





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FOREWORD

The Government of Rwanda, through the National Institute of Statistics of Rwanda (NISR) conducted the 2022 Rwanda Population and Housing Census to provide updated demographic, social and economic indicators for policy formulation and planning to support the national development agenda and track the implementation of national, regional, continental and global development goals, such as the First National Strategy for Transformation (NST1 2017-2024); the AU Agenda 2063; and the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

The Population and Housing Census in Rwanda dates back to the year 1978 when the first ever modern census was implemented. The second, third, and fourth censuses were carried out in 1991, 2002, and 2012 respectively. The 2022 Population and Housing Census marks therefore the Fifth in the series following the United Nations Recommendations to conduct a census every ten years.

Considering census' crucial importance for the planning process, the Government of Rwanda has made the Population and Housing Census a priority to be undertaken every 10 years and adopted the use of technologies for timely delivery of census results for use.

Results of the 2022 Population and Housing Census provide population numbers from national to the lowest administrative level, as well as demographic and socio-economic indicators at both national and district levels. The census remains the only national data collection exercise that can provide the lowest levels of disaggregation to support decentralised decision making across the country.

I would like therefore to take this opportunity to thank all stakeholders that contributed to the success of the 2022 Population and Housing Census. They include Ministries and other Government institutions, international organizations such as the World Bank (WB), the European Union (EU), the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA), One-UN, UN Women, UNICEF, UNECA, the United Kingdom AID (UKAID), the African Development Bank (AfDB), the USAID, Enabel, PARIS 21 and others for their support in diverse ways.

My special thanks go to the local government leaders from the province to the village levels who contributed a lot to the success of the 2022 Population and Housing Census. Exceptional gratitude to all enumerators, teachers and young people who collected the information and all respondents for their cooperation and dedication. The National Institute of Statistics of Rwanda (NISR) deserves special appreciation for the excellent operational and coordination of all census activities.

I finally recommend that the invaluable information contained in different thematic reports of the 5th Rwanda Population and Housing Census be used as updated evidence for all decision and policy making for the national, regional and global development programs.




Figure 1. 1: Administrative map of Bugesera district

CHAPTER 1: POPULATION SIZE, SPATIAL DISTRIBUTION, AND STRUCTURE

1.1.1. Size and spatial Distribution of the population

1.1.2. Size and Spatial Distribution of the Population of Eastern Province

The 5th Rwanda Population and Housing Census (PHC5) has enumerated 3,563,145 residents in the Eastern Province, which represents 26.9% of the total population of Rwanda (13,246,394 residents).

The population of the Eastern Province is predominantly female; 1,828,751 are women corresponding to 51.3 % of the total population of the city.

Nyagatare is the most populated district with 653,861 residents in 2022. Its population represents 18.4% of the total residents' population of Eastern Province.

The least populated district in the Eastern Province is Ngoma with 404,048 inhabitants, corresponding to 11.3% of the total resident population of Eastern Province.



1.1.3. Population Density of the Eastern Province by District

Population density is a measurement of population per unit land area. Density is the number of the inhabitant per Km². The Rwanda Population and Housing Census conducted in 2022 revealed that, the population density in Rwanda is 503 inhabitants per Km². The Eastern Province has 433 inhabitant per Km².

The district with a high population density is Rwamagana with 740 Inhabitants per km². The district with a lowest population density is Kayonza with 338 Inhabitants per km². The figure below indicates distribution of population density per district.

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1.1.4. Size and Spatial Distribution of the Population of the Bugesera district

The 5th Rwanda Population and Housing Census (PHC5) has enumerated 551,103 residents in Bugesera district, which represent 15.5% % of the total population of the Eastern Province (3,563,145 residents). The population of Bugesera district is predominantly female: 279,635 are women corresponding to 50.7 % of the total population Bugesera district.

Females are predominant in almost all sectors of the district except in two sectors which are Mayange(49.3% for female versus 50.7% for male) and Rilima(46.3% for female versus 53.7% for male).

Nyamata (81,480 population) and Mayange (54,084 population) are the most populated sectors. They represent 14.8% and 9.8% of the total population of Bugesera district, respectively. The three less populated sectors are Shyara (15,856 inhabitants), Kamabuye(24,502 inhabitants) and Nyarugenge (25,406 inhabitants). They represent 2.9%, 4.4% and 4.6% of the total resident population of Bugesera district, respectively.

The table below 1.2 indicates the number of the population of Bugesera district by sector, by sex and their shares across sectors to the total population of Bugesera district.

1.1.5. Size and Spatial Distribution of the Population of Bugesera district by residence area

The results of Rwanda Population and housing census 2022 revealed that, the total population of Rwanda are spatially distributed in rural area that represent 72.1% and urban area represent 27.9%. The Eastern Province is also predominantly rural area (79.1%) while urban area represents 20.9%.

Bugesera district population is predominantly rural area 59.9% while urban represents 40.1%.

The sectors of Bugesera district which are entirely rural are Kamabuye, Musenyi, Ngeruka and Shyara while there are other sectors that are more urbanized such as Rilima with 86.2% of urban area, Nyamata (79.9%), Mayange (64.8%) and Ntarama (59.4%).

1.1.6. Size and Spatial Distribution of the Population of Bugesera district


Bugesera population is mostly young. 59.3% of the resident population of Bugesera is under 25 years, as shown by the age pyramid (Figure 4), reflecting the high level of fertility in the recent past.

The elderly (60 years and above) represents 5.6 % of the total population of the district. The table below 1.4 illustrates the results, and more details of sectors are in the annex.

1.1.7. Population share (%) of some specific interventions target groups in Bugesera District by sex

The Rwanda population and housing census 2022 indicate the population on specific agesbased programs, policy and strategies interventions in health, education, employment and also indicates the population categories in their respective characteristics such as children, youth, working population, among other things. For instance, children under five years for immunization programs (Under 5 children), children in school age (3-17 years), people in the official working age group (16-64 years and above), etc. Knowing the size of such groups is of great importance for the design, implementation, monitoring, and evaluation of programs targeting such groups.

The below table gives the size of the main interventions target groups by sex, and their share in the entire population of Bugesera district. The population aged 0-17 represents 46.7% of the total population of the district, 16-30 years represent 26.3%; the working age population (16 years and above) represents 57.8 % of the same population.

The table below shows distribution of Bugesera districts by targeted interventions by their age.

CHAPTER 2: CHARACTERISTICS OF THE POPULATION

2.1 Socio-cultural characteristics of the population

2.1.1 Nationality of the population of Bugesera district

The results of 5th RPHC-2022 indicate that, the Rwandan population by nationality represent 99.11% and foreigners represent 0.89%. In the Eastern Province, foreigners represent 1.7% and it is 0.7% (4,025) in Bugesera district while the Rwandans represent 99.27%.

Three sectors of Bugesera districts that have the highest percentage of foreigners compared to others; those are Nyamata (1.96%), Gashora (1.59%) and Kamabuye (1.36%).

The table below illustrates the distribution of the population by nationality with their respective sectors of residence.

2.1.2 Religious affiliation of the resident population of Bugesera District

In Bugesera district, Christianity is the predominant religion. 32.22% are catholic, 23.31% are ADEPR, 16.12% are protestant, 14.56% are Adventists, 4.69% are other Christians, 2.22% are Muslim, and Jehovah witness are 0.70%.

Traditional/animist religion is almost absent (0.01% and 3.88% of the resident population declared themselves to be without religion.

Protestants and Adventists are more in rural area than in urban area while for other religions, their followers are frequent in urban area than in rural area.

2.2 Marital Status of the resident population of Bugesera district

2.2.1 Marital status by sector

The results of 5RPHC-2022 show that 50.4% of the resident population of Bugesera district aged 12 and above are currently living in union (married officially to one wife/husband, married not officially to one wife/husband, living in polygamous union) at the time of census while 42.4% were never married. 4.4% were widowed, while separated and divorced were respectively 2.5% and 0.2%.

At the sector level, three sectors, Mwogo(53.7%), Juru(52.9%) and Rilima (52.8%) have the highest percentages of persons who are living in union. Nyamata (45.6%) and Mayange (44.1%) have the highest percentages of the never married persons. Kamabuye and Mareba sectors have high percentage of widowed persons (6.2% and 6.1% respectively).

2.2.2 Marital status by Age groups

The percentages of resident population of Bugesera district by marital status vary by sex and age: The percentage of never married persons decreases from 99.8% (age group of 12-14 years) to 1.1% (age group of 80 years and above).

The percentage of persons currently married starts by increasing from 0.2% (age group of 12-14 years) to a maximum of 87.2% (age group of 40-44 years) before decreasing to 47.3% (age group 80+) due mainly to widowhood (50.3%).

The highest percentage of divorced persons is observed from age groups 40-44, 45-49,50-54(0.6% for each age group) while the highest percentage of the separated persons (4.9%) is found in age group 50-54 years.

2.3 Educational Characteristics of the Population of Bugesera district

2.3.1 School attendance

The table 2.5 below shows that, in Bugesera District, 46.8% of pre-school-age population(3-5 years) are currently attending a nursery school, 53.2% children have never attended a nursery school and none of children have previously attended a nursery school (i.e children who have already had prior exposure to nursery school education before the time of census but who were not attending nursery school).

Rilima has the highest proportion of children (aged between 3 to 5) currently attending a nursery school in Bugesera district (61.9%), followed by Nyamata(59.0%). Mareba sector has the lowest percentage of children currently attending a nursery school, with only 31.9% enrolled. On the other hand, Ngeruka and Mareba sectors have the highest proportion of children aged 3 to 5 who have never attended a nursery school (74.7 and 68.1%, respectively).

Table 2.6 shows that in Bugesera District, 86.6% of children aged 6 to 11 (the official primary school-going age) are currently attending primary school, 12.0% have never attended primary school and 1.5% have previously attended primary school (which means that 13.5 of children aged 6 to 11 are out of school).

By comparing the distribution of the primary school-age population (6-11 years) across sectors in Bugesera district, comparisons reveal the disparities in primary school attendance across different sectors.

Sectors like Nyarugenge and Shyara exhibit lower rates of children currently attending primary school (79.1% and 79.4%, respectively) and higher rates of children who have never attended are found in Mareba and Shyara(18.6% and 18.3% respectively).

On the other hand, sectors like Mayange(93.2%), Nyamata(92.9%) and Rilima(91,6%) demonstrate higher rates of children currently attending primary school and lower rates of children who have never attended (Mayange and Nyamata have 5,7% each and Rilima has 7.6%).

In Bugesera District 23.3% of the population aged 12 to 17 have previously attended school (i.e. they dropped out of school), 73.5% are currently attending school and 3.2% have never attended secondary school.

The distribution of the secondary school-age population (12-17 years) across sectors in in Bugesera district, shows that Kamabuye (81.5%) and Rilima (80.8%) sectors have the highest percentage of the population aged 12 to 17 currently attending school.

Conversely, Rweru sector has the lowest percentage of the population aged 12 to 17 currently attending school with 65.9%. Ntarama and Rweru sectors also have the highest percentage of the population between the ages of 12 and 17 who have never attended school at 4.2% each.

2.3.2. Gross and Net Attendance Rate (%) in Primary School in Bugesera District

Gross and net Attendance ratios are used to measure the extent of coverage of an educational program. It gives a comparison of the children attending school with the total size of the school-age population. It can also be used for assessing how far a country has succeeded in bringing to school all those who are eligible to attend.

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 reveal that not all children attending primary school level are of the official age for that level (6-11 years). The gross attendance rate(GAR) in Rwanda is the 141.7%, and it is at that ratio in Eastern Province (141.7%).

Agross Attendance Rate(GAR) of 139.8% in Bugesera district for the population 6 to 11 years indicates a high percentage of those who attended primary schools aged below 6 years and or above 11 years.

At sector level, GAR are greater than 130% in all sectors, with minor variations except in Rweru (129.1%).

The net attendance rate (NAR) in Primary school for Bugesera district (86.5%) is below the NAR of the Eastern Province (87.4%) and of the national level where it is(89.3%). This NAR of 86.5% % for the population 6 to 11 years indicates that only 86.5%% of the population 6 to 11 years were attending primary schools in Bugesera District by 2022 (Table 2.8). In 2022,

students older or younger than the official primary school age range made up 38.1% [(GAR139.8-NAR86.5)/GAR139.8] of the primary school population of Bugesera District.

The highest net attendance rate in primary school is in Mayange sector(93.2%) followed by Nyamata sector with 92.9% and Rilima with 91.6% while the sector with the lowest NAR is Nyarugenge with 79.1% and Shyara with 79.4%.

2.3.3 Gross and Net Attendance Rate (%) in Secondary School

The table 2. 9 provides information on the gross and net attendance rates in the secondary school level (12-17 years) disaggregated by sex and sector in Bugesera District.

The Eastern Province (19.2% and 34.7%) and Bugesera District(19.4% and 35.1%) have lower NARs and GAR than the national average (22.3% and 39.8%).

Comparing males and females in Bugesera District in terms of Net Attendance Rates (NAR), the results indicate that a higher proportion of females (22.3%) in Bugesera District, within the secondary school-age range (12-17 years), are attending school compared to males (16.6%).

Female students older or younger than the official secondary school age range made up 41.4% [(GAR38.1–NAR22.3)/GAR38.1] of the female with secondary school age of Bugesera District, while for male students it made up 48.1 % [(GAR 32.0–NAR16.6)/GAR32.0]. This shows that females have a higher attendance rate in Bugesera District compared to males when considering the overall attendance rates, regardless of age or grade-level eligibility.

At the sector level, the highest net attendance rate is in Nyamata (28.3%) and the lowest is in Ngeruka and Mareba (13.2% and13.6 %respectively) while for GAR, Nyamata has the highest NAR in Bugesera District, with a rate of 52.0% and Juru has the lowest (23.5%) compared to other sectors.

2.3.4 Highest level of school attended in Bugesera district

The results of 5RPHC-2022 indicate that, the total population of Rwanda aged 3 and above is 11,999,691. The highest level of education attended is categorized into several levels: Never attended School, Nursery, Primary, INGOBOKA/Vocational, Lower secondary, Upper secondary, University, and Not stated. In Rwanda, 16.7% of the population aged 3 years and above has never attended school, while 2.7% have attended nursery, and 59.5% have attended primary school. Other education levels include 0.8% for INGOBOKA/Vocational, 9.6% for lower secondary, 7.1% for upper secondary, 3.6% for university, and 0.0% is not stated.

The total population of Eastern Province aged 3 and above is 3,215,103. The distribution of the highest level of education attended is like the national level, with slight variations. In Eastern Province, 18.1% of the population has never attended school, while 2.9% have attended nursery, and 60.9% have attended primary school. Other education levels include 0.6% for INGOBOKA/Vocational, 9.3% for lower secondary, 6.0% for upper secondary, 2.2% for university, and 0.0% is not stated.

In Bugesera district, the total population age 3 and above is 495,930. 17.6% of them has never attended any formal school, 58.5% attended the primary level, 9.5% attended lower secondary level, 7.3% has attended upper secondary and 3.4% attended university level. The level of educational attended varies across sectors, Juru has a highest percentage of primary school attended (67.9%), Nyamata is highest in upper secondary school attended (12.7%), and Nyamata has a high percentage of 9.1% of the population attended University than other sectors.

2.4 Characteristics of the Employed Population in Bugesera District

The official working age in Rwanda is 16 years and above. Therefore, the ratio of Employment to the working age population (employment to population ratio) is an important indicator of the capacity of the Economy to provide employment to a growing population. A decline in the employment-to population ratio is often regarded as an indicator of economic slowdown and a decline in total employment as an indicator of a more severe economic downturn.

2.4.1 Employment to population ratio by sex, Province, District and area of residence

The results presented in the below table 2.11 shows that the employment to population ratio stood at 45.9 percent in Rwanda, it is lower among females (40.2 percent) than males (52.4 percent). On the other side, it was observed that the employment to population ratio is higher in urban areas of Rwanda (53.5 percent) than in rural areas (42.7 percent).

It was observed that in Eastern Province, the employment to population ratio stood at 47.9% percent, it is higher in urban areas (53.1 percent) than in rural areas (46.5 percent). It was also revealed that the employment to population ratio is 47.2 percent among people residing in Bugesera district, it is higher in urban areas of Bugesera (50.1 percent) than in rural areas (45.3 percent).

Figure 2.1 allows the study of intensity of Employment to population ratio and its variation by sex. The figure reveals the following remarks: The employment to population ratio among males as well as females increases from age group 16-19 to 30-34 and starts decreasing from age group 35-39 to 85 years and above as people starts getting very older and retire.

It was observed that in district of Bugesera, the highest employment to population ratio among males stands at 71.1% and was observed in age group 30-34.

On the other side the highest employment to population among females is 49.2% and was observed in the age group 40-44. The lowest employment to population ratio among males stands at 7.1% and was observed among males of the age group 85+, the lowest employment to population ratio among females is 3.6% and was observed among females in the same age group (85+).




Figure 2. 1 Employment to Population Ratio by age group and sex

CHAPTER 3: SUB-POPULATION

3.1 Children Population (0-17 years)

According to the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child (1989), a child is defined as every human being under 18 unless, under the law applicable to the child, majority is attained earlier. It is relevant to underline here that this definition by age coincides with that of Rwanda, as stipulated in Article 3 of the National Law n° 54/2011 of 14 December 2011 relating to the rights and the protection of the child, which stipulates that a child is any person under the age of 18. The age range (0–17) adopted for this report reflects this definition.

3.1.1 Number and share of children in Bugesera district

The results of 5Th RPHC-2022 revealed that, the children population constitute 44.5% of the total population of 13,246,394. The Eastern Province has 1,656,727 children with a share of 46.5% of the total resident population.

In Bugesera District, the children constitute 46.7% of the resident population of the district, with a percentage of males slightly greater than the females' one (47.6% vs 46.0%).

At sector level, the children's share is high in Ngeruka (50.2%) and Rweru (50.0%), and small in Nyamata(42.9%), Rilima (43.3%) and Ntarama (43.9%). The table below indicate distribution of children by sector and by sex.

3.1.2 Children with birth registration in Bugesera District

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 indicate the percentage of children whose birth was registered is 94.28% at the national level.

The birth registration rate in Bugesera district is 94.13%. Birth registration performance is almost the same in urban (93.94%) and (94.25%) in the rural areas of Bugesera district.

3.1.3 Birth registration by sector

The results of 5th RPHC-2022 indicate that birth registration varies across sectors and areas of residence (urban and rural), Kamabuye, Musenyi, Ngeruka and Shyara sectors have not urban areas, while other sectors have both urban and rural areas.

The high percentages of birth registrations are found in Ruhuha(97.4%), Kamabuye (97.3%) and Rilima (96.1%) while the lowest is in Rweru (91.2%) and Nyamata(91.6%).

The percentage of birth registration for males is almost the same as the one for females. In urban areas of Bugesera district, birth registration is 93.9% while in rural areas, it is 94.2%.

3.2 Youth population in Rwanda

For statistical purposes, the United Nations defines "youth", as those persons between the ages of 15 and 24 years, without prejudice to other definitions by Member States. Considering the current priorities and trends of Rwanda's Development, the definition of Youth in terms of age has been revised in this policy. It was brought from 14–35 years to 16–30 years.

3.2.1 The youth population in Bugesera district

The results of 5th Population and housing Censuses conducted in 2022 revealed that, the youth represent 27.14% (3,595,670) of the total population (13,246,394). The youth population in Bugesera district was 144,813 which represents 26.28% of the total resident population of the district (551,103).

The sectors with the highest youth share are Nyamata (29.87%) and Mayange(29.15%) while Musenyi(22.51%) has the lowest share of youth.

The table below indicate distribution of youth by sector, and by sex.

3.2.2 Educational characteristics of youth

Youth who never attended school represent 5.15% of the youth resident population at national level; it represents 6.01% of the total resident population in Eastern Province and 5.01% of the total resident population of Bugesera district.

The percentage of youth who never attended school varies a lot within sectors of Bugesera district. The highest percentage was registered in Nyarugenge (6.34%) while the lowest percentage was registered in Mayange (3.17%).

3.2.3 Highest level of education attended by youth in Bugesera District

In Bugesera district, among all youths, 51.6% attained only the primary school level, 22 % attained the lower secondary education, 16.2 % attained the upper secondary education, 4.4% attained university, and 5% have not attended any formal of school. The highest level of education attained varies across sectors of the district.

The sectors with the highest percentages of youth with primary education are Shyara (66.8%), Juru(66%) and Marebe (66%%). The sectors with the highest percentage of youth with no schooling are Nyarugenge (6.3%) and Ngeruka (6%). The percentage of youth with university level is high in Mayange (9.8%) and Nyamata (8.5%).

3.2.4 Employment to population ratio among youth(16-30).

The Census results showed that in Rwanda, the employment to population ratio among youth stands at 40.3%, it is higher among males than females 44.8% and 36.2% respectively. It was observed that in the district of Bugesera, the employment to population ratio among youth stands at 42.2%, it is higher in among males (49.1%) than females (35.7%).

The highest employment to population ratio among youth in Bugesera district was observed in Mwogo (54%), Ntarama (51.0%) and Juru (50.8%), the lowest employment to population ratio among youth was observed in Mayange (32.5%) and Rilima (33.0%).

3.2.6 Proportion of Youth (16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training in Bugesera District by sex, district, and area of residence.

The results of 5RPHC-2022 indicate that, In Rwanda the proportion of Youth (16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training stood at 39.5 %. It is higher among females (43.8 %) than males (34.9 %).

In Eastern Province, the proportion of youth (16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training is 38.9 %, it is lower among males (34.5 %) than females (43.1 %). 2022 census results also revealed that the aforementioned proportion is higher in rural areas of Eastern Province (40.7 percent) than in urban areas (32.5 percent).

The proportion of youth (16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training among people residing in Bugesera district stood at 38.8 percent. It is much higher (42.3 percent) among people residing in rural areas of Bugesera district than the ones residing in urban areas (34.3 percent). 3.3 Persons with disabilities

In 2015, 193 countries agreed to the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and its Sustainable Development Goals with a commitment where possible, "to disaggregate the statistics they generate by disability to provide important insights about the extent to which persons with disabilities (PWDs) are being included in society, benefit from government programmes, or are included in the workforce.

At the national level, 3.4% of the resident population aged 5 years and above have a disability, while in Bugesera district the disability prevalence rate is 3.6%.

At sector level, the highest prevalence rate of the resident population aged 5 years and above with disability is in Gashora (5.3%) and while the lowest is in Juru and Ruhuha (2.7% each).

The prevalence of disability varies slightly by type. Disability of seeing has the higher percentage both at national level (1.40%) and in Eastern Province (1.43%) compared to other types of disabilities. This type is followed by walking disability where it is 1.10% at national level and 1.00% at province level.

By district, Bugesera has the highest prevalence rate of residents with seeing disability (1.55%) and the lowest is in Gatsibo (1.30%).

In Bugesera district, seeing disability (1.55%) is followed by walking disability(1.00%), remembering or concentrating (0.67%) and hearing disability (,(0.64%).

3.4 Elderly Population(60 years and above)

Rwanda has enacted laws such as the Law No 088/01 of 07/09/2020 (Office of the Official Gazette of Rwanda, 2020) on Presidential order ratifying the protocol to the African charter on human and peoples' rights on the rights of older persons in Africa adopted by the twenty sixth ordinary session of the Assembly, held in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia, on 31 January 2016 through an Official Gazette No.27 of 07/09/2020 and Law No.59/2008 of 10/09/2008 on prevention and punishment of gender- based violence (Office of the Official Gazette of Rwanda, 2008), whose Article 32 sets the penalty for violence against an elderly person.

It is over two decades since the United Nations convened the First World Assembly on Ageing (Vienna, 1982) (National Academy of Sciences, National Research Council, 2001)) that launched an international action programme, which was the first international instrument on ageing, to provide a foundation for the formulation of policies and programmes on ageing. This was done to guarantee economic and social security to older persons and other opportunities to contribute to national development.

3.4.1 Elderly population of Bugesera district by Sector

In 2022, the elderly persons constitute 5.6% of the total resident population of Bugesera district. The share of the elderly females is higher than the male's one (6.3% vs. 4.8%), reflecting the higher life expectancy for women.

By sector, Rilima(7.6%) and Kamabuye(7.4%) have the highest share of elderly among their total population while Ntarama(4%) and Nyamata(4.1%) have the lowest.

3.4.2 Employment among elderly people

In Rwanda, people keep on working until old age, the share of employed persons among the elderly population stands at 28.2%. The aforementioned share is higher among the elderly males (33.7%) than elderly females (24.3%).

In Bugesera district, 26.1 % of elderly people were employed. The percentage of employed elderly people is higher among males than females (31.9% vs. 21.9%).

By sector, employment among elderly residents is high in Mwogo (40.8%) and Juru (38.0%). It is low in Mayange sector (12.5%) and in Rilima (12.6%).

3.4.3 Marital status of elderly people

In Bugesera district, more than half of the elderly population (60.6%) were married officially or not officially to one wife/husband, and 32.5 % were widowed. The rate of celibacy among elderly was 1.5% while divorce is 0.3% and separation rate is 2.7%.

Marital status among the elderly varies slightly by sector of residence. Marriage among elderly people is more important in Rilima with 71.1% for both married to one partner officially or not officially) and Nyarugenge (65.3%) sectors. widowhood is widespread in Mareba (39.9%) and Ruhuha (37.7% each) and lowest in Rilima (23.7%) sector.

CHAPTER 4: HOUSEHOLDS AND HOUSING CHARACTERISTICS

4.1 Household characteristics

In this chapter 5th Population and housing census 2022 investigated households and housing characteristics; those include household size, household's heads by sex, type of habitat, housing tenure, materials used for construction, sources of energy used for lighting and cooking, water sources, sanitation facilities, asset possessed by household and mode of waste and disposals.

4.1.1 Number and mean size of the private households

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 indicate the total of 3,312,743 households in Rwanda, 886,132 in the Eastern Province and 137,777 in Bugesera District.

The average household size in Bugesera District is 3.9 persons per household. At the Sector level, the highest sizes are found in Ngeruka and Rweru Sector (4.2 persons/household each). The smallest household size is found in Ntarama sector (3.6persons/household each).

The table below indicates number of households and size of household members per sector.

4.1.2 Private households' heads of Bugesera District

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 revealed that nationally 28.9% of private households are headed

by women. In Bugesera district, private households headed by females are 28.8%.

At sector level, the highest percentages of households headed by women are found in Nyarugenge sector (33.3%), Kamabuye(31. 9%) and Ngeruka sector (31.6%) while the lowest are found in Ntarama sector (25.2%), Juru(25.7%) and Nyamata(25.9%).

4.2 Housing Characteristics

4.2.1 Type of habitat

The results of 5th Population and Housing Census 2022 revealed that in the Eastern Province the predominant type of habitat is Umudugudu(planned rural settlement) with (86.5%). It is in same as in Bugesera district where it is 85.6%. In this district (Bugesera), this first type is followed by dispersed/isolated housing (5.4%) and spontaneous/squatter housing (4.2%).

The type of habitat varies across sectors: Umudugudu(planned rural settlement) is most prevalent in Nyarugenge (99.4%) and Gashora (98.9%) and low in Juru (46.1%). The sectors with the high percentages of dispersed/isolated housing units are Juru (24.6%) and Ntarama (15.8%). Juru has also the highest percentage of spontaneous/squatter housing(22%).



According to the area of residence, the predominant type of habitat in Bugesera district is the same in both urban and rural areas: it is Umudugudu (planned rural settlement) where it is 79.3% in urban areas and 89.8% in rural areas.

The second type of habitat in urban areas is spontaneous/squatter housing (6.5%), followed by dispersed/isolated housing (5,6%) while in rural areas, the second type is dispersed/isolated housing (5.3%), followed by spontaneous/squatter housing (2.6%).

4.2.2 Tenure of the housing

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 indicate that the ownership of housing in the Eastern Province represents 72.1% and tenant represent 21.1%. In Bugesera district, 65% of housing units are occupied by tenants while 27.5% are occupied by their owners.

At the sector level, the percentage of owners of households' units is high in Ngeruka (83.5%) and Mareba(80.1%) and low in Nyamata (43.6%) and Ntarama (44.7%). The percentage of tenants of housing units is high in Nyamata (47%) and Ntarama(46.1%) and low in Ngeruka (12%), Mareba(13.9%) and Shyara(14.6%). The percentage of free lodging is high in Rilima(8.5%) and Mayange(7.2%) and low in Juru(3.5%).




According to the area of residence, 3 types of tenure of housing units (owners, tenants and free lodging) predominate in urban area as well as in rural area and their percentages vary substantially according to the area of residence.

The percentage of owners of housing units is 51.9% in urban areas to 73.9% in rural areas. The percentage of tenants of housing units is 39.5% in urban areas to 19.3% in rural areas. The percentage of free lodging is 6.2% in urban areas to 5.4% in rural areas.

4.2.3 Material of the housing units

4.2.3.1 Main materials of the roof

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 indicate that housing units are mainly covered by iron sheets in Rwanda (74.1%), in the Eastern Province, the Iron sheet represent (98.9%). In Bugesera district, housing units are mainly covered by iron sheets (96.8 %). Only 3.1% are covered by local tiles and 0.1% by industrial tiles.

The variation by sector is not very significant. The high percentage of housing units covered by iron sheets are found in Kamabuye (100%) and it is more than 90% in other 12 sectors over 15 except in Shyara and Musenyi where the percentages are less than 80%(73.5% and 77.4% respectively).

The highest percentage of the housing units covered by local tiles is found in Shyara(26.3%) and Musenyi(22.4%).



According to the area of residence, in both rural and urban areas of Bugesera district, the predominant roofing materials are the iron sheets (99.6% in urban and 94.8% in rural areas).

The percentage of housing units covered by local tiles is 5.1% in rural areas while it is 0.3 in urban areas. Housing units covered by industrial tiles represent 0.1% both in urban and rural areas each.

4.2.3.2 Main materials of the walls

The results of the census show that the housing units of wall are mostly built with sundried bricks with cement in Rwanda (36.3%) followed by sundried brick without cement(30.7%), and the percentages are 36.4% and 30.5% (respectively) in the Eastern Province.

In Bugesera district, walls of the housing units are also mostly built with sundried bricks with cement (60.3%) and sundried bricks without cement (26.1%).

At the sector level, sun dried bricks with cement are the mostly used materials in Mayange (80.1%), Rilima(74.2%) and Mwogo (70.6%). Sun dried bricks without cement Wood/mud is the most frequently used material in Musenyi (42.6%), Rweru(42.1%) and Mareba (40.7%). Wood with mud and cement is most found in Kamabuye(23.0%) and wood with mud without cement is most frequently in Kamabuye(32.4%) and Ngeruka(20.7%).

According to the area of residence, the main materials used for walls of the housing units in Bugesera district are mostly sun-dried bricks with cement and sun-dried bricks without cement and their percentages vary substantially according to the area of residence.

In urban areas, the predominant materials are sun dried bricks with cement (71.7%) followed by sundried bricks without cement (17.7%) and wood with mud (5.3%).

In rural areas, sun dried bricks with cement are also predominant materials with 52.5% followed by sundried bricks without cement (31.9%) and wood with mud without cement (10.0%).




Figure 4. 4 Distribution (%) of the private households of Bugesera district by main material of walls of the housing unit and by area of residence

4.2.3.3 Main materials of the floor

The results 5RPHC 2022 indicate that the main material of the floor of the housing units is earth (60.4%) countrywide. In the Eastern Province, the earth is the main material of the floor of the housing units (60.9%).

In Bugesera district, the main material of the floor of the housing units is also the earthcement (54.3%) followed by cement (41.2%) and ceramic/clay/granite tiles (3.4%).

At sector level, the earth as main material used for the floor is most found in Ngeruka (77.8%), Mareba (73.8%), and Kamabuye (72.6%). The highest percentage of the housing units withcement as the second main material used for the floor is found in Rilima (58.9%), Mayange(57.9%) and Nyamata(56.9%) and the high percentage of housing units whose floor in ceramic/clay/granite tiles is found in Nyamata(12.2%) and Ntarama (10.1%).



By areas of residence, the results of census indicate the main materials used for floor of the housing units in Bugesera district are mostly earth, cement and ceramic/clay/granite tiles.

In urban areas, the predominant materials are cement (57.8%) followed by earth (32.8%) and ceramic/clay/granite tiles (7.9%). In rural areas, the predominant materials are earth (68.9%) and cement (29.9%).

4.3. Source of energy of the private households

4.3.1 Grid line connectivity in Bugesera district

At national level, the results of the 5th RPHC 2022 revealed that 52.5% of private households are connected to the national grid while 47.2% are not connected.

In Eastern Province, the percentage of private household connected to the national grid line is 47.3% while it is 55.5% in Bugesera District.

At the sector level, 7 sectors have more than 50% of households connected to the national grid: Nyamata (75.7%), Mayange(68.5%), Gashora(62.3%), Rilima(61.4%), Ntarama(60.4%), Rweru and Ruhuha(58.7 each). In the remaining 8 sectors the connection to the national grid is less than 50%. Juru sector is the one where we found the lowest percentage of households connected



4.3.2 Main source of energy for lighting in Bugesera district

In Bugesera district, the main source of energy for lighting used by households is electricity (60.8%). At the sector level, the percentage of households using electricity for lighting is high in Nyamata(79.3%) and Mayange(72.9%), and it is low in Mwogo (46.4%), Shyara (48%), Kamabuye(49%), Juru(49.1%) and Ngeruka (49.4%).

The sectors with the high percentages of private households using flashlight/phone flashlight for lighting are Shyara (45%), Juru(43.1%), Mwlogo(42.3%), Ngeruka(40.8%) and Kamabuye (40.3%). The sectors with the highest use of candles are Mwogo(7%) and Ntarama(5.8%).


According to the area of residence, the sources of energy for lighting in Bugesera district are mainly electricity, flashlight/phone flashlight and candles. However, the percentages of households using them vary by area of residence.

In urban areas, the main source of energy for lighting is electricity (75.2%), followed by flashlight/phone flashlight(18.5%) and candles (3.8%).

In rural areas, 51.1% of private households use electricity as main source of energy for lighting while 38.7% use flashlight, 3.8% use candles and 2.6% use firewoods.

4.3.3 Main sources of energy for cooking in Bugesera district

At the district level, the main sources of energy for cooking used by the private households are firewood (77.4%) followed by charcoal (16.7%) and gas (3.9%).

At the sector level, firewood is the most used source of cooking energy by private households in Ngeruka(97.1%), Kamabuye(96.3%), Mareba(95.6%), Rweru and Juru(94.2% each), Musenyi (92.7%) and Nyarugenge (91.2%%).

(23.6%). Sectors with the highest percentages of private households using gas as main source of cooking energy are also Nyamata (12.2%), Ntarama (8.8%) and Mayange(4.5%).





The results of 5RPHC 2022 reveal that improved water sources is the most water sources in Rwanda that represent (82.3%). In Bugesera district, 75.1% of private households use improved water sources.

At the sector level, the percentages of the private households using water from improved sources are highest in Mayange (99.1%), Ruhuha(96.1%), Nyamata(95.0%), Gashora and Rilima(90.7% each) and Nyarugenge(90.3%) while the lowest are in Rweru (32.4%), Juru(38.6%) and Mwogo(39.6%).





Figure 4. 9 Percentage of the private households of Bugesera District by main source of water and by Sector

In Bugesera district, both urban and rural areas, private households use mainly improved drinking source of water (87.8% in urban and 66.4% in rural).

The percentage of private households using unimproved source of drinking water is higher in rural (33.6%) than in urban (12.2 %). More details are displayed in figure below:

The figure below shows the main source of drinking water in each sector. It shows that in Rweru(67.6%), Kamabuye(62.2%), Juru(61.4%) and Mwogo(60.4%) the main source of drinking water is the unimproved drinking water source.

4.3.4.2 Main type of toilet facility

The results of census reveal that the main types of toilet facility used by the private households in Rwanda are Pit Latrine with constructed floor slab used by one household (68.8%).

In Bugesera district main types of toilet facility used by the private households are also Pit Latrine with constructed floor slab used by one household (68.8%),pit latrine with constructed floor slab used by several household(20.5%) and Pit Latrine without constructed floor slab used by one household (5.8%).

At the sector level, the percentage of households using private or pit latrines with constructed floor slab used by one household is high in Juru (82.4%), Kamabuye(82.3%), Ngeruka(82.0%) and Rilima(81.0%) while it is low in Ntarama (44.3%).

High percentages of households using pit latrine with constructed floor slab used by several households are in Ntarama (36.4%) and Nyamata (32.5%). For pit latrines without constructed floor slab used by one household, Nyarugenge (9.9%) and Mareba (9.3%) are the sectors with

the high percentage of private households using this kind of toilet. The table below indicates the types of toilets facilities.

According to the area of residence in Bugesera district, the type of toilet facility used frequently by the private households in both urban and rural areas is pit latrines with constructed floor slab used by one household (60.0% in urban and 74.7% in rural areas), followed by pit latrine with constructed floor slab used by several households (27.8% in urban and 15.6% in rural).

The third type found in urban is flush toilet used by one household (6.5%) while in rural areas, it is pit latrines without constructed floor slab used by one household (7.3%).




Figure 4. 11 Distribution (%) of the private households of Bugesera district by main type of toilet facility and by area of residence

4.3.4.3 Mode of waste disposal in Bugesera district

The results of the census reveal that, In Bugesera district, the high percentage of households (48.6%) evacuate their waste in compost dumping (44.4%) while 43.5% of private households evacuate their waste in the household's fields and 10.0% evacuate them through the waste collection companies.

At the Sector level, the high percentages of households evacuating their waste by using household compost dumping are in Musenyi(66.0%), Kamabuye(61.7%) and Mwogo (61.4%). The household's fields or bushes as main mode of waste disposal is the most used Ngeruka (59.2%), Juru(56.2%), Nyarugenge(53.2%) and Mareba (51.6%).

The high percentages of households using waste collection companies are in Nyamata(27.4%) and Ntarama(13.7%) while households using public compost dumping are mostly found in Nyarugenge(7.6%), Rweru(6.6%) and Mayange(6.2%).

The results of the census indicate the main modes of waste disposal used by the households.

Modes of waste disposal used vary by area of residence. In urban areas, private households evacuate their domestic waste in the household's fields or in the bushes(39.2%), followed by using compost dumping(38.8%. Other private households evacuate their domestic waste by waste collection companies (14.3%) and in the public compost dumping (5.1%).

In rural areas, the households evacuate their waste mainly by compost dumping (48.2%%) and others in their fields or in the bushes (46.5%).




Figure 4. 12 Distribution (%) of the private households of Bugesera district by mode of waste disposal and by area of residence

4.4 Assets possessed by private households in Bugesera District

4.4.1 Communication assets possessed by private households in Bugesera District

At the district level, 81.5% of private households possess a radio, 67.5% a mobile phone, 16.2% a smartphone, 13.1% a TV and 4.0% a computer.

The percentage of private households possessing a radio is high in Nyamata (90.3%), Mayange(88.9%) and Rilima(88.4%), it is low in Shyara (69.4%). The percentage of private households possessing a television is high in Nyamata (28.9%) and Ntarama (21.8%) while it is low in Ngeruka (3.3%), Shyara(4.2%), Kamabuye and Nyarugenge(4.4% each).

Mobile phone is mostly possessed by private households of Nyamata (82.9%), Mayange (78.9%), Rilima (77,1%), Ntarama (75,8%) and Gashora(70.2%).

The sectors with high percentage of households with smartphone are Nyamata (35.5%), Ntarama (26.97%) and Mayange (22.7%) while the percentage of households possessing this asset is low in Shyara (4.3%) and Ngeruka (5.1%).

The computer is mostly possessed in Nyamata (11.9%) and Ntarama(9.4%).

4.4.2 Access to the Internet

The results of the 5th RPHC-2022 indicate that the percentages of households with at least one member using internet are 22.2% at national level while they are 18.1% in Eastern province and 23.0% in Bugesera District.

At sector level, the high percentage of households with at least one member using internet is high in Nyamata (43.6%), Ntarama (33.6%) and Mayange 30.6%).

The sectors with the lower percentages of households with at least one member using internet are Shyara (7.4%), Ngeruka(10.2), Musenyi(11.4) and Juru (11.6%).


According to the area of residence in Bugesera District, the results of the census show that the access to the Internet varies greatly in accordance with the area of residence in Bugesera district.

CHAPTER 5: AGRICULTURE IN BUGESERA DISTRICT

The agriculture was the one of the areas of investigation of the 5th Rwanda Population and housing census conducted in 2022. The households engaged in Livestock husbandry; the number of private crop farming households cultivating different types of crops, by Sector, the number of private households raising different types of livestock, by Sector and type of household raised in district were captured in the census.

5.1. The households engaged in crop farming and livestock husbandly

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 revealed that nationally, 2,280,854 of private households (68.9%) are engaged in agriculture, among them 62.6% are engaged in crop farming and 50.4% are engaged in Livestock husbandry.

In Bugesera district, Agricultural households occupy (66.4%) with 59.4% of households engaged in crop farming and 42.8% Households engaged in Livestock husbandry.

At sector level, Ngeruka and Kamabuye sectors have a high proportion of Households engaged in crop farming (82.6% and 81.4% respectively), and Ngeruka has also a high proportion of households engaged in livestock husbandry (65.3%), followed by Shyara (61.3%).

5.2. Distribution of private household engaged in crop farming in Bugesera District

The results of 5th Population and housing census 2022 indicate that the most cultivated crops by the private households of Bugesera district are beans, maize, fruits, cassava, sweet potatoes, banana and Sorghum. Private households cultivated beans are more found in Mayange, Ngeruka, Nyamata and Musenyi while they are less in Shyara.

Private households cultivated maize are more found in Mayange, Ngeruka, Rweru and Nyamata. Ngeruka has the high number Private households cultivated fruits and cassava.

Juru has a high number of those cultivated sweet potatoes and banana.

5.3. Distribution of private households engaged in raising different types of livestock in Bugesera District

Nationally and in the Eastern Province, the results of the census indicate that most private households are considerably more engaged in raising cows, goats, and chicken than other livestock. In Bugesera district, goats take the first place, followed by chicken, cows and pigs respectively.

The sector that have high proportion of private households that are engaged in raising goats and pigs is Ngeruka. The high proportions of private households engaged in raising chicken are found in Nyamata and Mayange. Households raising cows are more in Musenyi. The table below displays details:
