the Western Province aged 3 and above is 2,613,461. The distribution of the highest level of education attended is like the national level with slight variations. In the Western Province, 19.4% of the population have never attended school, while 2.2% have attended nursery and 60.7% have attended primary school. Other education levels include 0.6% for INGOBOKA/Vocational, 8.7% for lower secondary, 6.2% for upper secondary, 2.2% for university and 0.0% is not stated.

The total population of Karongi District aged 3 and above is 339,452. In Karongi District, 17.0% of the population have never attended school while 2.6% have attended nursery and 61.7% have attended primary school. Other education levels include 0.9% for INGOBOKA/Vocational, 9.5% for lower secondary, 6.3% for upper secondary, 1.9% for university and 0.0% is not stated.

The distribution of the highest level of education attended varies among sectors with differences in the percentage of individuals at each education level. For example, Rugabano (21.9%), Rwankuba (21.8%) and Mutuntu (20.1%) have higher percentages of individuals who have never attended school compared to other sectors while Bwishyura has higher

percentages of individuals attended Lower secondary (11.7%) and upper secondary school (9.3%). Each sector has its own unique distribution of education levels attended by the population.

2.4 Characteristics of the employed population in Karongi District

The official working age in Rwanda is 16 years and above. Aggregate employment generally increases with growing population. Therefore, the ratio of Employment to the working age population (employment to population ratio) is an important indicator of the capacity of the Economy to provide employment to a growing population. A decline in the employment-to population ratio is often regarded as an indicator of economic slowdown and a decline in total employment as an indicator of a more severe economic downturn.

2.4.1 Employment to population ratio in the Western Province

The results presented in the below table 2.11 shows that the employment to population ratio stood at 45.9% in Rwanda. It is lower among females (40.2%) than males (52.4%). On the other side, it was observed that the employment to population ratio is higher in urban areas of Rwanda (53.5%) than in rural areas (42.7%).

In the Western Province, the employment to population ratio stood at 42.3% and it is higher in urban areas (48.2%) than in rural areas (40.6%).

It was also revealed that the employment to population ratio is 36.4% among people residing in Karongi District. By area of residence, it is higher in urban (51.2%) than in rural (34.9%) and by sex, it is higher for male than for female in both urban (59.4% to 43.9%) and rural (39.7% to 30.9%).


2.4.2 Employment to population ratio (EPR) by age group in Karongi District

In Karongi District, the employment to population ratio among males as well as females increases from age group 16-19 to 30-34 and starts decreasing from age group 45-49 to 85 years and above as people starts getting very older and retire.

It was observed that the highest employment to population ratio among males stands at 57.2% and was observed in age group 30-34. Among females, the highest employment to population ratio is 42.1% and is observed in the age group 35-39.

The lowest employment to population ratio stands at 4.3% among males and 2.8% among females and is observed in the age group 85 and above as well for males than for females. The figure 2.1 bellow reveals the details:

3.1 Children Population (0-17 years)

According to the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child (1989), a child is defined as every human being under 18 unless, under the law applicable to the child, majority is attained earlier. It is relevant to underline here that this definition by age coincides with that of Rwanda, as stipulated in Article 3 of the National Law n° 54/2011 of 14 December 2011 relating to the rights and the protection of the child, which stipulates that a child is any person under the age of 18. The age range (0–17) adopted for this report reflects this definition.

3.1.1 Number and share of children in Karongi District

At the national level, the children population constitute 44.5% of the total population of 13,246,394 residents. The Southern Province has 1,355,679 children with a share of 46.8% of the total resident population.

In Karongi District, the children constitute 45.4% of the resident population of the district with a percentage of males slightly greater than the females' one (49.0% to 44.8%).

At sector level, the children's share is high in Mubuga (47.6%) and Gitesi (46.9%) and is small in Rubengera (44.1%).

The table below indicates the details by sector and by sex.

3.1.2 Children with birth registration in Karongi District

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 indicate the percentage of children whose birth was registered is 94.3% at the national level. The birth registration rate in Karongi District is 95.5%. Birth registration performance is almost the same in urban (95.2%) and (95.6%) in the rural areas of Karongi District.

3.1.3 Birth registration by sector

The children birth registration varies across sectors and areas of residence in Karongi District. In this district, 11 sectors are entirely rural and only 2 sectors (Bwishyura and Rubengera) have both urban and rural areas.

In Karongi District, the percentage of birth registration is higher than 95% in 9 sectors out of 13. The lower percentages are found in Mubuga (93.5%), Murundi (93.8%), Bwishyura (94.5%) and Mutuntu (94.8%). The variation by sex is not very marked in all sectors.

3.2 Youth population (16-17 years)

For statistical purposes, the United Nations defines "youth" as those persons aged 15 years to 24 years, without prejudice to other definitions by Member States. Considering the current priorities and trends of Rwanda's Development, the definition of "Youth" in terms of age has been revised in this policy. It was brought from 14 -35 years to 16–30 years.

3.2.1 The youth population in Karongi District

The results of the 5th 5th Population and housing Censuses conducted in 2022 reveal that the youth population represent 27.1% (3,595,670) of the total population (13,246,394) at national level. In Karongi District, the youth population is 94,832 which represents 25.4% of the total resident population of the district (373,869).

The sector with the highest youth share is Rwankuba (28.9%) while Murundi (21.6%) has the lowest share of youth.

The table below indicate distribution of youth by sector and by sex.

3.2.2 Educational characteristics of youth in Karongi District

Youth who never attended school represent 5.1% of the youth resident population at national level; it represents 6.6% of the total resident population of youth in Western Province and 4.4% of its total resident population of Karongi District.

The percentage of youth who never attended school varies a lot within sectors of Karongi District. The highest percentage was registered in Mubuga (6.9%) while the lowest percentages were registered in Bwishyura and Murambi (3.1% each).

3.2.3 Distribution of the youth population of Karongi district aged 16-30 years by Sector of residence and highest level of education attended

In Karongi District, 50.8% of youth attainded only the primary school level, 24.3% attainded the lower secondary education, 16.4% attainded the upper secondary education, 3.0% attainded university and 4.4% have never attended school.

The highest level of education attained varies across sectors of the district. The sectors with the highest percentage of youth never attended school are Mubuga (6.9%), Mutuntu (6.1%) and Rugabano (5.7%).

The percentage of youth with university level is high in Bwishyura (6.5%) and Rubengera (4.3%).

The sectors with the highest percentages of youth with primary education are Rugabano (64.3%), Gitesi (62.4%) and Murundi (57.2%).

3.2.4 Employment to population ration among youth in Karongi District

The Census results showed that in Rwanda the employment to population ratio among youth stands at 40.3%, it is higher among males (44.8%) than females (36.2%). It was observed that in Karongi District, the employment to population ratio among youth stands at 31.7%. It is higher among males (34.9%) than females (28.7%). The highest employment to population ratio among youth in Karongi District was observed in Rugabano (41.6%) and Rubengera (38.2%). The lowest employment to population ratio among youth was observed in Ruganda (16.9%) and Murambi (20.2%).

3.2.5 Status in employment of youth population in Karongi District

In Karongi District, the majority of youth aged 16-30 currently employed are employees (61.8%) followed by own account worker without regular employees (29.8%). The highest percentage of youth employees is found in Murambi (77.1%), while the lowest is in Murundi (41.5%). The biggest share of youth as own account worker without regular employees is found in Murundi (48.1%) while the lowest is in Murambi (16.3%).

3.2.6 Youth neither in employment nor in education or training in Western Province

The results of 5RPHC-2022 indicate that, the proportion of Youth (16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training in Rwanda stood at 39.5%. It is higher among females (43.8%) than males (34.9%).

In Western Province, the proportion of youth (aged 16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training is 42.6% and it is lower among males (38.5%) than females (46.3%). The results also reveal that the aforementioned proportion is higher in rural areas of Western Province (44.6%) than in urban areas (36.1%).

The proportion of youth (aged 16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training among people residing in Karongi District stood at 44.3%. It is much higher among people residing in rural areas (46.0%) than the ones residing in urban areas (29.7%).

3.3 Persons with disabilities

In 2015, the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and its Sustainable Development Goals was agreed by 193 countries with a commitment, where possible, to disaggregate the statistics they generate by disability. The purpose was to provide important insights about the extent to which persons with disabilities (PWDs) are being included in society, benefit from government programmes, or are included in the workforce.

The results of the 5th PHC reveal that at the national level, 3.4% of the resident population aged 5 and above have a disability. In Karongi District, the disability prevalence rate is 3.8%. At sector level, the highest prevalence rates of the resident population aged 5 and above with disability are in Murundi (6.1%), Mutuntu (5.8%), Gitesi (5.0%) and Ruganda (4.5%). The lowest is in Rwankuba (2.8%).

Regarding the prevalence of disability among the population age 5 years and above by type of disability, at national level, 1.4% have a disability of not seeing, 1.1% have a disability of walking. All the remaining type of disabilities (Hearing, communicating, Remembering or concentrating, self-care, short stature and albinism their respective prevalence is under 1%). The table below indicates that in Karongi District the prevalence of disability of seeing is at 1.64% and walking (1.24).

3.4 Elderly Population (60 years and above)

Rwanda has enacted laws such as the Law No 088/01 of 07/09/2020 (Office of the Official Gazette of Rwanda, 2020) on Presidential order ratifying the protocol to the African charter on human and peoples' rights on the rights of older persons in Africa adopted by the twenty sixth ordinary session of the Assembly, held in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia, on 31 January 2016 through an Official Gazette No.27 of 07/09/2020 and Law No.59/2008 of 10/09/2008 on prevention and punishment of gender- based violence (Office of the Official Gazette of Rwanda, 2008), whose Article 32 sets the penalty for violence against an elderly person.

It is over two decades since the United Nations convened the First World Assembly on Ageing (Vienna, 1982) (National Academy of Sciences, National Research Council, 2001)) that launched an international action program, which was the first international instrument on ageing, to provide a foundation for the formulation of policies and programs on ageing. This was done to guarantee economic and social security to older persons and other opportunities to contribute to national development.

3.4.1 Elderly population of Karongi District

In 2022, the elderly persons constitute 7.9% of the total resident population of Karongi District. The share of the elderly females (9.1%) is higher than the male's one (6.6%), reflecting the higher life expectancy for women. By sector, Murambi (10.1%), Gashari (9.8%) and Murundi (9.6%) have the highest share of elderly among their total population while Bwishyura (5.2%) has the lowest.

3.4.2 Employment among elderly people in Karongi District

In Rwanda, people keep on working until old age, the share of employed persons among the elderly population stands at 28.2%. The aforementioned share is higher among the elderly males (33.7%) than elderly females (24.3%). In Karongi District, 21.3% of elderly people are employed. The percentage of employed elderly people is higher among males (26.3%) than females (18.0%).

By sector, employment among elderly residents is high in Gashari (29.4%), Rugabano (27.0%) and Rubengera (25.8%). It is low in Ruganda (10.5%), Murambi (13.3%) and Gishyita (16.1%).

3.4.3 Marital status of elderly

In Karongi district, more than half of the elderly population (67.5%) were married and 28.9 % were widowed. The rate of celibacy among elderly was 2.1% while divorce or separation rate is 1.4%. Marital status among the elderly varies slightly by sector of residence. Marriage among elderly people is more important in Rwankuba (74.3%) and Mutuntu (73.1%) sectors. Widowhood is widespread in Rubengera (35.2%) and Gishyita (33.4%) and lowest in Gashari (24.0%) and Rwankuba (23.8%) sectors. The table below illustrates distribution of elderly people across sectors.

In Karongi District, 67.5% of the elderly population are married (59.5% married officially to one wife/husband, 5.7% married to one wife/husband not officially and 2.3% living in polygamous union) while 28.9% are widowed. The rate of celibacy among elderly is 2.1% while divorce rate is 0.2% and separation is 1.2%.

Marital status among the elderly varies slightly by sector. Among elderly people, marriage to one wife/husband officially is the status more represented in all sectors and the high percentages of people in this status are in Gashari (66.3%), Rwankuba (65.2%), Mutuntu (64.9%) and Ruganda (64.5%). The percentages of elderly married not officially are high in Mubuga (9.6%), Bwishyura (9.4%) and Rubengera (7.4%). Widowhood is widespread in Rubengera (35.2%), Gishyita (33.4%) and Murundi (31.5%) and lowest in Rwankuba (23.8%), Gashari (24.0%) and Mutuntu (24.4%) sectors.

CHAPTER 4: HOUSEHOLDS AND HOUSING CHARACTERISTICS

4.1 Household characteristics

In this chapter, the 5th Population and Housing Census 2022 investigated households and housing characteristics; those include household size, head of household by sex, type of habitat, housing tenure, materials used for construction, sources of energy used for lighting and for cooking, water sources used by households, sanitation facilities used by households, asset possessed by households and mode of waste disposal used by households.

4.1.1 Number and mean size of the private households

The results of the 5th RPHC 2022 indicate a total number of 3,312,743 private households in Rwanda. The number of households counted in Southern Province is 671,506 and 91,444 in Karongi District.

The average household size in Karongi District is 4.1 persons per household. At the sector level, the highest sizes are found in Rwankuba (4.6 persons/household), Gitesi and Mutuntu (4.3 persons/household each). The smallest household sizes are found in Bwishyura, Murambi and Murundi (3.9 persons/household each).

The table below indicates details per sector.

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4.1.2 Private households' heads of Karongi District

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 revealed that nationally 28.9% of private households are headed by women. In Karongi District, private households headed by females are 31.8%.

At sector level, the highest percentages of households headed by women are found in Rwankuba sector (36.7%) and Mubuga sector (35.0%) while the lowest is found in Gitesi sector (28.4%).

4.2 Housing Characteristics

4.2.1 Type of habitat

The results of 5th Population and Housing Census 2022 revealed that in the Western Province the predominant type of habitat is "Umudugudu/Planned rural settlement" (70.5%) and "Dispersed/Isolated housing (18.3%). It is the same as in Karongi District as one of districts of the Western Province. The most common type of habitat in Karongi District is "Umudugudu/Planned rural settlement" (56.9%) and "Dispersed/Isolated housing" (33.2%).

The type of habitat varies across sectors. "Umudugudu/Planned rural settlement" is most prevalent in Gishyita (78.9%) and Rubengera (77.7%) and low in Ruganda (37.3%) and Mutuntu (38.3%). The sectors with the high percentages of dispersed/isolated housing units are Mutuntu (58.8%) and Ruganda (58.3%).



The type of habitat in Karongi District varies also according to the area of residence. In urban areas, the predominant types are "Umudugudu/Planned rural settlement" (60.2%) and "Spontaneous/squatter housing" (19.5%). In rural areas, the predominant type is "Umudugudu/Planned rural settlement" (56.5%) followed by "Dispersed/isolated housing (35.3%).

Tenure of the housing in Karongi District

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 indicate that the ownership of housing in the Western Province represents 80.5% and tenant represent 13.5%. In Karongi District, 80.8% of housing units are occupied by tenants while 10.7% are occupied by their owners.

At the sector level, the percentage of owners of households' units is high in Mutuntu (91.2%), Murundi (91.1%) and Ruganda (91.0%) and low in Bwishyura (64.6%) and Rwankuba (64.7%). The percentage of tenants of housing units is high in Bwishyura (29.3%), Rubengera (21.4%) and low in Mutuntu (2.3%) and Rwankuba (3.2%).



According to the area of residence, 3 types of tenure of housing units (owners, tenants and free lodging) predominate in urban area as well as in rural area and their percentages vary substantially.

The percentage of owners of housing units is 51.4% in urban areas to 83.9% in rural areas, The percentage of tenants of housing units is 41.5% in urban areas to 7.4% in rural areas. The percentage of free lodging is 5.6% in urban areas to 5% in rural areas.

4.2.3 Material of the housing units

4.2.3.1 Main materials of the roof

The results of the 5th RPHC 2022 indicate that housing units are mainly covered by iron sheets in Rwanda (74.1%) as well as in the Western Province where it represents 59.0%. In Karongi District, housing units are mainly covered by local tiles (54.2%) and iron sheets (45.4%). Only 0.2% are covered by industrial tiles.

By sector, the high percentages of housing units covered by iron sheets are found in Bwishyura (91.0%), Gishyita (87.8) and Mubuga (81.8%) and the lowest is in Ruganda (9.3%) where 90.4% of the housing units are covered by local tiles followed by Gashari with 89.1% of housing units covered by this type of roofing materials.





The results of the census reveal that the materials used for roofing of the households' units in Karongi District vary slightly according to the area of residence. In both rural and urban areas of Karongi District, the predominant roofing materials are Local tiles (58.6% in rural and 13.0% in urban areas). The percentage of housing units covered by iron sheets is 41.0% in rural areas while it is 86.7% in urban areas. The figure below illustrates details:

4.2.3.2 Main materials of the walls

The results of the census show that the most materials of the walls of the housing units are sundried bricks without cement in the Western Province (47.5%) and in Karongi District (64.5%). It is followed by sundried bricks with cement (26.7% in Western Province and 26.5% in Karongi District.

The same materials are the most used in all sectors: sun dried bricks without cement are the mostly used materials in all sectors and Murundi has the higher percentage 83.3%) while Rwankuba has the lowest (48.2%). The higher percentage of housing units with sun dried bricks with cement as main materials of the wall is found in Bwishyura (43.0%) and the lowest in Murundi (13.0%).



According to the area of residence in Karongi District, the main materials used for walls of the housing units are mostly sun-dried bricks with cement (54.7%) followed by sun-dried bricks without cement (36.7%) in urban areas.

In rural areas, sun-dried bricks without cement are predominant materials (67.5%) followed by sun-dried bricks with cement (23.5%).

4.2.3.3 Main materials of the floor

The results 5RPHC 2022 indicate that the main material of the floor of the housing units is Earth (60.4%) in countrywide. In the Western province, the Earth is the main material of the floor of the housing units (74.6%).

In Karongi district, the main material of the floor of the housing units is Earth (77.1%) followed by Cement (19.1%) and Dung hardened (2.3%).

At sector level, the earth as main material used for the floor is most found in Gitesi (89.6%), Mutuntu and Murundi (89.4% for each). The highest percentage of the housing units with cement as main material used for the floor is found in Bwishyura (40.0%) and Rubengera (32.1%) and the high percentage of housing units whose floor in Dung hardened is found in Rwankuba (12.3%), Ruganda (6.3%).

The table below displays details:

At sector level, more than 77% of housing units have Earth as main material used for the floor in 9 sectors out of 13: Rwankuba (77.4%), Gashari (79.7%), Murambi (79.9%), Ruganda (82.7%), Twumba (83.8%), Rugabano (84.2%), Murundi and Mutuntu (89.4% each) and Gitesi (89.6%).



By area of residence, the results of census indicate that the predominant materials used for the floor of the housing units are cement (55.0%) followed by earth (40.0%) in urban areas. In rural areas, the predominant materials for the floor are earth (81.0%) and cement (15.3%). The figure below provides details:

4.3 Source of energy of the private households in Karongi District

4.3.1 Grid Line connectivity in Karongi District

At national level, the results of the 5th RPHC 2022 revealed that 52.5% of private households are connected to a grid line while 47.2% are not connected.

In Western Province, the percentage of private household connected to a grid line is 49.0% and only 35.8% of private households are connected in Karongi District.

At the sector level, only 4 sectors out of 13 have more than half of the households connected to a grid line: Bwishyura (62.7%), Rubengera (60.5%), Gishyita (57.9%) and Mubuga (50.6%). Mutuntu Sector has the lowest percentage (7.5%) of households connected to a grid line.



4.3.2 Main source of energy for lighting

In Karongi District, the main source of energy for lighting used by households is electricity (50.3%) followed by flash lighting/phone flash lighting (36.6%).

At the sector level, electricity as main source of energy for lighting floor is most found in Bwishyura (68.5%), Rubengera (66.2%) and Mubuga (59.1%). The sectors with low percentages of private households using electricity are Mutuntu (28.8%), Murundi (32.2%) and Rwankuba (39.2%).

The sectors with the high percentages of private households using flashlight or phone flashlight for lighting are Murundi (53.4%), Rwankuba (47.2%) and Mutuntu (44.8%).

According to the area of residence, the main source of energy for lighting is electricity (79.9%) followed by flashlight or phone flashlight (14.2%) and candles (3.3%) in urban areas. In rural areas, 47.2% of private households use electricity as main source of energy for lighting while 39.0% use flashlight or phone flashlight and 7.7% use firewood.

4.3.3 Main sources of energy for cooking in Karongi District

At the district level, the main sources of energy for cooking used by the private households are firewood (87.8%) followed by charcoal (10.2% each).

At the sector level, firewood is the most used source of cooking energy by private households in all sectors. Twumba (97.4%), Murundi (97.3%), Mutuntu (97.1%), Gitesi and Ruganda (96.9% each) have the highest percentages of households using this material for cooking while Bwishyura (68.7%), Rwankuba (72.1%) and Rubengera (74.1%) have the lowest.

Sectors with the high percentage of private households using charcoal as main source of cooking energy are Rwankuba (26.6%), Bwishyura (25.8%) and Rubengera (22.5%). The table below illustrates details:



By area of residence, private households use mostly charcoal (64.8%) and gaz (19.9%) in urban areas. In rural areas, private households use most firewood (71.5%) and charcoal (24.3%). The percentage of private households that not cook is 4.5% in urban area and 1.9% in rural.

4.3.4 Water and sanitation of the private households in Karongi District

4.3.4.1 Main source of drinking water

The results of 5RPHC 2022 reveal that improved drinking water sources are used by 82.3% of private households in Rwanda while they are 75.4% in the Western Province. In Karongi District, the percentage of private households using improved drinking water is 63.7%. At the sector level, the percentage of the private households using water from improved sources is highest in Gishyita (85.0%), Mubuga (80.6%) and Rubengera (75.2%). The lowest percentages are found in Murundi (47.2%), Ruganda (46.7%) and Mutuntu (41.3%).




Figure 4. 9Distribution (count and %) of the private households of Karongi District by main source of water and by Sector

4.3.4.2 Main type of toilet facility

The results of census reveal that the main types of toilet facility used by the private households in Rwanda are "pit latrine with constructed floor slab used by one household" (68.8%).

In Karongi District, main types of toilet facility used by the private households are "pit latrine with constructed floor slab used by one household" (73.9%), "pit latrine with constructed floor slab used by several households" (13.0%) and "pit latrine without constructed floor slab used by one household" (6.4%).

At the sector level, the percentage of households using "pit latrine with constructed floor slab used by one household" is high in Gashari (87.3%), Twumba (86.6%), Ruganda (85.3%) and Murambi (85.1%).

For "pit latrines with constructed floor slab used by several households", Rwankuba (32.0%), Bwishyura (17.5%), Mubuga (16.5%) and Rubengera (16.0%) are the sectors with relatively high percentages compared to other sectors. The lowest percentage is found in Gashari (6.7%).

The high percentages of households using "flush toilets used by one household" are found in Bwishyura (10.2%) and Rubengera (6.0%).



According to the area of residence in Karongi District, the types of toilets most used are pit latrine with constructed floor slab used by one household (48.2%) and shared pit latrines with constructed floor slab (23.8%) followed by flush toilets not shared (15.3%) in urban areas. 4.3.4.3 Mode of waste disposal in Karongi District

The results of the census reveal that, In district, the high percentage of households (55.5%) evacuate their waste through household compost dumping while 34.8% of private households evacuate their waste in the household's fields and 7.8% through the waste collection companies.

At the Sector level, the high percentages of households evacuating their waste through the household compost dumping are in Twumba (70.2%), Rugabano (69.3%) and Mutuntu (67.1%).

The household's fields as main mode of waste disposal is the most used in Murundi (50.8%), Gitesi(50.6%) and Mubuga (47.3%). The high percentages of households using household public compost dumping are in Rwankuba (35.4%).



4.4 Assets possessed by private households in Ruhango District

4.4.1 Communication assets possessed by private households in Karongi District

At the district level, 77.7% of private households possess one radio including one from phone, 74.1% a mobile phone, 14.1% a smartphone, 5.0% a TV and 1.6% a computer.

By sectors, the percentage of private households possessing a radio is high in Bwishyura (84.0%), Rubengera (83.0%), Rwankuba (81.0%) and Mubuga (80.3%). It is low in Mutuntu (69.8%) and Murundi (67.6%).

The percentage of private households possessing a television is high in Bwishyura (12.5%) and Rubengera (12.1%) while it is low in Mutuntu (1.9%), Murundi (1.2%) and Ruganda (1.0%).

Mobile phone is mostly possessed by private households of Bwishyura (72.6%), Rubengera (66.9%) and Gishyita (64.9%) while it is low in Mutuntu (48.8%), Ruganda (48.6%) and Murundi (45.1%).

The sectors with relatively high percentage of households with smartphone are Bwishyura (27.1%), Rubengera (23.3%), Rwankuba (21.9%) and Gishyita (15.3%) while the percentage of households possessing this asset is low in Murundi (5.4%) a. The computer is slightly possessed in Bwishyura (4.5%) and Rubengera (3.7%).

4.4.2 Access to the Internet

The results of the 5th RPHC-2022 indicate that the percentages of households with at least one member using internet are 22.2% at national level, 16.6% in Western Province and 14.8% in Karongi District.

At sector level, the percentage of households with at least one member using internet is slightly high in Bwishyura (28.0%) and Rubengera (24.3%). The sectors with the lower percentages of households with at least one member using internet are Murundi (6.3%) and Gitesi (8.3%).



According to the area of residence in Karongi District, the results of the census show that the access to the Internet varies greatly.

CHAPTER 5: AGRICULTURE IN KARONGI DISTRICT

The agriculture was the one of the areas of investigation of the 5th Rwanda Population and housing census conducted in 2022. The households engaged in Livestock husbandry; the number of private crop farming households cultivating different types of crops, by Sector, the number of private households raising different types of livestock, by Sector and type of household raised in district were captured in the census.

5.1 Crop farming and livestock husbandly in Karongi District

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 revealed that Nationally, 2,280,854 of private households (68.9%) are engaged in agriculture, among them 62.6% are engaged in crop farming and 50.4% are engaged in Livestock husbandry.

Karongi District is one of the districts of the Western Province where crop farming and animal husbandly are on large scale. In Karongi District, agricultural households occupy 83.2% with 76.8% of households engaged in crop farming and 66.2% of hhouseholds engaged in Livestock husbandry.

At the sector level, the highest percentages of agricultural households are found in Murundi (93.3%) Ruganda (92.8%), Gitesi (92.4%), Gashari (91.3%) and Murambi (90.6%). Households engaged in crop farming as well as those engaged in livestock husbandry are more represented in the same sectors: Murundi (88.8% of households in crop farming and 80.8% in livestock husbandry), Ruganda (79.1% of households in crop farming and 85.0% in livestock husbandry), Gitesi (88.7% of households in crop farming and 72.9% in livestock husbandry), Gashari (86.9% of households in crop farming and 78.9% in livestock husbandry) and Murambi (84.2% of households in crop farming and 74.9% in livestock husbandry). Rwankuba has the highest percentage of households engaged in livestock husbandry (85.0%).

5.2 Crop farming in Karongi District

The results of 5th Population and housing census 2022 indicate that the most cultivated crops by the private households of Karongi District are fruits, maize, cassava, beans, sorghum, sweet potato, banana, and vegetables. Those households that apply agriculture activities are found in all sectors of Karongi as well as in the rural than in the urban areas.

5.3 Livestock husbandly in Karongi District

Nationally and in the Western Province, the results of the census indicate that most private households are considerably more engaged in raising cows, goats, pigs, and chicken than other livestock. It is in the same extent in Karongi District.

The sectors that have high number of private households engaged in livestock are Rugabano (4,670 households raising cows; 2,139 households raising goats and 1,388 households raising chickens) and Murundi (4,623 households raising cows; 2,464 households raising pigs; 1,537 households raising goats and 1,747 households raising chickens).
