

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


Figure 1: Administrative map of Gasabo district



- The 4th Rwanda Population and Housing Census (PHC4) has enumerated 1,132,686 residents in Kigali city, which represents 10.8% of the total population of Rwanda (10,515,973 residents).
- The population of Kigali city is predominantly male; 586,123 are men corresponding to 51.7% of the total population of the City.
- Gasabo is the mostly populated District with 529,561 residents in 2012. Its population represents 46.8% of the total residents' population of Kigali city.
- The least populated District in Kigali is Nyarugenge with 284,561 inhabitants, corresponding to 25.1% of the total resident population of Kigali city.
- The district with a high population density is Nyarugenge with 2,124 (Inhabitants per km²).
- The district with a lowest population density is Gasabo with 1,234 (Inhabitants per km²).

- The 4th Rwanda Population and Housing Census (PHC4) has enumerated **529,561** residents in Gasabo district, which represent 46.8% of the total population of the Kigali city (**1,132,686** residents).
- The population of Gasabo district is predominantly male: **274,546** are men corresponding to 51.7% of the total population Gasabo district.
- Females are predominant in six out of 15 sectors of the district (Rutunga with 52.6%, Nduba and Jali with 51.6% each, Gikomero with 51.4%, Jabana with 50.2% and Rusororo with 50.2%).
- Kinyinya and Kimironko are the most populated sectors with more than 57 thousands residents each. They represent 10.9% and 10.8% of the total population of District, respectively.
- The two less populated sectors are Gikomero (16,625 inhabitants) and Rutunga (17,906 inhabitants). They represent 3.1% and 3.4% of the total resident population of Gasabo district, respectively.

- Gasabo district population is predominantly urban: 69% of the resident population lives in urban areas vs. 31% in rural areas.
- Gatsata, Kacyiru, Kimihurura, Kimironko and Remera are entirely urban sectors of Gasabo district while Rutunga, Nduba, and Gikomero are entirely rural.

- Gasabo population is mostly young. 57.6 2% of the resident population of Gasabo is under 25 years, as shown by the age pyramid (Figure 4), reflecting the high level of fertility in the recent past.
- The elderly (60 years and above) represent 2.2% of the total population of the District. The distribution of the resident population by age and by sector is in the annex.

Figure 4: Age pyramid of the resident population of Gasabo district in 2012



- Some age groups are targets of specific interventions. For instance children under five year for immunization programs, children in primary school age (7-12 years), people in the official working age group (16-64 years), etc.
- Knowing the size of such groups is of great importance for the design, implementation, monitoring and evaluation of programs targeting such groups. The above table gives the size of the main interventions target groups by sex, and their share in the entire population of Gasabo district.
- The population aged 0-17 represents 40.0 % of the total population of the district. The economically active population aged 16 and 64 years represents 61.9% of the same population.

- Christianity is the predominant religion in Gasabo district. 43.5% are Protestant, 38.6% are Catholics, 8.5% are Adventist and 1.1% are Jehovah Witnesses.
- Muslims represent 2.5% of the resident population, 2.8% of the resident population declared to be without religion.

- 43.5% of the resident population of Gasabo district aged 12 and above were married at the time of the census, while 50.5% were never married. 4.0% were widowed, while separated and divorced were respectively 0.5% and 1.5%.
- At the sector level,
 - ➤ Two sectors, Bumbogo (53.5%) and Gikomero (52.3%) have the highest percentages of the currently married people.
 - ➤ Kacyiru (63.1%) and Kimihurura (60.1) have the highest percentages of the never married persons.
 - ➤ Nduba and Jali sectors have high percentage of widowed persons (6.8% and 6.3% respectively).

The percentages of resident population of Gasabo district by marital status vary by sex and age:

- The percentage of never married persons decreases from 99.2% (age group of 12-14 years) to 7.9% (age group of 85 years and above).
- The percentage of persons currently married starts by increasing from 0.7% (age group of 12-14 years) to a maximum of 78.3% (age group of 40-44 years) before decreasing to 31.4% (age group 85+) due mainly to widowhood.
- The highest percentage of divorced persons (3.6%) is observed from age group 45-49, while the highest percentage of the separated persons (0.9%) is found in age group 35-39 years.

School attendance among children varies across education levels:

- It is low (38.4%) for the preschool-age population (3-6 years), widespread (92.9%) for the primary school-age population (7-12 years), and moderate (69.4%) for the secondary school-age population (13-18 years) at the time of the census.
- School attendance varies also across the sectors:
 - For the preschool-age, school attendance is highest in Kimironko (59.7%) and lowest in Gikomero (21.1%).
 - For the primary school-age, school attendance is highest in Kacyiru (96.7%) and lowest in Gikomero (88.3%).
 - For the secondary school, school attendance is highest in Kimihurura (77.1%) and lowest in Gisozi (61.7%).

Table 11 reveals that not all children attending primary school level are of the official age for that level (7-12 years).

- The gross attendance rates are greater than 120% in all sectors, with minor variations except in Rutunga (117.3%). The net attendance rate (NAR) in Primary school for Gasabo district (87.5%) is below the NAR at Provincial and National level (89.2% and 88.2%, respectively).
- The highest net attendance rate in primary school (91.6%) is in Kimironko sector followed by Kacyiru sector with 91.1% while the sector with the lowest NAR is Rutunga with 79.9%.

- At the national level, the net school attendance rate (22.0%) at secondary level is less than the rate at Gasabo district level (35.2%). Gross attendance rate in Gasabo district is more than 50% while the net attendance rate is less than 50%. This means that a big proportion of Gasabo children who are supposed to attend secondary school are not actually attending that level especially during their official school age.
- Gross attendance rate for females (59.7%) is more than the one for males (62.1%) while NAR for female (35.4%) is more than NAR for males (34.9%) in Gasabo district.
- At the sector level, the highest net attendance rate is in Kimironko (52.4%) and the lowest is in Gikomero (14.4%).

- Among the population aged 3 years and above in Gasabo district, 15.8% of them has no education, 50.0% attained the primary level, 19.8% attained secondary level, and 1.2% attained university level.
- The level of educational attainment varies across sectors. Kacyiru has the highest percentage of secondary level attainment (30.9%) while Kimironko has it for the university level (17.6%).

- The official working age in Rwanda is 16 years and above
- The label force participation varies slightly by district in Kigali city: from 67.4 in Nyarugenge to 70.1 in Gasabo district.
- 70.1% of residents aged 16 and above in Gasabo district is in the labor market, either working or looking for a job (economically active).
- Labor force participation rate is higher among males than females in both urban (79.0% and 59.5%) and rural areas (75.8% and 65.4%).




Figure 5:Labour-force participation rate (LFPR) among the resident population aged 16 years and above in the private households by age group and sex

Figure 5 allows the study of the calendar and intensity of labor force participation and its variation by sex .The figure reveals the following remarks:

- Early entry and late exit to the labor market in Gasabo district were around 40% at age 16 (the official age for entry into the labor market) and above 50% at 60 years (official age of retirement).
- Labor force participation is intense between ages 25 and 60 with more than 70% of the male and female population in labor market.
- Important gender disparities are remarkable in labor force participation at all age proups; males contribute more than females to labor force.

- In Kigali city, variation of unemployment rate is not important by district: from 8.4% in Gasabo to 10.7% in Kicukiro.

Figure 6: Employment among children aged 5 years and above in Gasabo district by age group and by sex






Figure 9: Distribution (%) of the private households of Gasabo district by main material of the roof of the housing unit and by area of residence









Figure 13: Distribution (%) of the private households of Gasabo district by improved and unimproved source of water and by Sector






Figure 14: Distribution (%) of the private households of Gasabo district by main source of water and by area of residence




Figure 15: Distribution (%) of the private households of Gasabo district by main type of toilet facility and by area of residence

- In Gasabo district the main modes of waste disposal used by private households are private dust bin (37.1%), compost dumping (27.7%), farms (19.1%).
- Private dust bin are most used in Kacyiru (82.5%), Remera (75.1%), Kimihurura and Kimironko (61.1% each).
- At the Sector level, the high percentages of households using compost dumping are in Rutunga (71.0%) and Gikomero (62.5%)
- Sectors with high percentages of households disposing their waste on the farms are Jabana (38.5%), Jali (37.5%) and Nduba (36.0%).
- Sectors with high percentage of private households that discharge domestic waste in the bush are Kinyinya (11.3%) and Rusororo (10.2%).




Figure 16: Distribution (%) of the private households of Gasabo district by mode of waste disposal and by area of residence

The main modes of waste disposal used by the households vary by area of residence in Gasabo district.

- Urban households evacuate their domestic waste mainly in the private dust bins (51.4%), by compost dumping (16.9%) and in the farms (12.5%).
- In rural areas, the households evacuate their waste mainly by compost dumping (53.3%), on the farms (34.6%) and in the bush (6.4%).

- At the district level, 82.0% of private households possess a mobile phone, 72.3% a radio, and31.8% a TV.
- The percentage of private households possessing a radio is high in Kimironko (77.5%), Kacyiru (76.5%) and Gatsata (75.1%). It is low in Ndera (68.5%).
