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


Figure 1: Administrative map of Ruhango district





- The 4th Rwanda Population and Housing Census (PHC4) has enumerated 2,589,975 residents in the Southern Province represent 24.6% of the total population of Rwanda (10,515,973 residents).
- The population of the Southern Province is predominantly female: 1,356,221 are women corresponding to 52.4% of the total population of the province.
- The census enumerated 319,885 inhabitant residents in Ruhango district that represents 12.4% of the
- Nyamagabe and Kamonyi are the most populated Districts with more than 340 thousand residents each. Their populations represent 13.2% and 13.1% respectively of the total resident population of the southern Province.
- The least populated District is Nyaruguru with about 294 thousand residents corresponding to 11.4% of the total resident population of the Southern Province.
- Three districts with a high population density (Inhabitants/km²) are Huye, (565 inhabitants per Sq.km), Kamonyi (519 inhabitants/km²) and Ruhango (510 inhabitants/km²).
- The two districts with a low population density (Inhabitants per Sq.km) are Nyaruguru (291 inhabitants/km²), Nyamagabe (313 inhabitants/km²)

- The 4th Rwanda Population and Housing Census (PHC) has enumerated 403,662 residents in Ruhango district, which represent 16.3% of the total population of the Southern Province (2,471,239 residents).
- The population of Ruhango district is predominantly female: 167,810 are women corresponding to 52.4% of the total population.
- Females are predominant in almost all sectors of the district, with above 50% females of their total population.
- Ruhango, Kinazi and Mbuye are the most populated sectors with over 40 thousands residents each. They represent 20.5%, 13.6% and 12.8% of the total population of Ruhango district, respectively.
- Ruhango, Byimana and Mbuye are sectors with high population density (695, 551 and 531 inhabitants/km²).

The less populated sectors are Kabagali and Kinihira (396 and 414 inhabitants/km²). They represent 7.5% and 7.8% of the total resident population of Ruhango district.




Figure 3: Population Density of Ruhango district by Sector in 2012

- Ruhango district population is predominantly rural with 91.9% of its population (319,885 inhabitants) living in rural areas.
- Ruhango is the most urbanized sector in the district with 26% of its population residing in urban areas. Five of nine in Ruhango district are entirely rural.




Figure 4: Age pyramid of the resident population of Ruhango district in 2012

- The Ruhango population is mostly young. 62% of its resident population is under 25 years old, as shown by the age pyramid (Figure 4), reflecting the high level of fertility in the recent past.
- The elderly (60 years and above) represent 4.4% of the total population of the district. The distribution of the resident population by age and by sector is in the annex.

- Some age groups are targets of specific interventions. For instance children under five years for immunization programs, children in primary school age (7-12 years), people in the office working age group (16-64 years), etc.
- Knowing the size of such groups is of great importance for the design, implementation, monitoring and evaluation of programs targeting such groups. The above table gives the size of the main interventions target groups by sex, and their share in the entire population of Ruhango district.
- The population aged 0-17 years represents 47.1% of the total population of the district. The economically active population (aged 16 and 64 years) represents 53.2% of the total population of Ruhango district.

 - > Bweramana sector has a high percentage of the never married persons (47.3%),
 - The high percentage of widowed persons has been found in Kabagali, Byimana and Ntongwe sectors (above 7% each),

The percentages of resident population of Ruhango district by marital status vary by sex and age:

- The percentage of never married persons decreses from 99% (age group of 12-14 years) to 3% (age group of 85 years and above).
- The percentage of persons currently married starts by increasing from 0.4%(age group of 12-14 years) to a maximum of 81.3%(age group of 35-39 years) before decreasing down to 37.5% due mainly to widowhood.45.3% in Ruhango district and varies across age groups. The highest one is in 35-39 years.
- The percentage of divorced persons never reaches 4%, while the percentage of the separated persons is below 1.5% among all age groups.

School attendance among children varies across education levels:

- It is very low (26%) for the pre-school-age (population aged 3-6 years), very high (93%) for the primary school-age (population aged 7-12 years), and high (78%) for the secondary school-age (population aged 13-18 years) at the time of the census.
- School attendance varies also across the sectors:





- The official working age in Rwanda is 16 years and above.
- The labour force participation varies greatly by district in Southern province: from 61.2% in Ruhango district to 79.4% in Kamonyi district.
- 61.2% of resident aged 16 years and above in Ruhango district are in the labour market, either working or looking for a job (economically active).
- Labour force participation is more intense among males (63.9%) than among females(59.1%) and in urban areas(64.7) than in rural areas(61%)





- Early entry and late exit to the labour market in Ruhango district.
- As shown by the graph, the labour force participation rate were above 30% at age 16(the official entry age in the labour market) and after age 65 (official age of retirement)
- Intense labour force participation is observed between 30 and 64 years where more than 70% are in the labour market for both sexes.
- Some gender disparities in the labour force participation: Between 16 and 19 years females and males contribute almost the same to the labour force while from age 25 females contribution becomes less than male's one.

- Between 15-17 years,21.2% children were employed during seven days preceding the census at the national level. This percentage was 16.3% in Ruhango district.




Figure 6: Employment among children aged 5-17 years in Ruhango district by age group and sex




Figure 7: Distribution (%) of the private households of Ruhango district by type of habitat and by Area of residence






Figure 9: Distribution (%) of private households of Ruhango district by main material of the roof and of the housing unit and by area of residence




Figure 10: Distribution (%) of private households of Ruhango district by main material of the walls of the housing unit and by area of residence








Figure 12: Distribution (%) of private households of Ruhango district by main source of energy for cooking and by area of residence








Figure 14: Distribution (%) of private households of Ruhango district by main source of water and by area of residence




Figure 15: Distribution (%) of the private households of Ruhango district by main type of toilet facility and by area of residence




Figure 16: Distribution (%) of private households of Ruhango district by mode of waste disposal and by area of residence




Figure 17: Percentage of private households who's at least one member have access to the Internet by area of residence
