The Fifth Rwanda Population and Housing Census (RPHC2022) was implemented by the National Institute of Statistics of Rwanda (NISR). Field work was conducted from August 16th to 30th, 2022.

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FOREWORD

The Government of Rwanda, through the National Institute of Statistics of Rwanda (NISR) conducted the 2022 Rwanda Population and Housing Census to provide updated demographic, social and economic indicators for policy formulation and planning to support the national development agenda and track the implementation of national, regional, continental and global development goals, such as the First National Strategy for Transformation (NST1 2017-2024); the AU Agenda 2063; and the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

The Population and Housing Census in Rwanda dates back to the year 1978 when the first ever modern census was implemented. The second, third, and fourth censuses were carried out in 1991, 2002, and 2012 respectively. The 2022 Population and Housing Census marks therefore the Fifth in the series following the United Nations Recommendations to conduct a census every ten years.

Considering census' crucial importance for the planning process, the Government of Rwanda has made the Population and Housing Census a priority to be undertaken every 10 years and adopted the use of technologies for timely delivery of census results for use.

Results of the 2022 Population and Housing Census provide population numbers from national to the lowest administrative level, as well as demographic and socio-economic indicators at both national and district levels. The census remains the only national data collection exercise that can provide the lowest levels of disaggregation to support decentralised decision making across the country.

I would like therefore to take this opportunity to thank all stakeholders that contributed to the success of the 2022 Population and Housing Census. They include Ministries and other Government institutions, international organizations such as the World Bank (WB), the European Union (EU), the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA), One-UN, UN Women, UNICEF, UNECA, the United Kingdom AID (UKAID), the African Development Bank (AfDB), the USAID, Enabel, PARIS 21 and others for their support in diverse ways.

My special thanks go to the local government leaders from the province to the village levels who contributed a lot to the success of the 2022 Population and Housing Census. Exceptional gratitude to all enumerators, teachers and young people who collected the information and all respondents for their cooperation and dedication. The National Institute of Statistics of Rwanda (NISR) deserves special appreciation for the excellent operational and coordination of all census activities.

I finally recommend that the invaluable information contained in different thematic reports of the 5th Rwanda Population and Housing Census be used as updated evidence for all decision and policy making for the national, regional and global development programs.





Figure 1. 1Administrative map of Kamonyi District



Chapter 1: Population Size, Spatial Distribution, and Structure

1.1Size and spatial Distribution of the population

1.1.1 Size and Spatial Distribution of the Population of southern Province

The 5th Rwanda Population and Housing Census (PHC5) has enumerated 3,002,699 residents in the southern Province, which represents 22.66% of the total population of Rwanda (13,246,394 residents). The population of southern Province is predominantly female; 1,554,244 are women corresponding to 51.8 % of the total population of southern Province. Kamonyi is the most populated district with 450,848 residents in 2022. Its population represents 15.01% of the total residents' population of southern Province. The least populated district in the southern Province is Muhanga with 358,433 inhabitants, corresponding to 11.9% of the total resident population of southern Province.

1.1.2 Population Density of southern Province by District

Population density is a measurement of population per unit land area. Density is the number of inhabitants per Km². The Rwanda Population and Housing Census conducted in 2022 revealed that, the population density in Rwanda is 503 inhabitants per Km². The southern Province has 547 inhabitants per Km². The district with a highest population density is Kamonyi with 683 Inhabitants per km² while the district with a lowest population density is Nyaruguru with 409 Inhabitants per km². The figure below indicates distribution of population density per district.




Figure 1. 2 Population density (inhabitant per Km²) by district in South Province.




Figure 1. 3Distribution of population density by sectors of Kamonyi District

1.1.3 Size and Spatial Distribution of the Population of the Kamonyi district .

The 5th Rwanda Population and Housing Census (PHC5) has enumerated 450,849 residents in Kamonyi district, which represent 15% % of the total population of the southern Province (3,002,699 residents). The population of Kamonyi District is predominantly female: 233,279 are women corresponding to 51.7 % of the total population Kamonyi District. The results in previous table 1.1 indicates that, the population share of Kamonyi District is 15% of the total Population of southern Province.

Runda (727,779 population) and Rugarika (59,952 population) are the most populated sectors. They represent 16.1% and 13.3% of the total population of Kamonyi District, respectively. The two less populated sectors are Ngamba (16,416 inhabitants) and Kayumbu (17,106 inhabitants). They represent 3.6% and 3.8% of the total resident population of Kamonyi district, respectively. The table below 1.2 indicates the number of the population of Kamonyi district by sector, by sex and their shares across sectors to the total population of Kamonyi district.

1.1.4 Size and Spatial Distribution of the Population of Kamonyi District by residence area

The results of Rwanda Population and housing census 2022 revealed that, the total population of Rwanda are spatially distributed in rural area that represent 72.1% and urban area represent 27.9%. The southern Province is predominantly by the Rural area (85.2%) and urban area (14.8%). Kamonyi district population is predominantly by Rural area 68.4% while urban represents 31.6%.

The sectors of Kamonyi District which are entirely Rural are Gacurabwenge, Karama, Kayenzi, Kayumbu, Mugina, Musambira, Ngamba,Nyamiyaga, Nyarubaka,Rugarika and Rukoma and while Runda is entirely urban. The table below 1.3 illustrates the results.

1.1.5 Age -Sex Structure of Kamonyi District

Kamonyi population is mostly young. 55.53% of the resident population of Kamonyi is under 25 years, as shown by the age pyramid (Figure 4), reflecting the high level of fertility in the recent past. The elderly (60 years and above) represents 7.30 % of the total population of the district. The percentage share of the population aged 0-14 represents 36.57%, the population aged 15-34 years represents 32.34% and 35 to 85 years and above represents 31.09%. The table below 1.4 illustrates the results, and more details of sectors are in the annex.




Figure 1. 4Age pyramid of the resident population of Kamonyi District in 2022

1.1.6 Population share (%) of some specific interventions target groups in Kamonyi District by sex

The Rwanda population and housing census 2022 indicate the population on specific agesbased programs, policy and strategies interventions in health, education, employment and indicates the population categories in their respective characteristics such as children, youth, working population, among other things. For instance, children under five years for immunization programs (Under 5), children in school age (3-17 years), people in the official working age group (16 years and above), etc. Knowing the size of such groups is of great importance for the design, implementation, monitoring, and evaluation of programs targeting such groups. The above table gives the size of the main interventions target groups by sex, and their share in the entire population of Kamonyi district. The population aged 0-17 represents 43.7% of the total population of the district, 16-30 years represent 24.8%; the working age population (16 and above) represents 56.4% of the same population. The table below shows distribution of Kamonyi district by targeted interventions by their age.

CHAPTER 2: CHARACTERISTICS OF THE POPULATION

2.1 Socio-cultural characteristics of the population

2.1.1 Nationality of the population of Kamonyi District

The results of 5th RPHC-2022 indicate that, the Rwandan population by nationality represent 99.1% and foreigners represent 0.89%. In the Southern Province, foreigners represent 0.61% and Kamonyi District represent the foreigners represent 0.07%.

Four sectors of Kamonyi Districts that have the highest percentage of foreigners compared to others are Runda (0.20%), Rugarika (0.07%), Musambira, Gacurambwenge were (0.06%) while Kayumbu sector has no foreigners The table below illustrates the distribution of the population by nationality with their respective sectors of residence.

2.1.2 Religious affiliation of resident population of Kamonyi District

In Kamonyi district, Christianity is the predominant religion in Kamonyi District. 43.98% are catholic, 18.98% are Protestants, 19.65% are ADPR, 7.23% are Adventists, and 2.42% are Muslim, and Jehovah witness are 0.50%. and 2% are the other religions 2.61% of the resident population declared themselves to be without religion. 2.2 Marital Status of the resident population of Kamonyi District.

2.2.1 Marital Status by sector

The results of 5RPHC-2022, revealed that 50,1% of the resident population of Kamonyi District aged 12 and above were living in union (married officially to one wife/husband, married not officially to one wife/husband, live in polygamous union) at the time of the census, while 43.6% were never married. 4.6% were widowed, while separated and divorced were respectively 1.5% and 0.2%. At the sector level, three sectors, Kayumbu (53.2), Rugarika (53.0%) and Kayenzi (52.2%) have the highest percentages of the currently married people. Gacurabwenge (45.7%) and Runda (45.5) have the highest percentages of the never married persons. Karama,Nyarubaka and Nyamiyaga sectors have high percentage of widowed persons (5.7%,5.7 and 5.3% respectively). Details of the resident population of Kamonyi District aged 12 years and above by marital status and sex is presented in the annex.

The percentages of resident population of Kamonyi District by marital status vary by sex and age: The percentage of never married persons decreases from 99.9% (age group of 12-14 years) to 1.0% (age group of 80 years and above). The percentage of persons currently living in union starts by increasing from 0.1% (age group of 12-14 years) to a maximum of 86.2% (age group of 40-44 years) before decreasing to 48.9% (age group 85+) due mainly to widowhood (49.2%). The highest percentage of divorced persons (0.6%) is observed from age group 50-54, while the highest percentage of the separated persons (3.2%) is found in age group 45-49 years.

2.3 Educational Characteristics of the Population of Kamonyi District

2.3.1 School attendance

Table 2.5 below shows that, in Kamonyi district, 54.8% of pre-primary-age population (3-5 years) are currently attending school, 45.2% of children have never attended and 0% of children have previously attended (i.e., children who have already had prior exposure to nursery school education before the time of census but who were not attending nursery school/dropped-out during census time). Karama Sector has the highest proportion of children (age between 3 to 5) currently attending school in Kamonyi District (68.5%). Ngamba sector has the lowest percentage of children currently attending school, with only 32.6% enrolled. On the other hand, Ngamba and Kayumbu sectors have the highest proportion of children aged 3 to 5 who have never attended school (67.4 and 62.9%, respectively).

Table 2.6 shows that in Kamonyi District 94.0% of children aged 6 to 11 years (the official primary school-going age) are currently attending school 4.9% have never attended school and only 1.1% have previously attended school (which means that 6% of children aged 6 to 11 are out of school).

By comparing the distribution of the primary school-age population (6-11 years) across sectors in Kamonyi District, comparisons reveal the disparities in primary school attendance across different sectors within Kamonyi District. Sectors like Mugina, Nyamiyaga and Nyarubaka exhibit lower rates of children currently attending school (89.2%, 92.9% against 93.7%, respectively) and higher rates of children who have never attended (9.2%, 5.9% against 4.9%, respectively). On the other hand, sectors like Kayenzi and Karama demonstrate higher rates of children currently attending school (97.6% against 96.4%, respectively) and lower rates of children who have never attended (2.0% against 2.9%, respectively).

In Kamonyi District 22.2% of the population aged 12 to 17 have previously attended school (i.e. they dropped out of school), 76.1% are currently attending school and 2.7% have never attended secondary school.

The distribution of the secondary school-age population (12-17 years) across sectors in Kamonyi District, shows that Gacurabwenge sector has the highest percentage of the population aged 12 to 17 currently attending school at 81.6%. Conversely, Rugarika sector has the lowest percentage of the population aged 12 to 17 currently attending school at 81.6%. Rugarika Sector also has the highest percentage of the population between the ages of 12 and 17 who have never attended school at 2.4%.

2.3.2 Gross and Net Attendance Rate (%) in Primary school in Kamonyi District

Gross and Net Attendance Ratios are used to measure the extent of coverage of an educational program. It gives a comparison of the children attending school with the total size of the school-age population. It can also be used for assessing how far a country has succeeded in bringing to school all those who are eligible to attend.

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 reveal that not all children attending primary school level are of the official age for that level (6-11 years). The gross attendance rate in Rwanda is 141.7, in the Southern Province GAR is 146.6 and 146.0 in Kamonyi Districts. At sector level, GAR are greater than 135 in all sectors, with minor variations except in Runda (135.2%). The net attendance rate (NAR) in Primary school for Kamonyi district (93.9%) is greater than the NAR of Southern Province (90.0%) and NAR of national level (89.3%). The highest net attendance rate in primary school (97.6%) is in Kayenzi sector followed by Karama sector with 96.4%

while the sector with the lowest NAR is Mugina with 89.2%. The table below displays results:

2.3.3 Gross and Net Attendance Rate (%) in Secondary School

At the national level, the net school attendance rate (22.3%) at secondary level is less than the rate at Kamonyi district level (26.3%). The gross attendance rate in Kamonyi district is 43.8 % while the net attendance rate is 26.3 %. This means that a big proportion of Kamonyi children who are supposed to attend secondary school are not actually attending that level, especially during their official school age. Gross attendance rate for females (51.0%) is more than the one for males (36.5%) while NAR for female (31.8%) is more than NAR for males (20.7%) in Kamonyi district. At the sector level, the highest net attendance rate is in Runda (33.5%) and the lowest is in Mugina and Nyamiyaga (18.9% and 20.5 respectively).

2.3.4 Highest level of school attended in Kamonyi District

The results of 5RPHC-2022 indicate that, among the population aged 3 years and above in Kamonyi district is 11,999,691, The highest level of education attended is categorized into several levels: Never attended School, Nursery, Primary, INGOBOKA/Vocational, Lower secondary, Upper secondary, University, and Not stated 13.1% of them has never attended any formal school, 62.6% attained the primary level, 9.9% attained lower secondary level, 6.7% has attained upper secondary and 3.1% attained university level. The level of educational attainment varies across sectors, Nyamiyaga is highest percentage of primary school attainment (67.9%), Runda is highest in upper secondary school attainment (11.6%), and Runda has a high percentage of 8.9% of the population attained University than other sectors. The table below indicates the findings:

2.4 Characteristics of the Empoyed Population

The official working age in Rwanda is 16 years and above. Aggregate employment generally increases with growing population. Therefore, the ratio of Employment to the working age population (employment to population ratio) is an important indicator of the capacity of the Economy to provide employment to a growing population. A decline in the employment-to population ratio is often regarded as an indicator of economic slowdown and a decline in total employment as an indicator of a more severe economic downturn.

2.4.1 Employment to population ratio by sex, Province, District and area of residence

The results presented in the below table 2.11 shows that the employment to population ratio stood at 45.9 in Rwanda, it is lower among females (40.2 percent) than males (52.4 percent). On the other side, it was observed that the employment to population ratio is higher in urban areas of Rwanda (53.5 percent) than in rural areas (42.7 percent). It was observed that in Southern Province, the employment to population ratio stood at 42,9 percent, it is higher in urban areas (52.5 percent) than in rural areas of south (41.2 percent). It was also revealed that the employment to population ratio is 46.6 percent among people residing in Kamonyi districts, it is higher in urban areas of Kamonyi (52.6 percent) than in rural areas of Kamonyi (43.8 percent).





2.4.2 Employement to population ratio (EPR) among the resident population of Kamonyi District aged 16 years and above by age group and sex

Figure below allows the study of intensity of Employment to population ratio and its variation by sex. The figure reveals the following remarks: The employment to population ratio among males as well as females increases from age group 16-19 to 35-39 and starts decreasing from age group 40-44 to 85 years and above as people starts getting very older and retire. It was observed that in district of Kamonyi, the highest employment to population ratio among males stands at 70.5% and was observed in age group 30-34, On the other side the highest employment to population among females is 50.1% and was observed in the age group 40-44. The lowest employment to population ratio among males stands at 8.0% and was observed among males in the age group 80+, the lowest employment to population ratio among females is 5.0% and was observed among females in the age group 85+

CHAPTER 3: SUB-POPULATION

3.1 Children Population (0-17 years)

According to the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child (1989), a child is defined as every human being under 18 unless, under the law applicable to the child, majority is attained earlier. It is relevant to underline here that this definition by age coincides with that of Rwanda, as stipulated in article 3 of the National Law n° 54/2011 of 14 December 2011 relating to the rights and the protection of the child, which stipulates that a child is any person under the age of 18. The age range (0–17) adopted for this report reflects this definition.

3.1.1 The number and share of children in Kamonyi District

The results of 5^{Th} RPHC-2022 revealed that, the children population constitute 44.5% of the total population of 13,246,394. Southern province has 1,333,748 children with a share of 44.4% of the total resident population. In Kamonyi District, the children constitute 43.7% of the resident population of the district, with a percentage of Male slightly greater than the female' one (45.4% vs 42.0%). The children's share is high in Nyamiyaga (46.2%) and Mugina (45.9%), and small in Ngamba (41.1%) and Kayenzi (40.8%). The table below indicate distribution of children by sector and by sex.

3.1.2 Children with legal birth registration in Kamonyi District

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 indicate the percentage of children whose birth was registered is 94.3% at the national level. The birth registration rate in Kamonyi District is 94.5%. Birth registration performance is almost the same in urban (95.0%) and (94.2%) in the rural areas of Kamonyi District. The table below illustrates the findings:

3.1.3 Birth registration by sector

The results of 5th RPHC-2022 indicate that birth registration varies across sectors and areas of residence (urban and rural), Karama, Kayenzi, Kayumbu, Ngamba, Nyamiyaga and Nyarubaka sectors have not urban areas, the high percentages of birth registrations are found in Kayenzi (97.6%), Kayumbu (96.4%) and Ngamba (96.6%) while the lowest is in Nyamiyaga (91.0%) and Nyamiyaga(91.0). The percentage of birth registration for males is almost the same as the one for females. In urban areas of Kamonyi district, birth registration is 95.0% while in rural areas, it is 94.2%.

3.2 Youth population in Rwanda

For statistical purposes, the Unted Nations defines 'youth', as those persons between the ages of 15 and 24 years, without prejudice to other definitions by Member States. Considering the current priorities and trends of Rwanda's Development, the definition of Youth in terms of age has been revised in this policy. It was brought from 14–35 years to 16–30 years.

3.2.1 The youth population in Kamonyi district

The results of 5th Population and housing Censuses conducted in 2022 revealed that, the youth represent 27.1% (3,595,670) of the total population (13,246,394). The youth population in Kamonyi district was 111,882 which represents 24.8% of the total resident population of the district (450,849). The sector with the highest youth share is Runda (29.6%) while Karama (22.1%) and Nyamiyaga (22.7%) have the lowest share of youth. The table below indicate distribution of youth by sector, and by sex.

3.2.2 Educational characteristics of youth

Youth who never attended school represent 5.15 % of the youth resident population at national level; it represents 4.9% of the total resident population in Southern Province and 3.2% of the total resident population of Kamonyi District. The percentage of youth who never attended school varies a lot within sectors of Kamonyi District. The highest percentage was registered in Rugarika (4.6%) while the lowest percentages were registered in Kayenzi(1.8%), Kayumbu (1.8%) and Karama (2.1%).

3.2.3 Highest level of education attented by youth in Kamonyi District

In Kamonyi District, among all youths, 50.2% attained only the primary school level, 24.2 % attained the lower secondary education, 16.8 % attained the upper secondary education, 4.0% attained university, and 3.2% have not attended any formal of school. The highest level of education attained varies across sectors of the district. The sectors with the highest percentage of youth with no schooling are Rugarika (4.6%), Nyamiyaga (3.7%) and Mugina (3.4%). The percentage of youth with university level is high in Runda (8.6%), Rugarika (4.5%) and Gicurabwenge (4.4%). The sectors with the highest percentages of youth with primary education are Mugina (58.5%) and Kayumbu (57.9%).

3.2.4 Employment to population ratio among youth(16-30)

The Census results showed that In Rwanda the employment to population ratio among youth stands at 40.3%, it is higher among males than females 44.8% and 36.2 % respectively. It was observed that in the district of Kamonyi, the employment to population ratio among youth stands at 39.5%, it is higher in among males (45.5%) than females (33.8%)

The Highest employment to population ratio among youth in Kamonyi District was observed in Rukoma (62.1%), Runda(51.6%), Kayenzi (47.8)and Rugarika (48.4%) and low percentages in Kayumbu(33.7%) and Nyarubaka (34.9%).

3.2.5 Distribution(%) of the currently employed youth agedof Kamonyi District aged 16-30 years by employment status and sex

In Kamonyi district, the majority of youth aged 16-30 currently employed are employees (63.3%) followed by own account worker without regular employees (28.6%). The highest percentage of youth employees is found in Kayumbu (85.2%), while the lowest is in Nyarubaka (44.6%). The highest percentage of currently employed population who worked as own account worker without regular employees among youth is found in Musambira (46.5%) and in Nyarubaka (42.4%) while the lowest is observed in Kayumbu (14.4%), in Runda(21.0%) and in Gacurabwenge (24.4%).

3.2.6 Proportion of Youth (16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training in Southern Province by sex, district, and area of residence

The results of 5RPHC-2022 indicate that, In Rwanda the proportion of Youth (16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training stood at 39.5 %. It is higher among females (43.8 %) than males (34.9 %).

In the Southern Province, the variation of proportion of Youth (16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training in Southern Province by sex, district, and area of residence. 38.8% of the active population of Kamonyi District aged 16 years and above, were neither in employment nor in education or training during the week preceding the census. In Kamonyi district is higher in rural (40.9%) than in urban areas (35.0%). proportion of Youth (16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training among females is higher than males in Kamonyi District (43.5% vs 33.8%).

3.3 Persons with disabilities

In 2015, 193 countries agreed to the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and its Sustainable Development Goals with a commitment where possible, "to disaggregate the statistics they generate by disability to provide important insights about the extent to which persons with disabilities (PWDs) are being included in society, benefit from government programmes, or are included in the workforce.

At the national level, 3.4% of the resident population aged 5 years and above have a disability. while in Kamonyi District the disability prevalence rate is 3.2%. At sector level, the highest prevalence rates of the resident population aged 5 years and above with disability is in Nyarubaka(4.6) and Ngamba (4.4% each) and while the lowest is in Runda(1.8) and Kayumbu(2.2%).

Rwanda has enacted laws such as the Law No 088/01 of 07/09/2020 (Office of the Official Gazette of Rwanda, 2020) on Presidential order ratifying the protocol to the African charter on human and peoples' rights on the rights of older persons in Africa adopted by the twenty sixth ordinary session of the Assembly, held in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia, on 31 January 2016 through an Official Gazette No.27 of 07/09/2020 and Law No.59/2008 of 10/09/2008 on

prevention and punishment of gender- based violence (Office of the Official Gazette of Rwanda, 2008), whose Article 32 sets the penalty for violence against an elderly person. It is over two decades since the United Nations convened the First World Assembly on Ageing (Vienna, 1982) (National Academy of Sciences, National Research Council, 2001)) that launched an international action programme, which was the first international instrument on ageing, to provide a foundation for the formulation of policies and programmes on ageing. This was done to guarantee economic and social security to older persons and other opportunities to contribute to national development.

3.4.1 Elderly population of Kamonyi District by sector

In 2022, the elderly persons constitute 7.3% of the total resident population of Kamonyi district. The share of the elderly females is higher than the male's one (8.4% vs. 6.1%), reflecting the higher life expectancy for women. By sector, Kayumbu and Ngamba (9.8% each) have the highest of elderly among their total population while Runda (4.2%) have the lowest.

3.4.2 Employment among elderly people

In Rwanda, people keep on working until old age, the share of employed persons among the elderly population stands at 28.2%. The aforementioned share is higher among the elderly males (33.7%) than elderly females (24.3%).

In Kamonyi District, people keep on working until old age as shown by the fact that 31.2 % of elderly people were employed during the week preceding the time of the census. The percentage of employed elderly males is higher than elderly females (38.4% vs. 26.3%). Employment among elderly residents is high in Musambira (39.2%) and Rukoma (36.3 %). It is low in Kayumbu sector (8.6%) and Karama (22.1%).

3.4.3 Marital status of elderly people

In Kamonyi district, more than half of the elderly population (66.4%) were married and 28.9 % were widowed. The rate of celibacy among elderly was 2.4% while divorce or separation rate is 2.3%. Marital status among the elderly varies slightly by sector of residence. Marriage among elderly people is more important in Kayumbu (65.5%), Ngamba and Kayenzi (64.8% each) sectors. widowhood is widespread in Gacurabwenge (30.9%) and Runda (30.8%) and lowest in Rukoma (27.0%) and Rugarika (27.4%) sectors.

CHAPTER 4: HOUSEHOLDS AND HOUSING CHARACTERISTICS

4.1 Household characteristics.

In this chapter 5th Population and housing census 2022 investigated households and housing characteristics; those include household size, head of household by sex, type of habitat, housing tenure, materials used for construction, sources of energy used for lighting and cooking, water sources, sanitation facilities, asset possessed by household and mode of waste and disposals.

4.1.1 Number of households and size of household members.

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 indicate the total of 3,312,743 households in Rwanda, 760,173 in the Southern Province and 116,378 in Kamonyi District. The average household size in Kamonyi District is 3.9 persons per household. At the Sector level, the highest sizes are found in Gacurabwenge, Karama, Mugina, Musambira, Nyamiyaga, Rukoma and Runda (3.9 persons/household each). The smallest household size is found in Kayumbu and (3.7persons/household). The table below indicates number of households and size of household members per sector.

4.1.2 Private households' heads of Kamonyi District .

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 revealed that nationally 28.9% of private households are headed by women. In Kamonyi District, private households headed by females are 28.1%. At sector level, the highest percentages of households headed by women are found in Mugina sector, Musambira sactor (31.9% each) while the lowest is found in Runda sector (21.5%).

4.2 Housing Characteristics

4.2.1 Type of habitat

The results of 5th Population and Housing Census 2022 revealed that in the southern Province the predominant type of habitat is Umudugudu (Planned rural settlement) (72.3%) and Dispersed/ Isolated housing (20.2%). It is in same as in Kamonyi District as one of districts of the southern Province. The most common type of habitat in Kamonyi District is Umudugudu (Planned rural settlement) (70.3%) followed by Dispersed/ Isolated housing (21.9%) and Modern planned urban housing (2.4%). The type of habitat varies across sectors. Umudugudu (Planned rural settlement) is most prevalent in Rukoma (78.0%) and Musambira (74.8%) and low in Kayumbu (58.4%) and Kayenzi (58.5%). The sectors with the high percentages of dispersed/isolated housing units are Kayenzi (40.0%) and Kayumbu(36.9%).

According to the area of residence. In urban areas, the predominant types are umudugudu/ (Planned Rural settlement) (71.7%) and dispersed/isolated housing (14.3%). In rural areas, the predominant type is umudugudu/ (Planned Rural settlement) (69.6%) followed by dispersed/isolated housing (25.3).




Figure 4. 1 Distribution (%) of the private households of Kamonyi District by type of habitat and by Area of residence.

4.2.2 Tenure of the housing

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 indicate that the ownership of housing in the southern Province represents 77.6% and tenant represent 14.2%. In Kamonyi district, 71.7% of housing units are occupied by ownership of housing while 21.4% are occupied by their tenant. At the sector level, the percentage of owners of households' units is high in Ngamba (86.0%), Kayenzi (85.4%) and Kayumbu(83.5%) and low in Runda (54.0%). The percentage of tenants of housing units is high in Runda (40.3%), and Gacurabwenge (25.2%) and low in Kayumbu (8.9%) and Ngamba (7.5%).

According to the area of residence In Kamonyi District, 3 types of tenure of housing units (owners, tenants, and free lodging) predominate in urban area as well as in rural area and their percentages vary substantially according to the area of residence. The percentage of owners of housing units is 57.9% in urban areas to 78% in rural areas, The percentage of tenants of housing units is 35.6% in urban areas to 14.8% in rural areas. The percentage of free lodging is 5.0% in urban areas to 6.0% in rural areas.




Figure 4. 2Distribution (%) of the private households of Kamonyi District by tenure of the housing and area of residence

4.2.3 Material of the housing units 4.2.3.1 Main materials of the roof

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 indicate that housing units are mainly covered by iron sheets in Rwanda (74.1%), in the southern Province, the Iron sheet represent (39.0%). In Kamonyi District, housing units are mainly covered by iron sheets (62.2%). Only 37.6% are covered by local tiles, 0.1% by industrial tiles and 0.1% by asbestos. The variation by sector is not very significant. The high percentages of housing units covered by iron sheets are found in Runda (96.3%), Rukoma (94.6%) and Ngamba (89.9%), The lowest is Kayumbu with 20.1% of housing units covered by iron sheets. The highest percentage of the housing units covered by local tiles is found in Kayumbu sector (79.8%) while the lowest is Runda with 3.2% covered by local tiles.



The results of the census reveal that the materials used for roofing of the households' units in Kamonyi District vary slightly according to the area of residence. In both rural and urban areas of Kamonyi District, the predominant roofing materials are the iron sheets (50.7% in rural and 87.1% in urban areas). The percentage of housing units covered by local tiles is 49.1% in rural areas while it is 12.5 in urban areas. The figure below illustrates details:





4.2.3.2 Main materials of the walls

The results of the census show that the most materials of the walls of the housing units are sundried bricks with cement: 36.3% in Rwanda, 35.8.% in the southern province and 58.0.% in Kamonyi district. At the national level, it is followed by sundried bricks without cement (30.7%) while the second most materials of the walls of the housing units in southern Province is Wood with mud without cement (26.7.%) and Kamonyi district is Sun dried bricks without cement(27.5) At the sector level, sun dried bricks with cement are the mostly used materials Gacurabwenge(64,9%) and Rugarika (63.0%), Sun dried bricks without cement is the most frequently used material in Nyarubaka (42.2%) and Mugina(39.2) The table below displays details:





According to the area of the residence, the main materials used for walls of the housing units in Kamonyi District are mostly sun-dried bricks, wood with mud and burnt bricks and their percentages vary substantially according to the area of residence. In urban areas, the predominant materials are sundried bricks (65.0%) followed by burnt bricks (16.9%) and wood with mud (5.1%). In rural areas, sundried are predominant materials with 54.8% followed by burnt bricks (32.4%) and wood with mud (6.9%).

4.2.3.3 Main materials of the floor


The results 5RPHC 2022 indicate that the main material of the floor of the housing units is earth (60.4%) countrywide. In the southern Province, the earth is the main material of the floor of the housing units (64.2%). In Kamonyi District, the main material of the floor of the housing units is earth (57.0%) followed by ciment (38.0%) and ceramic/clay/granite tiles (3.1%). At sector level, the earth as main material used for the floor is most found in Mugina (72.5%), Nyarubaka (68.0%), and Ngamba (66.9%). The highest percentage of the housing units with ciment as main material used for the floor is found in Runda (51.4%) and Gacurabwenge (45.6%) and the high percentage of housing units whose floor in ceramic/clay/granite tiles is found in Runda (14%) and Gacurabwenge (2.6%), The table below displays details:

By areas of residence, the results of census indicate the main materials used for floor of the housing units in Kamonyi District are mostly cement, earth and ceramic/clay/granite tiles. In urban areas, the predominant materials are cement (50.9%) followed by earth (37.9%) and ceramic/clays/Granite titles (9.0%). In rural areas, the predominant materials are earth (65.7%) and cement (32.2%). The figure below provides details:

4.3. Source of energy of the private households

4.3.1 Grid line connectivity in Kamonyi District.

At national level, the results of the 5th RPHC 2022 revealed that 52.5% of private households are connected to the national grid while 47.2% are not connected. In Southern Province, the percentage of private household connected to the national grid line is 43.8% while it is 43.7% in Kamonyi district. At the sector level, the highest percentages of private households are Runda (71,1%) and Gacurubwenge (54.8%) with lower percentages of private households connected to the national grid line are Ngamba (25.5%) and Nyamiyaga (26.8%).



4.3.2 Main Source of energy for lighting in Kamonyi District

In Kamonyi District, the main source of energy for lighting used by households is electricity (61.0%). At the sector level, the percentage of households using electricity for lighting is high in Runda (76.9%), and Gacurabwenge (63.8%), The lowest is in Nyamiyaga(38.4%) and Ngamba(39.8%). The sectors with the high percentages of private households using flashlight/phone flashlight for lighting are Ngamba (55.2%) and Nyamiyaga (53.8%). Table below provides details:







According to the area of residence the main sources of energy for lighting in Kamonyi District are mainly electricity, candles, and flashlight/phone flashlight. However, the percentages of households using them vary by area of residence. In urban areas, the main source of energy for lighting is electricity (71.7%), followed by flashlight/phone flashlight (20.2%) and candles (4.7%). In rural areas, 46.5% of private households use flashlight/phone flashlight as main source of energy for lighting while 45.9% use electricity

4.3.3 Main sources of energy for cooking in Kamonyi District

At the district level, the main sources of energy for cooking used by the private households are firewood (81.3%) followed by charcoal (14.8%) and gas (2.3%).

At the sector level, firewood is the most used source of cooking energy by private households in Kayumbu (96.8%) and Ngamba (96.0%) followed by Kayenzi (95.7%) and Karama (95.5%). Sectors with the high percentage of private households using charcoal as main source of cooking energy are Runda (44.9%) and Rugarika (24.2%). Sectors with the highest percentages of private households using gas as main source of cooking energy are Runda (9.8%), and Gacurabwenge (2.1%).



The main sources of energy for cooking used by private households in Kamonyi District vary by area of residence. In Rural areas, private households use mostly firewood (92.2%) and charcoal (5.2%). In urban areas, private households use most firewood (55.9%) and charcoal (35.8%).

4.3.4.1 Main source of drink water

The results of 5RPHC 2022 reveal that improved water sources is the most water sources in Rwanda that represent (82.3%). In Kamonyi District, 85.6% of private households use improved water sources. At the sector level, the percentage of the private households using water from improved sources is highest in Runda (91.6%), and the lowest in Nyarubaka (80.4%).





Figure 4. 9 Percentage of the private households of Kamonyi District by main source of water and by sector

4.3.4.2 Main type of toilet facility


The results of census reveal that the main types of toilet facility used by the private households in Rwanda are not shared Pit Latrine with constructed floor slab (68.8%), in Kamonyi District main types of toilet facility used by the private households are shared Pit Latrine with constructed floor slab (74.2%), private or not shared pit latrine with constructed floor slab (16.1%) and Pit Latrine without constructed floor slab used by one HH (5.8%). At the sector level, the percentage of households using private or not shared pit latrines with constructed floor slab is high in Kayenzi (89.4%) and Karama (88.3%) while it is low in Runda (52.6%) and Rugarika (70.5%). Flush toilets are mainly not shared and the high percentages of households using this type are found in Runda (11.3%) and Gacurabwenge (1.2%). For shared pit latrines with constructed floor slab, Runda (28.8%) and Rugarika (21%) are the sectors with the high percentage of private households using this kind of toilet. the lowest percentage is found in Karama (6.6%). The table below indicates the types of toilets facilities. Pit Latrine without constructed floor slab used by one HH.

According to the area of residence in Kamonyi District, the type of toilet facility used by the private households varies according to the area of residence in Kamonyi District. In urban areas, the types of toilets most used are shared pit latrine with constructed floor slab (62.5%) and Pit Latrine with constructed floor slab used by several HHs (24.8%). 4.3.4.3 Mode of waste disposal in Kamonyi District

The results of the census reveal that, In Kamonyi District, the high percentage of households (45.8%) evacuate their waste through the Thrown in the household's fields or bushes while 45.6% of private households evacuate their waste in Household compost dumping and 4.7% in the Public compost dumping. At the Sector level, the high percentages of households evacuating their waste through the thrown in the household's fields bushes are in Kayumbu (59.5%), Rugarika (52.7%), and Nyamiyaga (52.1%). The household compost dumping as main mode of waste disposal is the most used Rukoma (61.9%), Mugina(55.2%) and Nyarubaka (50.0%).

The high percentages of households using public Compost dumping are in Gacurabwenge (9.1%) Rugarika, and Runda (6.1% each).



The results of the census indicate the main modes of waste disposal used by the households. modes of waste disposal used vary by area of residence, in urban areas, thrown in the household's fields or bushes is mainly collected (42.5%). 4.4 Assets possessed by private households

4.4.1 Communication assets possessed by private households in Kamonyi District

At the district level, 83.2% of private households possess a radio, 79.6% a mobile phone, 19.4% a smartphone, 12.9% a TV and 3.6% a computer. The percentage of private households possessing a radio is high in Runda (90.9%), Gacurabwenge(86.9%), Kimironko and Karama (85.9%). It is low in Mugina (73.9%) and Nyamiyaga(77.7%). The percentage of private households possessing a television is high in Runda (31.5%) and Gacurabwenge 16.3%) while it is low in Ngamba (4,4%) and Kayumbu (4.9%). Mobile phone is mostly possessed by private households of Runda (88.8%), Gacurabwenge (83,9%), and Rugarika(80.9%). The sectors with high percentage of households with smartphone are Runda (42.4%), Gacurabwenge (25.4%) and Rugarika (22.5%) while the percentage of households possessing this asset is low in Nyamiyaga (9.4%) and Ngamba (8.0%). The computer is mostly possessed in Runda (13.0%) and low in Nyamiyaga and Nyarubaka (0.6% each). The table below provides details:

4.4.2 Access to the Internet

The results of the 5th RPHC-2022 indicate that the percentages of households with at least one member using internet are 22.2% at national level while they are 15.7% in Southern Province and 20.3% in Kamonyi district. At sector level, the high percentage of households with at least one member using internet is high in Runda (43.7%), Gacurabwenge (26.5%) and Rugarika (22.0%). The sectors with the lower percentages of households with at least one member using internet are Nyarubaka (9.5%) and Ngamba (9.6%).



CHAPTER 5: AGRICULTURE IN KAMONYI DISTRICT

The agriculture was the one of the areas of investigation of the 5th Rwanda Population and housing census conducted in 2022. The households engaged in Livestock husbandry; the number of private crop farming households cultivating different types of crops, by Sector, the number of private households raising different types of livestock, by Sector and type of household raised in district were captured in the census.

5.1 The households engaged in crop farming and livestock husbandly

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 revealed that Nationally, 2,280,854 of private households (68.9%) are engaged in agriculture, among them 62.6% are engaged in crop farming and 50.4% are engaged Livestock husbandry In Kamonyi District, Agricultural households occupy (74.3%) with 68.1% of households engaged in crop farming and 56.5% Households engaged in Livestock husbandry. Kamonyi district has sectors located in urban areas where the agriculture activities are applied, the sectors have a high proportion of Households engaged in agriculture are Kayumbu(91.4%)and karama(90.8%) and in crop farming Kayumbu (87.9%) and Karama(86,2%) and Households engaged in Livestock husbandry Kayumbu (79.1%)and Kayenze (78.6%). 5.2 Distribution of private household engaged in crop farming of different types of crops, by Sector

The results of 5th Population and housing census 2022 indicate that the most cultivated crops by the private households of Kamonyi District are fruits, maize, cassava, beans, soybean, sweet potato, banana, and vegetables. Those households that apply agriculture activities are found in in the all sectors of District Kamonyi except in Runda where we found the small areas of urban.

5.3 Distribution of private households engaged in raising different types of livestock, by Sector

Nationally and in the Southern Province, the results of the census indicate that most private households are considerably more engaged in raising cows, goats, and chicken than other livestock. It is in the same extent in Kamonyi District. The sectors that have high proportion of private households that are engaged in livestock are: Musambira, Nyamiyaga,Rukoma ,Rugarika and Mugina sectors.
