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SUMMARY

In the second quarter of 2023, Rwanda's total trade was US\$ 2,197.02 million, an increase of 24.34 percent over the second quarter of 2022. Domestic exports were US\$ 484.64 million; imports were US\$ 1,548.80 million and re-exports were US\$ 164.23 million.

In this quarter, total domestic exports increased by 46.17 percent when compared to the second quarter of 2022 (US\$ 484.64 million and US\$ 331.55 million respectively) and increased by 14.33 percent when compared to the first quarter of 2023. Total imports of Rwanda increased by 23.14 percent in the second quarter of 2023 when compared to the same quarter of 2022 (US\$ 1,548.80 million and US\$ 1,257.72 million respectively) and by 5.58 percent over the first quarter of 2023. Re-exports, decreased by 7.86 percent in the second quarter of 2023 over the same quarter of 2022 (US\$ 164.23 million and US\$ 178.23 million respectively) and increased by 5.12 percent compared to the first quarter of 2023.

The top five export destinations were the United Arab Emirates, the Democratic Republic of Congo, China, Hong Kong and Uganda. The commodity groups with the largest export values were, "Other commodities & transactions, n.e.s" (US\$ 302.69 million), "Food and live animals" (US\$ 74.26 million) and "Crude materials, inedible, except fuels" (US\$ 58.86 million).

In terms of re-exports, the top five destinations were the Democratic Republic of Congo, United Arab Emirates, Burundi, Ethiopia and Uganda. Democratic Republic of Congo accounted for 93.14 percent of Rwanda's total re-exports. The most re-exported commodity group were "Food and live animals" (US\$ 54.88 million) followed by "Mineral fuels, lubricants and related materials" (US\$ 32.37 million).

In terms of total imports (CIF); China, Tanzania, India, Cameroon and Kenya were the top five countries of origin of imports to Rwanda.

INTRODUCTION

This Statistical Report on Formal External Trade in Goods covers the second quarter of 2023, the period running from April to June. It is the product of the National Institute of Statistics of Rwanda (NISR) through the Department of Economic Statistics (DES) under the External Trade Statistics Team.

One of the key mandates of the DES is to compile, analyze and produce statistics and information on external trade sector following international recommendations. This report is compiled by NISR from the data collected by the Rwanda Revenue Authority (RRA), the Customs Department, in its routine activities of management, monitoring and facilitating cross border trade. They are processed using EUROTRACE and MS Access database management systems (DBMS).

To collect and compile formal external trade statistics, NISR relies on the General Trade System under which the recorded aggregates include all goods entering or leaving the country's economic territory except for simple transit trade.

Imports include goods brought in directly for domestic consumption plus goods imported into customs bonded warehouses.

Exports cover domestic exports defined as goods of national origin; that is, goods produced in the exporting country and the nationalized goods.

Re-exports which are exported in the same conditions as imported or after undergoing minor operations which leave them essentially unchanged and include re-exports from customs bonded warehouses.

Partner country is the last known country of destination for exports and the country of origin for imports by the time of compilation.

Valuation of imports and exports: Imports are valued on a CIF (Cost, Insurance and Freight) basis while exports and re-exports are valued on a FoB (Free on Board) basis.

Classification of commodities: Data are categorized by partner country and the international standard classifications such as the Harmonized Commodity Description and Coding System (HS) and the Standard International Trade Classification (SITC), all linked to the national Customs Procedure Codes (CPCs).

Furthermore, the compilation of External Trade Statistics abides by the recommendations of the *International Merchandise Trade Statistics: Concepts and Definitions 2010* (IMTS 2010) of the United Nations Statistics Division (UNSD). Hence, the data for this report are compiled on **IMTS 2010** basis (not to be confused with data compiled on **Balance of Payments** or **National Accounts** basis)

1. Rwanda's Formal External Trade in Goods

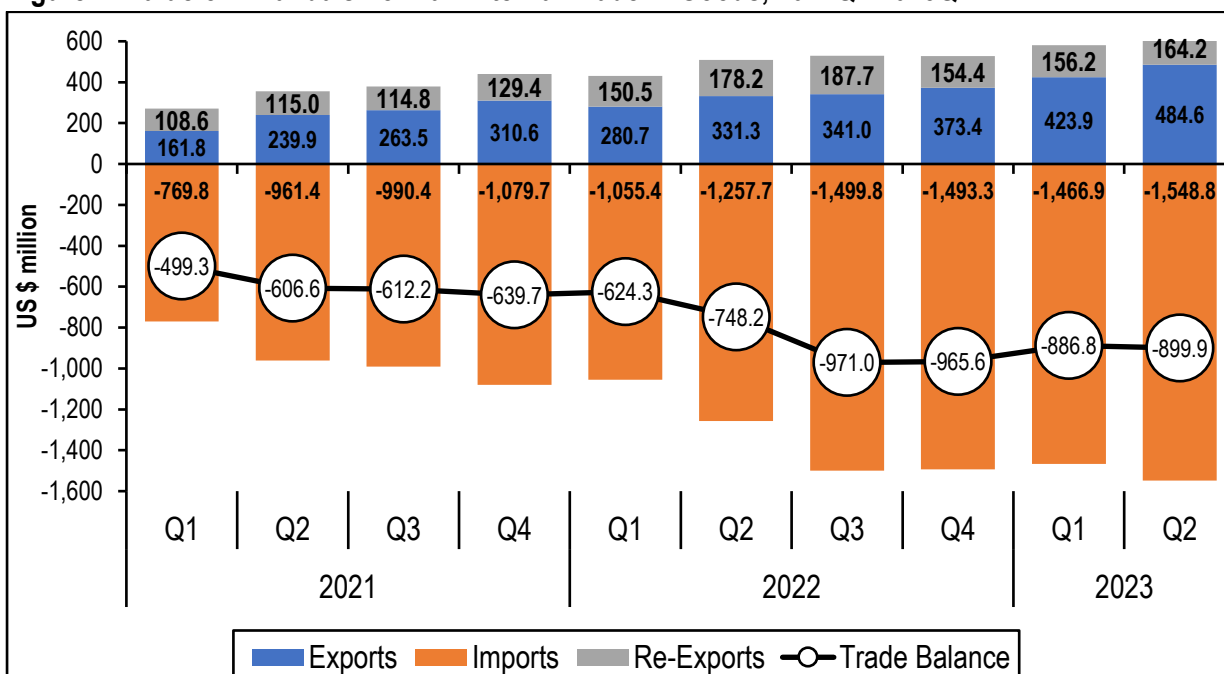
This section provides an overview of Rwanda's total trade in goods covering the period from first quarter of 2021 to the second quarter of 2023.

In the second quarter of 2023, Rwanda's total trade was US\$ 2197.67 million, an increase of 7 percent over the first quarter of 2023 and an increase of 24 percent over the same quarter of 2022 (US\$ 1767.50 million in second quarter of 2022).

Figure 1 below summarizes the balance of Rwanda's formal trade in goods. Year on year, the deficit on traded in goods increased by 20 percent, from the same period in 2022.

Imports of goods constitute 70 percent of total trade in goods, while domestic exports constituted 20 percent and re-exports constituted 7 percent. For more detailed figures, see Appendix 6.1.

2. Domestic Exports

2.1. Overview

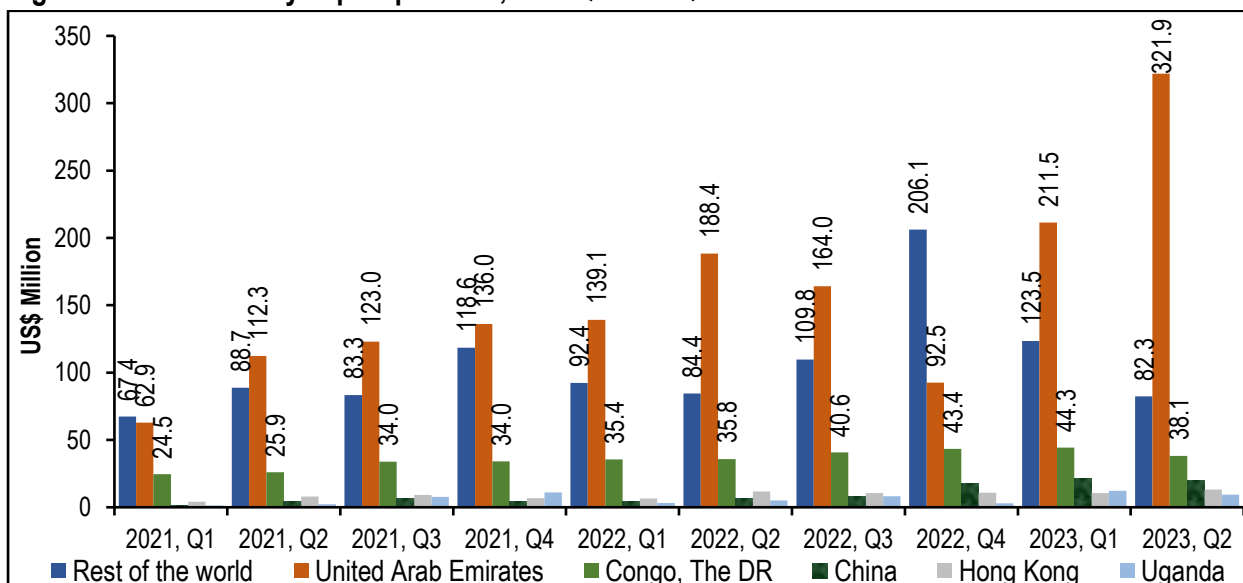
Compared to the first quarter of 2023, the second quarter of 2023 registered an increase in values of 14.33 percent, with total domestic exports amounting to US\$ 484.64 million. Year-over-year, domestic exports' values increased by 46.17 percent compared to the same quarter of 2022 (see Figure 1).

2.2. Rwanda's Export Markets

2.2.1. Trade Partners

Rwanda's key destination markets of exports during the second quarter of 2023 were the United Arab Emirates (US\$ 321.94 million, 66.43 percent share), the Democratic Republic of Congo (US\$ 38.12 million, 7.87 percent share), China (US\$ 19.76 million, 4.08 percent share), Hong Kong (US\$ 13.7 million, 2.72 percent share) and Uganda (US\$ 9.34 million, 1.93 percent share). These five countries accounted for US\$ 402.32 million value of exports, representing 83.01 percent share of total value of domestic exports. Figure 2 summarizes these figures from quarter one of 2020 up to the second quarter of 2023. For the top twenty domestic exports' partners see appendix 6.5a.

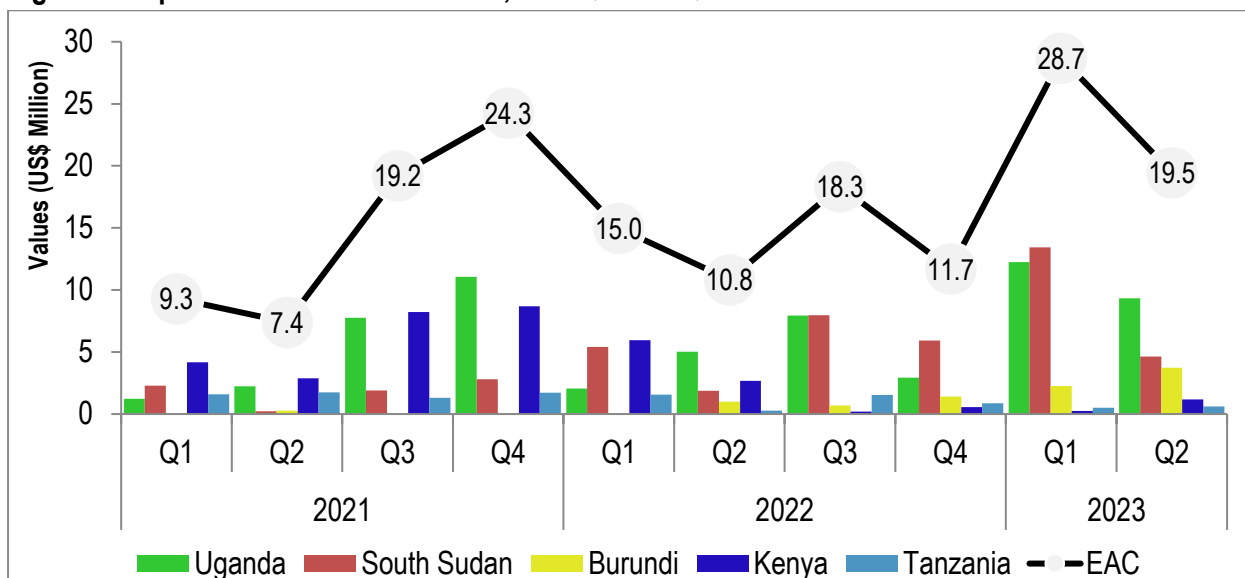
2.2.2. East African Community Partner States

In the second quarter of 2023, Rwanda's domestic exports to the East African Community Partner States was estimated at US\$ 19.48 million, around 1 percent of total trade value (see appendix 6.8b). Of these, about 23.80 percent were destined to Uganda (US\$ 9.34 million).

Domestic exports' values to EAC Partner States increased by 79.8 percent when compared to the same quarter of 2022.

In terms of exports to EAC partner states, South Sudan stood at the second place with domestic exports from Rwanda valued at US\$ 4.64 million.

3. Imports

3.1. Overview

In the second quarter of 2023, the total value of imports was US\$ 1548.80 million; an increase of 6 percent when compared to the first quarter of 2023 (US\$ 1466.90 million) and an increase of 23 percent when compared to the second quarter of 2022 (US\$ 1257.72 million) (see Figure 1 above and appendix 6.1).

In this quarter of 2023, the top five most imported commodities in terms of USD values ranked from top to bottom were “Other commodities & transactions, n.e.s”, “Machinery and transport equipment”, “Food and live animals”, “Manufactured goods classified chiefly by material” and “Mineral fuels, lubricants and related materials”, while the top five countries of origin are China, Tanzania, India, Cameroon, and Kenya.

3.2. Origin of the imports of Rwanda

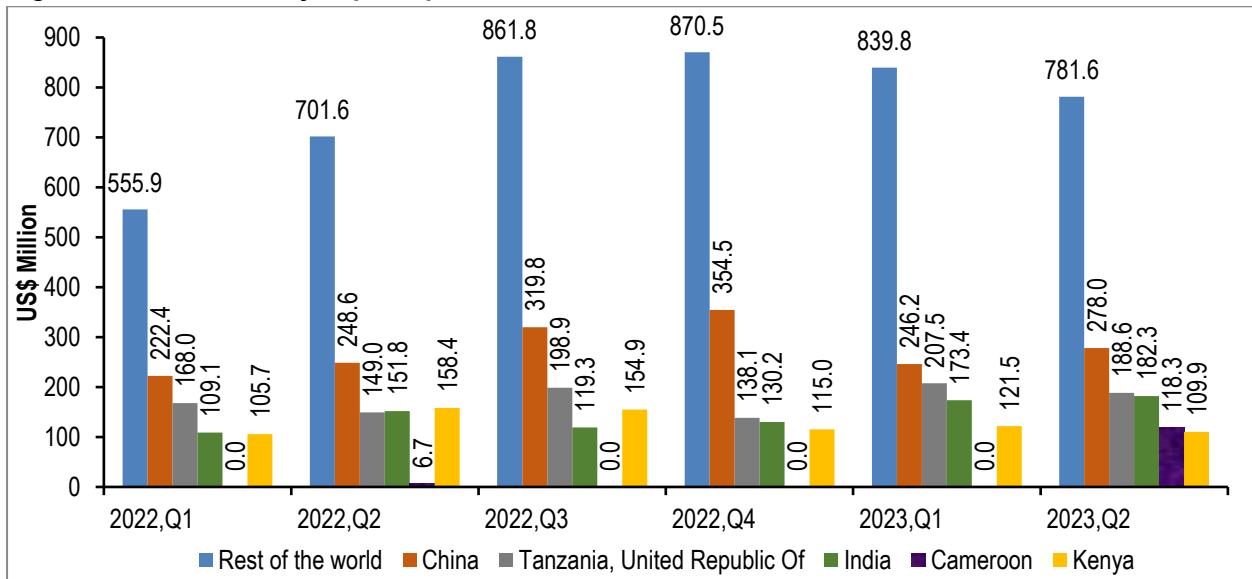
3.2.1 Trade Partners

The top five countries of origin of imports totalized US\$ 877.17 million of imports representing 56.64 % of the total value of imports, and they are distributed as follows: China (US\$ 278.04 million), Tanzania (US\$ 188.58 million), India (US\$ 182.27 million), Cameroon (US\$ 118.34 million) and Kenya (US\$ 109.94 million).

In terms of commodity groups, the top imported products were “Other commodities & transactions, n.e.s” (US\$ 308.96 million), “Machinery and transport equipment” (US\$ 307.48 million), “Food and live animals” (US\$ 229.09 million), “Manufactured goods classified chiefly by material” (US\$ 206.62 million) and “Mineral fuels, lubricants and related materials” (US\$ 161.56 million).

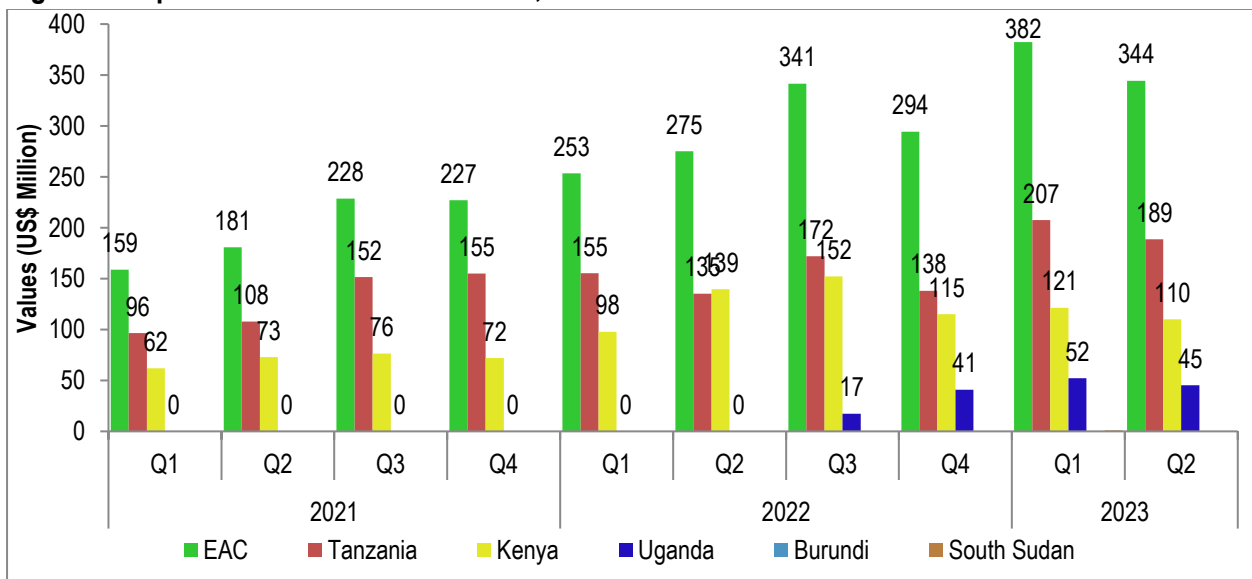
3.2.2 East African Community Partner States

In the second quarter of 2023, Rwanda's imports from EAC Partner States totaled US\$ 344.38 million; representing 22 percent of all imported commodities (see Appendix 6.8a).

In this quarter, imports from Tanzania represent 54.76 percent of total imports from EAC partner states while imports from Kenya were 31.93 percent.

In general, Rwanda's imports from EAC Partner States increased by 25 percent when compared to the same quarter of 2022 (US\$ 275.06 million in the second quarter of 2022).

3. Re-exports

3.1. Overview

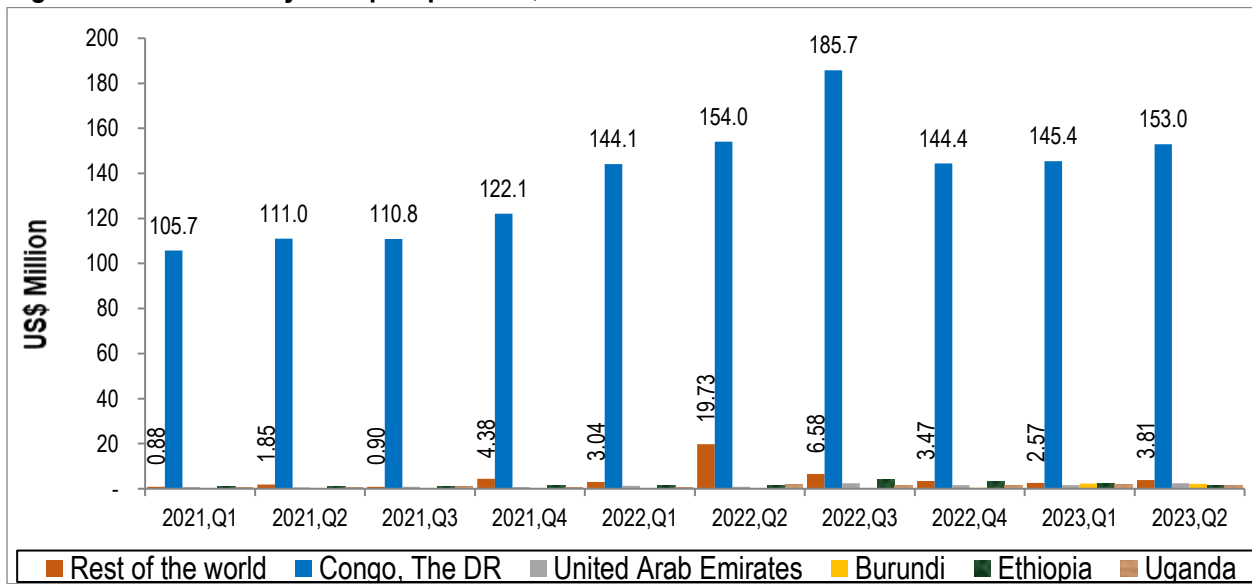
In the second quarter of 2023, Rwanda’s re-exports values were estimated at US\$ 164.23 million, a decrease of 7.86 percent over the same quarter of 2022 (US\$ 178.23 million).

The top three products re-exported by Rwanda in the second quarter of 2023, were “Food and live animals” estimated at US\$ 54.88 million, “Mineral fuels, lubricants and related materials” which amounted to US\$ 32.37 million, “Manufactured goods classified chiefly by material” estimated at US\$ 17.71 million, and they accounted for around 63.91 percent of total Rwanda’s re-export values.

3.1.1. Trade Partners

In the second quarter of 2023, out of US\$ 164.23 million of re-exports value of Rwanda, the African countries accounted for 96.7 percent. The Democratic Republic of Congo was the main destination, with re-export values of US\$ 152.97 million representing 93.14 percent of Rwanda’s total re-exports. Figure 6 below illustrates respective quarterly values per top five destinations of Rwanda’s re-exports and the rest of the world.

Figure 6: Rwanda’s key re-export partners, 2021Q1-2023Q2



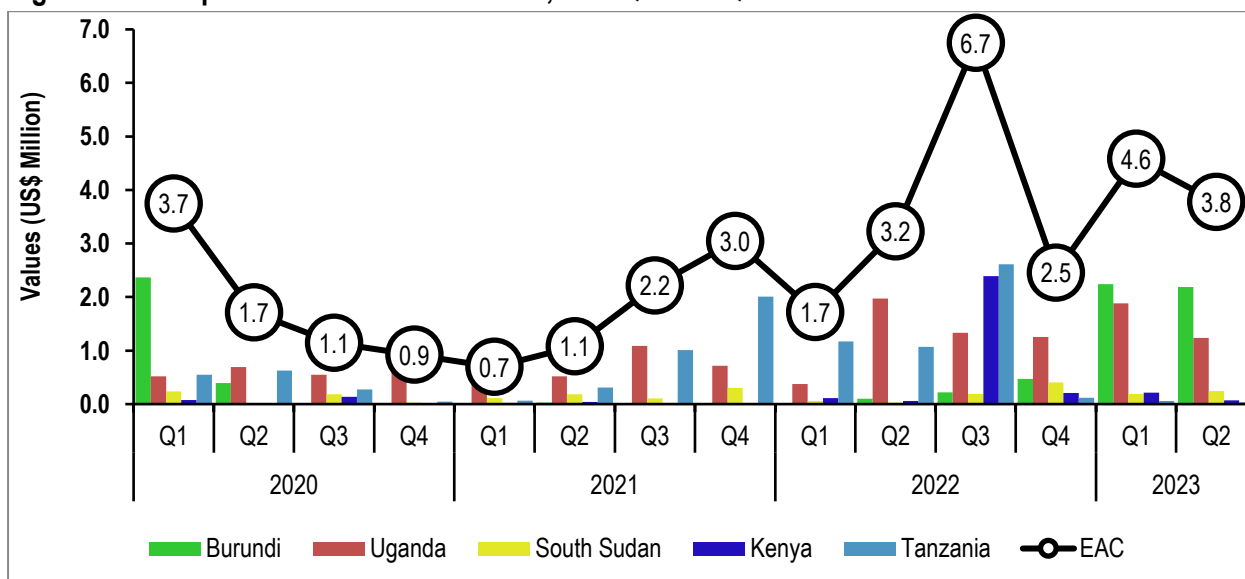

3.1.2. East African Community Partner States



Rwanda's re-exports to EAC Partner States increased by 16.9 percent in value terms during the second quarter of 2023 compared to the same quarter of 2022 (US\$ 3.23 million and 3.77 US\$ million, respectively) and decreased by 17.7 percent when compared to the first quarter of 2023 that was estimated at US\$ 4.58 million.

4. Trade with Selected Regional Economic Organizations

4.1. Common Market for Eastern and Southern Africa



In the second quarter of 2023, Rwanda's total trade with the Common Market for Eastern and Southern Africa (COMESA) member states was US\$ 412.16 million compared to US\$ 422.85 million registered in the same quarter of 2022 and US\$ 454.83 million registered in the first quarter of 2023.

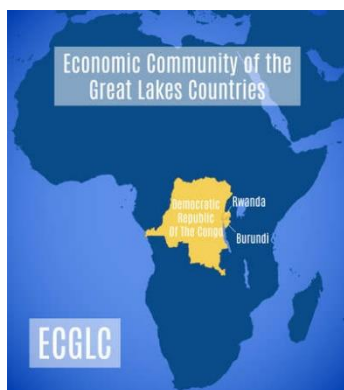
Exports to COMESA member states increased by 8 percent in 2023Q2 when compared to the same quarter of 2022 and decreased by 11 percent compared to the first quarter of 2023.

Imports from COMESA member states increased by 0.4 percent in 2023Q2 when compared to the same quarter of 2022 and decreased by 17.4 percent when compared to the first quarter of 2023.

On the re-exports side, Rwanda registered revenues estimated at US\$ 158.46 million during the second quarter of 2023 from COMESA member states; a decrease of 9.11 percent in value terms against the same quarter of 2022 and of 3.63 percent when compared to the first quarter of 2023.

Thus, a deficit in trade balance of US\$ 21.77 million has been registered during the period of 2023Q2 against a surplus of 34.12 million during the same quarter of 2022 and US\$ 17.52 million registered in the first quarter of 2023.

4.2. Communauté Economique des Pays de Grands Lacs



In the second quarter of 2023, total exports to Communauté Economique des Pays de Grands Lacs (CEPGL) Member States (Burundi and the Democratic Republic of Congo), including re-exports, totaled US\$ 197.00 million and total imports were US\$ 6.28 million. Therefore, the trade in goods surplus with CEPGL Member States was US\$ 190.72 million compared to US\$ 36.71 million registered in the same quarter of 2022 and to US\$ 46.58 million in the first quarter of 2023.

4.3. Southern African Development Community

In the second quarter of 2023, Rwanda's total trade with the Southern African Development Community (SADC) member states was US\$ 428.74 million compared to US\$ 434.14 million in the second quarter of 2022 and US\$ 480.70 million during the first quarter of 2023.



Year-on-year, domestic exports to SADC increased by 4.32 percent, from US\$ 38.17 million in the second quarter of 2022 to US\$ 39.81 million in the second quarter of 2023; total imports increased by 4.97 percent, from US\$ 224.32 million to US\$ 235.47 million. Over the same period, re-exports decreased by 10.61 percent, from US\$ 171.66 million to US\$ 153.46 million.

Therefore, the trade in goods deficit with SADC totaled US\$ 42.20 million compared to US\$ 14.49 million during the same quarter of 2022.

4.4. European Union

In the second quarter of 2023, trade in goods with the European Union (EU) was US\$ 149.32 against US\$ 104.10 million registered in the same quarter of 2022 and US\$ 162.48 million in the first quarter of 2023 (United Kingdom exited EU on 31st January 2020).

The exports to EU member countries increased by 65.87 percent when compared to the same quarter of 2022 (US\$ 11.78 million against US\$ 19.54 million). The total value of imports from EU increased by 40.79 percent during the second quarter of 2023 over the same quarter of 2022 (US\$ 91.71 million against US\$ 129.13 million).

To sum, Rwanda's trade with EU registered a trade deficit of US\$ 108.94 million in the second quarter of 2023 and of US\$ 79.32 million in the same quarter of 2022 while US\$ 95.71 million has been registered as a deficit in the first quarter of 2023.

4.5. Economic Community of West African States (ECOWAS)



In the second quarter of 2023, total exports to the Economic Community of West African States (ECOWAS), including re-exports, totaled US\$ 0.61 million and the total imports were US\$ 53.28 million. Therefore, the trade in goods deficit with ECOWAS Member States widened to US\$ 52.67 million from US\$ 16.42 million in the same quarter of 2022.
