CONSUMER PRICE INDEX (CPI) June 2013

The National Institute of Statistics of Rwanda is very pleased to deliver to users the Consumer Price Index (February 2009=100). The All Urban CPI is regarded as the headline index, producing the official inflation rate.

The CPI is published every month by the 10th

All Urban Index:

In June 2013 the All Urban general index is established at 121.2 this stands for a decrease of 0.03% over the previous month which was 121.3. In annual change it increased by 3.68% compared to 2.98% in the previous month. This gives a general inflation rate by an annual average of 4.6% during the month of June 2013.

The underlying inflation rate (excluding fresh food and energy) decreased by 0.22% if compared to the previous month and increased by 3.39% on annual change. The annual average underlying inflation rate is + 3.5 %(3.51%) in June 2013 down from the previous month 3.5 %(3.53%).

All Rural Index:

In June 2013 the All Rural general index is established at 123.6 this stands for a decrease of 0.63 % over the previous month which was 124.4. In annual change it increased by 4.61% compared to 4.85% in the previous month.

All Rwanda Index:

In June 2013 the All Rwanda general index is established at 122.8 this stands for a decrease of 0.43% over the previous month which was 123.3. In annual change it increased by 4.29% compared to 4.21% in the previous month.

In June 2013 the All Urban general index is established at 121.2 this stands for a decrease of 0.03% over the previous month which was 121.3. In annual change it increased by 3.68% compared to 2.98% in the previous month. This gives a general inflation rate by an annual average of 4.6% during the month of June 2013.


The underlying inflation rate (excluding fresh food and energy) decreased by 0.22% if compared to the previous month and increased by 3.39% on annual change. The annual average underlying inflation rate is + 3.5 %(3.51%) in June 2013 down from the previous month 3.5 %(3.53%).


The decrease in the consumer price index of 0.03 is attributable primarily to the decrease in Housing, water, electricity, gas and other fuels (2.05) and Transport (0.29).

In annual change, the increase in the general index of 3.68 is mainly due to the rising prices of Food and non alcoholic beverages (4.41) and Education (35.18) which contributed +1.66 and + 1.29 respectively.

The 'local goods' increased by 4.12 on annual change with a monthly change of 0.10, while prices of the imported products increased by 1.89 on annual change with a monthly change of -0.53.

The prices of the fresh products had a positive annual change of 6.30 between June 2013 and June 2012.






Evolution (over 12 months) of the rate of inflation (%) (1)

METHODOLOGICAL NOTICE

The Consumer Price Index (CPI) is a measure of the average change over time of goods and services purchased by households. The CPI uses a Modified Laspeyres formula to calculate the index. The reference population for the CPI consists of all households, urban and rural, living in Rwanda.

The household basket includes 1,136 products observed in many places spread all over the administrative centers of all provinces in Rwanda. All kinds of places of observation are selected: shops, markets, services etc. More than 29,200 prices are collected every month by enumerators of the National Institute of Statistics of Rwanda and of the National Bank of Rwanda.

The index reference, or base, for the CPI is February 2009.

The weights used for the index are the result of the Household Living Conditions Survey (EICV II) conducted in 2005-2006 with a sample of 6,900 households.

How to Interpret the CPI

Movements of the indexes from one month to another usually are expressed as percent changes rather than changes in index points. The level of the index (relative to its base period) affects index point changes, but it does not affect percent changes. The following example illustrates how to calculate percent changes:

Index point change

CPI 178
Less CPI for previous period 176
Equals index point change 2

Percent change

Index point difference2Divided by the previous index176Equals0.011Results multiplied by 1000.011 x 100Equals percent change1.1

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
