





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FOREWORD

The Government of Rwanda, through the National Institute of Statistics of Rwanda (NISR) conducted the 2022 Rwanda Population and Housing Census to provide updated demographic, social and economic indicators for policy formulation and planning to support the national development agenda and track the implementation of national, regional, continental and global development goals, such as the First National Strategy for Transformation (NST1 2017-2024); the AU Agenda 2063; and the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

The Population and Housing Census in Rwanda dates back to the year 1978 when the first ever modern census was implemented. The second, third, and fourth censuses were carried out in 1991, 2002, and 2012 respectively. The 2022 Population and Housing Census marks therefore the Fifth in the series following the United Nations Recommendations to conduct a census every ten years.

Considering census' crucial importance for the planning process, the Government of Rwanda has made the Population and Housing Census a priority to be undertaken every 10 years and adopted the use of technologies for timely delivery of census results for use.

Results of the 2022 Population and Housing Census provide population numbers from national to the lowest administrative level, as well as demographic and socio-economic indicators at both national and district levels. The census remains the only national data collection exercise that can provide the lowest levels of disaggregation to support decentralised decision making across the country.

I would like therefore to take this opportunity to thank all stakeholders that contributed to the success of the 2022 Population and Housing Census. They include Ministries and other Government institutions, international organizations such as the World Bank (WB), the European Union (EU), the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA), One-UN, UN Women, UNICEF, UNECA, the United Kingdom AID (UKAID), the African Development Bank (AfDB), the USAID, Enabel, PARIS 21 and others for their support in diverse ways.

My special thanks go to the local government leaders from the province to the village levels who contributed a lot to the success of the 2022 Population and Housing Census. Exceptional gratitude to all enumerators, teachers and young people who collected the information and all respondents for their cooperation and dedication. The National Institute of Statistics of Rwanda (NISR) deserves special appreciation for the excellent operational and coordination of all census activities.



CHAPTER 1: POPULATION SIZE, SPATIAL DISTRIBUTION, AND STRUCTURE

1.1 Size and special Distribution of the population

1.1.1 Size and Spatial Distribution of the Population of Southern Province

The 5th Rwanda Population and Housing Census (PHC5) has enumerated 3,002,699 residents in the southern province, which represents 22.6% of the total population of Rwanda (13,246,394 residents).

The population of the Southern Province is predominantly Female; 1,554,244 are female corresponding to 51.8 % of the total population of the Southern Province. Kamonyi district is the most populated district in Southern Province with 450,849 residents in 2022. Its population represents 15.0 % of the total residents' population of Southern Province. The least populated district in the Southern Province is Nyaruguru with 318,126 inhabitants, corresponding to 10.6% of the total resident population of Southern Province.

1.1.2 Distribution of Population Density of the Southern Province by District

Population density is a measurement of population per unit land area. Density is the number of inhabitants per Km².

The Rwanda Population and Housing Census conducted in 2022 revealed that, the population density in Rwanda is 503 inhabitants per Km². The Southern Province has 547 inhabitants per Km².


The district with a high population density is Kamonyi with 683 Inhabitants per km². The district with a lowest population density is Nyaruguru with 409 Inhabitants per km².

1.1.3 Size and Spatial Distribution of the Population of the Muhanga district

The 5th Rwanda Population and Housing Census (PHC5) has enumerated 358,433 residents in Muhanga district, which represent 11.9 % of the total population of Southern Province (3,002,699 residents). The population of Muhanga district is predominantly female, 184,818 are female corresponding to 51.6 % of the total population of Muhanga district.

Females are predominant in eleven out of 12 sectors of Muhanga district.

Nyamabuye (59,961 population) and Shyogwe (50,966population) are the most populated sectors. They represent 16.7 % and 14.2 % of the total population of Muhanga district, respectively.

The two less populated sectors are Nyabinoni (16,253 inhabitants) and Rugendabari (17,366 inhabitants) They represent 4.5% and 4.8% of the total resident population of Muhanga district, respectively. The table below 1.2 indicates the number of the population of Muhanga district by sector, by sex and their shares across sectors to the total population of Muhanga district.

1.1.4 Size and Spatial Distribution of the Population of Muhanga district by residence area

The results of Rwanda Population and housing census 2022 revealed that, the total population of Rwanda are spatially distributed in rural area that represent 72.1% and urban area represent 27.9%. The Southern province is predominantly by the rural area (85.2 %), the urban area represents 14.8%.

Muhanga district population is predominantly by rural area 75.7 while urban represents 24.3%. The sectors of Muhanga district which are entirely rural are Kabacuzi, Kibangu, Kiyumba, Muhanga, Mushishiro, Nyabinoni, Nyarusange, Rongi, Rugendabari while none is entirely urban.

1.1.5 Size and Spatial Distribution of the Population of Muhanga district

Muhanga population is mostly young 55.2 % of the resident population of Muhanga is under 25 years, as shown by the age pyramid (Figure 4), reflecting the high level of fertility in the recent past years.


The elderly (60 years and above) represents 8.2% of the total population of the district. The percentage share of the population aged 0-14 represents 34.4%, the population aged 15-29 years represents 26.2%.

1.1.6 population share (%) of some specific interventions target groups in Muhanga District by sex

The Rwanda population and housing census 2022 indicate the population on specific ages-based programs, policy and strategies interventions in health, education, employment and also indicates the population categories in their respective characteristics such as children, youth and working population. For instance, children under five years for immunization programs (U5 children), children in education (3-17 years), people in the official working age group (16 years and above), etc. Knowing the size of such groups is of great importance for the design, implementation, monitoring, and evaluation of programs targeting such groups. The table below gives the size of the main interventions target groups by sex, and their share in the entire population of Muhanga district. The population aged 0-17 (Children)represents 41.3 % of the total population of the district, 16-30(Youth) years represent 25.3%; the working age population aged 16 years and above represents 63.3 % of the same population. The table below shows distribution of Muhanga districts by targeted interventions by their age.

CHAPTER 2: CHARACTERISTICS OF THE POPULATION

2.1 Socio-cultural characteristics of the population

2.1.1 Distribution (Count and %) of the resident population of Muhanga district by Nationality and by sector

The results of 5th RPHC-2022 indicate that, the Rwandan population by nationality represent 99.1% and foreigners represent 0.89%. In The southern province, foreigners represent 0.61% and in Muhanga district, the Rwandan by nationality represent 99.85% and foreigners represent 0.15% (551).

Four sectors of Muhanga districts that have the highest percentage of foreigners compared to others; those are Nyamabuye (0.50%), Shyogwe (0.38%), Cyeza (0.06%), and Muhanga (0.03%).

The table below illustrates the distribution of the population by nationality with their respective sectors of residence.

2.1.2 Religious affiliation of the resident population of Muhanga District

In Muhanga district, Christianity is the predominant religion in Muhanga district. 65.02% are catholic, 13.93% are ADEPR, 9.46% are protestant, 5.03% are Adventists and 1.92 are other Christians. 1.05% are Muslim, and Jehovah witness are 0.50%. 1.47% of the resident population declared themselves to be without religion.

2.2. Marital Status of the resident population of Muhanga district aged 12 years and above

2.2.1 Marital status by Sector

The results of 5RPHC-2022, 50.3% of the resident population of Muhanga district aged 12 and above were married¹ at the time of the census, while 43.2% were never married. 5.1% were widowed, while separated and divorced were respectively 1.2% and 0.2%.

At the sector level, three sectors, Kiyumba (55.2%), Rongi (53.9%) and Nyabinoni (53.2%) have the highest percentages of the currently married people. Nyamabuye (47.8%) and Shyogwe (45.8%) have the highest percentages of the never married persons. Kibangu(6.2%) and Nyarusange sectors has the highest percentage of widowed persons.

Details of the resident population of Muhanga district aged 12 years and above by marital status and sex is presented in the annex.

2.2.2 Marital status by Age groups and Sex [Both sexes]

The percentages of resident population of Muhanga district by marital status vary by sex and age: The percentage of never married persons decreases from 99.9% (age group of 12-14 years) to 1.1% (age group of 80 years and above).

The percentage of persons currently married starts by increasing from 0.1% (age group of 12-14 years) to a maximum of 85.3% (age group of 40-44 years) before decreasing to 46.1% (age group 85+) due mainly to widowhood (51.8%).

The highest percentage of divorced persons is observed from age group 45-59, while the highest percentage of the separated persons is found in age group 40-54 years.

2.3 Educational Characteristics of the Population

2.3.1 School attendance

School attendance among children is presented by education levels according to the official school ages: the preschool-age (3-5 years), the primary school-age (6-11 years) and the secondary school-age (12-17 years).

Pre-school attendance

The table 2.5 below shows that, in Muhanga District, 61.0% of pre-school-age population(3-5 years) are currently attending a nursery school, 39.0% children have never attended a nursery school

and none (0%) of those children have previously attended (i.e children who have already had prior exposure to pre-primary school education before the time of census but who were not attending nursery school/droped-out during census time).

Kibangu and Rugendabari have the highest proportion of children (aged between 3 to 5) currently attending a nursery school in Muhanga district (81.4% each), followed by Muhanga (70.8%). Nyarusange sector has the lowest percentage of children currently attending a nursery school, with only 48.5% enrolled. On the other hand, Nyarusange (51.5%), Cyeza (47.7%) and Mushishiro (47.0%) sectors have the highest proportion of children aged 3 to 5 who have never attended a nursery school.

Table 2.6 shows that in Muhanga District, 96.1% of children aged 6 to 11 (the official primary school-going age) are currently attending primary school, 2.9% have never attended primary school and 1.0% have previously attended primary school (which means that 3.9 of children aged 6 to 11 are out of school).

By comparing the distribution of the primary school-age population (6-11 years) across sectors in Muhanga district, comparisons reveal that there are no great disparities in primary school attendance across different sectors.

Nyarusange exhibits lower rate of children currently attending primary school (92.9%) and higher rates of children who have never attended are found in Nyarusange, Nyabinoni and Shyogwe(5.4%, 4.7% and 4.3% respectively).

On the other hand, sectors like Kibangu(98.3%), Kabacuzi and Rugendabari(97.7% each) and Kiyumba(97.6%) demonstrate higher rates of children currently attending primary school and lower rates of children who have never attended are found in Kibangu(1.4%), Rugendabari(1.6%), Kabacuzi and Muhanga(1.7% each).

In Muhanga District 22.8% of the population aged 12 to 17 have previously attended school, 76.1% are currently attending school and 1.1% have never attended secondary school.

The distribution of the secondary school-age population (12-17 years) across sectors in Muhanga district, shows that Mushishiro(79.7%) and Kibangu(79.4%) sectors have the highest percentage of the population aged 12 to 17 currently attending school.

Conversely, Muhanga and Rongi sectors have the lowest percentages of the population aged 12 to 17 currently attending school with 70.7% and 71.7% respectively. Nyarusange(1.7%) and Nyabinoni(1.6%) sectors also have the highest percentage of the population between the ages of 12 and 17 who have never attended school.

2.3.2 Gross and Net Attendance Rate (%) in Primary School of Muhanga district by Sex and Sector

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 reveal that not all children attending primary school level are of the official age for that level (6-11 years).

The gross attendance rate in Rwanda is 141.7, in the Southern is 146.6 and 147.0 in Muhanga districts.

At sector level, GAR is greater than 140 in all sectors, with minor variations except in Nyamabuye (138.9).

The net attendance rate (NAR) in Primary school for Muhanga district (96.0%) is greater than the NAR of the Southern Province (90.0%) and that of national level (89.3%).

The highest net attendance rate in primary school (98.3%) is in Kibangu sector followed by Kabacuzi and Rugendabari sectors with 97.7% each and Kiyumba (97.6%) while the sector with the lowest NAR is Nyarusange with 92.9%.

2.3.3 Gross and Net Attendance Rate (%) in Secondary School of Muhanga district by Sex and Sector

The table 2. 9 provides information on the gross and net attendance rates in the secondary school level (12-17 years) disaggregated by sex and sector in Muhanga District. The Southern Province (21.9%) has lower NARs than the national average (22.3%) while Muhanga District has higher NARs than the national level (27.9%).

Comparing males and females in Muhanga District in terms of Net Attendance Rates (NAR), the results indicate that a higher proportion of females (34.1%) in Muhanga District, within the secondary school-age range (12-17 years), are attending school compared to males (21.7%).

Female students older or younger than the official secondary school age range made up 36.2% [(GAR53.5-NAR34.1)/GAR53.5] of the female with secondary school age of Muhanga District, while for male students it made up 41.5 % [(GAR 37.1-NAR21.7)/GAR37.1]. This shows that males have a higher attendance rate in Muhanga District compared to females when considering the overall attendance rates, regardless of age or grade-level eligibility.

Among the sectors in Muhanga District, Nyamabuye and Shyogwe sectors have the highest GAR with a rate of 61.5% and 52.5% respectively, and it is for the same for both sexes. Nyabinoni has the lower GAR (28.1%) compared to other sectors.

Also, Nyamabuye has the highest NAR in Muhanga District, with a rate of 35.1% and Nyabinoni has the lowest (17.9%) compared to other sectors.

2.3.4 Highest level of school attended in Muhanga District

The results of 5RPHC-2022 indicate the total population of Rwanda aged 3 and above is 11,999,691. The highest level of education attended is categorized into several levels: Never attended School, Nursery, Primary, INGOBOKA/Vocational, Lower secondary, Upper secondary, University.

At national level, 16.7% of the population aged 3 years and above has never attended school while 2.7% have attended nursery, and 59.5% have attended primary school. Other education levels include 0.8% for INGOBOKA/Vocational, 9.6% for lower secondary, 7.1% for upper secondary, 3.6% for university.

The total population of the Southern Province aged 3 and above is 2,720,038. The distribution of the highest level of education attended is like the national level with slight variations. In the Southern province, 17.1% of the population have never attended school, while 2.3% have attended nursery, and 62.6% have attended primary school. Other education levels include 1.2% for INGOBOKA/Vocational, 9.0% for lower secondary, 5.5% for upper secondary, 2.4% for university.

In Muhanga district, 12.7% of them has never attended any formal school, 2.6% have attended nursery school, 63.4% have attended the primary level, 9.6% a have attended lower secondary level, 6.8% have attended upper secondary and 3.5% have attended university level.

The distribution of the highest level of education attended varies among sectors with differences in the percentage of individuals at each education level, Nyabinoni(16.6%), Nyarusange(16.4%) and Rongi(16.3%) have the highest percentages of individuals who have never attended school compared to other sectors while Kabacuzi has a higher percentage

(70.9%) of individuals attended Primary school, Nyamabuye is highest in upper secondary school attended (13.2%) and in university (9.6%) than other sectors.

2.4 Characteristics of the employed population in Muhanga District

The official working age in Rwanda is 16 years and above. Aggregate employment generally increases with growing population. Therefore, the ratio of Employment to the working age population (employment to population ratio) is an important indicator of the capacity of the Economy to provide employment to a growing population. A decline in the employment-to population ratio is often regarded as an indicator of economic slowdown and a decline in total employment as an indicator of a more severe economic downturn.

2.4.1 Employment to population ratio in the Southern Province

The results of 5RPHC 2022 revealed that, the label force participation varies slightly by district in Southern province: from 46.6% in Kamonyi district to 40.4% in Muhanga district except in Nyaruguru district where it is very low (36.2%).

Labour force participation rate in Muhanga district is higher in urban than in rural (57.0% and 35.4%) and it is also higher among males than females in both urban (65.4% and 49.7%) and rural areas (42.5% and 29.4%).


2.4.2 Employment to population ratio (EPR) by age group in Muhanga District

In Muhanga District, the employment to population ratio among males as well as females increases from age group 16-19 to 30-34 and starts decreasing dramatically from age group 55-59 to 85 years and above as people starts getting very older and retire.

It was observed that the highest employment to population ratio among males stands at 64.9% and was observed in age group 30-34. Among females, the highest employment to population ratio is 43.3% and is observed in the age group 30-34.

The lowest employment to population ratio among males as well as among females stands at 4.5% (for males) and 2.8% (for females) and is observed in the age group +85.

CHAPTER 3: SUB-POPULATION

3.1 Children Population (0-17 years)

According to the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child (1989), a child is defined as every human being under 18 unless, under the law applicable to the child, majority is attended earlier. It is relevant to underline here that this definition by age coincides with that of Rwanda, as stipulated in Article 3 of the National Law n° 54/2011 of 14 December 2011 relating to the rights and the protection of the child, which stipulates that a child is any person under the age of 18. The age range (0–17) adopted for this report reflects this definition.

3.1.1 Number and share of children in Muhanga District

The results of 5^{Th} RPHC-2022 revealed that, the children population constitute 44.5% of the total population of 13,246,394. The Southern Province has 1,333,748children with a share of 44.4% of the total resident population.

In Muhanga District, the children constitute 41.3% of the resident population of the district, with a percentage of males slightly greater than female one (42.7% vs 40.0%).

The children's share is high in Mushishiro (44.3%), and Nyarusange (44.1%), it is small in Shyogwe (36.0%) and Kiyumba (39.5%).

The table below indicates distribution of children by sector and by sex.

3.1.2 Children with legal birth registration in Muhanga district

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 indicate the percentage of children whose birth was registered is 94.3% national level. The birth registration rate in Muhanga district is 95.7%. Birth registration performance is almost the same in urban (95.91%) and (95.60%) in the rural areas of Muhanga district.

3.1.3 Birth registration by sector

The results of 5th RPHC-2022 indicate that birth registration varies across sectors and areas of residence (urban and rural): Kabacuzi, Kibangu, Kiyumba, Muhanga, Mushishiro, Nyarusange, Rongi and Rugendabari sectors do not have urban areas.

High percentages of birth registrations are found in Rugendabari (97.3%), Cyeza and Kabacuzi (97.2%) at each) while the lowest is in Nyarusange (89.9%).

The percentage of birth registration for males is almost the same as the one for females. In urban areas of Muhanga district, birth registration is 95.9% while in rural areas, it is 95.6%.

3.2 Youth population (16-30 years)

For statistical purposes, The United Nations, for statistical purposes, defines 'youth', as those persons between the ages of 15 and 24 years, without prejudice to other definitions by Member States. Considering the current priorities and trends of Rwanda's Development, the definition of Youth in terms of age has been revised in this policy. It was brought from 14–35 years to 16–30 years.

3.2.1 Youth Population in Muhanga District

The results of 5th Population and housing Census conducted in 2022 revealed that, the youth represent 27.1% (3,595,670) of the total population (13,246,394). The youth population in Muhanga district was 90,816 which represents 25.34% of the total resident population of the district (358,433).

The sector with the highest youth share is Nyamabuye (29.6%) while Mushishiro (22.2%) has the lowest share of youth. The table below indicate distribution of youth by sector, and by sex.

3.2.2 Educational characteristics of youth in Muhanga District

Youth who never attended school represent 5.15 % of the youth resident population at national level; it represents 4.85% of the total resident population in Southern province and 3.03% of the total resident population of Muhanga district.

The percentage of youth who never attended school varies a lot within sectors of Muhanga district. The highest percentage was registered in Shyogwe district (6.37%) while the lowest percentages were registered in Nyamabuye (1.7%) and Kabacuzi ,Rugendabari with (1.9%) at each.

3.2.3 Highest level of education attended ed by youth in Muhanga District

In Muhanga district, among all youths, 52.0% attended only the primary school level, 22.7% attended the lower secondary education, 16.7 % attended the upper secondary education, 4.2% attended university, and 3.0% have not attended any formal of school.

The highest level of education attended varies across sectors of the district. The sectors with the highest percentage of youth with no schooling are Shyogwe (6.3%), Nyabinoni (4.2%) and Nyarusange (3.5%).

The percentage of youth with university level is high in Nyamabuye (9.4%), Shyogwe (7.0%) and Cyeza (3.1%).

The sectors with the highest percentages of youth with primary education are Nyabinoni (63.4%) and Rongi (62.5%). The table below indicates details:

3.2.4 Employment to population ratio among youth in Muhanga District

3.2.5 Status in employment of youth population in Muhanga District

In Muhanga district, most of the youth aged 16-30 currently employed are employees (62.5%) followed by owner account workers (30.2%).

Across sectors, the highest percentage of youth employees is found in Kibangu (76.8%), Shyogwe(74.9%) andNyamabuye (70.0) while the lowest percentage of youth employees is in Rongi (38.4%).

The biggest share of owner account workers youth is found in Rongi (52.9%) while the lowest is in Kibangu (16.2%).

3.2.6 Youth neither in employment nor in education or training in Southern Province

The results of 5RPHC-2022 indicate that, the proportion of Youth (16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training in Rwanda stood at 39.5 %. It is higher among females (43.8 %) than males (34.9 %).

In Southern Province, the proportion of youth (16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training is 41.4% and it is lower among males (37.5%) than females (45.0%).

The results also reveals that the aforementioned proportion is higher in rural areas of Southern Province (43.3%) than in urban areas (31.4%).

The proportion of youth (16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training among people residing in Muhanga District stood at 42.5%. It is much higher among people residing in rural areas (47.9%) than the ones residing in urban areas (27.7%).

The table below (Table 3.9) indicates results on proportion of youth (16-30 years) neither in employment nor in education or training in Southern Province by Sex, District, and Area of Residence.

3.3 Persons with disabilities

The 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and its Sustainable Development Goals with a commitment where possible of disaggregating the statistics they generate by disability to provide important insights about the extent to which persons with disabilities (PWDs) are being included in society, benefit from government programmes, or are included in the workforce.

The results of the 5th PHC reveal that the national level, 3.4% of the resident population aged 5 years and above have a disability. While in Muhanga district the disability prevalence rate is 3.7%. At sector level, the highest prevalence rates of the resident population aged 5 years and above with disability are in Kibangu (4.3%), Nyarusange, Shyogwe and Kiyumba (4.2% each) while the lowest is in Nyamabuye (2.4%) and Rugendabari (3.2%).

The prevalence of disability varies slightly by type. Disability of seeing has the higher percentage both at national level (1.40%) and in Southern Province (1.50%) compared to other types of disabilities. This disability is followed by walking disability (1.10% at national level and 1.13% at province level)

By district, Ruhango has the highest prevalence rate of residents with seeing disability (2.08%) and the lowest is in Gisagara (1.11%). Walking disability is in Ruhango (1.31%) and low in Gisagara (0.96%).

In Muhanga district, seeing disability (1.46%) is followed by walking disability with 1.26%, then hearing disability (0.58%).

3.4 Elderly Population(60 years and above)

Rwanda has enacted laws such as the Law No 088/01 of 07/09/2020 (Office of the Official Gazette of Rwanda, 2020) on Presidential order ratifying the protocol to the African charter on human and peoples' rights on the rights of older persons in Africa adopted by the twenty sixth ordinary session of the Assembly, held in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia, on 31 January 2016 through an Official Gazette No.27 of 07/09/2020 and Law No.59/2008 of 10/09/2008 on prevention and punishment of gender- based violence (Office of the Official Gazette of Rwanda, 2008), whose Article 32 sets the penalty for violence against an elderly person.

It is over two decades since the United Nations convened the First World Assembly on Ageing (Vienna, 1982) (National Academy of Sciences, National Research Council, 2001)) that launched an international action programme, which was the first international instrument on ageing, to provide a foundation for the formulation of policies and programmes on ageing. This was done to guarantee economic and social security to older persons and other opportunities to contribute to national development.

3.4.1 Elderly population in Muhanga District

In 2022, the elderly persons constitute 8.5% of the total resident population of Muhanga district. The share of the elderly females is higher than the male's one (9.4% vs. 7.4%), reflecting the higher life expectancy for women.

By sector, Rugendabari (10.6%), Kabacuzi and Kiyumba (9.9 each%) have the highest share of elderly among their total population while Nyamabuye (4.5%) and Shyogwe (7.5%) have the lowest.

3.4.2 Employment among elderly people in Muhanga District

In Rwanda, people keep on working until old age, the share of employed persons among the elderly population stands at 28.2%. The share is higher among the elderly males (33.7%) than elderly females (24.3%). In Southern Province, the share is 27.3% where it is also high among elderly males (31.9%) than elderly females (24.1%)

In Muhanga District, 22.7% of elderly people are employed. The percentage of employed elderly people is higher among males (27.7%) than females (19.0%).

By sector, employment among elderly residents is high in Nyamabuye (33.6%), Rugendabari(31.4%) and Cyeza(30.1%). It is low in Nyabinoni (6.3%) and in Kibangu (9.5%)

3.4.3 Marital status of elderly people

In Muhanga district, more than a half of the elderly population (66.6%) were living in union (Married to one wife/husband officially, married to one wife/ husband not officially, Live in a polygamous union) and 28.8% were widowed. The rate of celibacy among elderly was 2.6% while divorce and separation rate are 0.3% and 1.7% respectively.

Marital status among the elderly varies slightly by sector of residence. Marriage among elderly people is more important in Kiyumba (72.5%), Muhanga (71.5%) and Nyabinoni (70.5%) sectors. widowhood is widespread in Cyeza (31.3%) and Nyamabuye (31.0%) and lowest in Kiyumba (23.6%) and Muhanga (24.7%) sectors. The table below illustrates distribution of elderly people across sectors.

CHAPTER 4: HOUSEHOLDS AND HOUSING CHARACTERISTICS

4.1 Household characteristics

In this chapter, the 5th Rwanda Population and housing census 2022 investigated households and housing characteristics; those include household size, head of household by sex, type of habitat, housing tenure, materials used for construction, sources of energy used for lighting and cooking, water sources, sanitation facilities, asset possessed by household and mode of waste and disposals.

4.1.1 Number and mean size of private households

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 indicate the total of 3,312,743 households in Rwanda, 760,173 in the Southern province and 93,241 in Muhanga district.

The average household size in Muhanga district is 3.8 persons per household.

At the Sector level, the highest Household sizes are found in Kibangu, Nyarusange and Shyogwe (3.9 persons/household for each sector).

The smallest household sizes are found in Kiyumba (3.5 persons/household), in Nyamabuye and Rugendabari (3.6 persons/household each).

The table below indicates number of households and size of household members per sector.

Private households' heads of Muhanga District

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 revealed that nationally 28.9% of private households are headed by women. In Muhanga district, private households headed by women are 29.1%. At sector level, the highest percentages of households headed by women are found in Mushishiro sector (33.0%), Cyeza sector (30.1%) and Nyarusange(30%) while the lowest is found in

4.2 Housing Characteristics

4.2.1 Type of habitat

The results of 5th Population and Housing Census 2022 revealed that in the Southern Province the predominant type of habitat is Umudugudu(planned rural settlement)at 72.3% and dispersed/Isolated housing (20.2%).

Muhanga district as one of districts of the Southern Province; the most common type of habitat is Umudugudu(planned rural settlement) at 67.5% followed by dispersed/Isolated housing and Spontaneous/squatter(14.3% each type).

Across sectors, the common types of habitat are the same as at district level: Umudugudu(planned rural settlement)type is the most prevalent in all sectors, followed by dispersed/Isolated housing and Spontaneous/squatter.

Umudugudu (planned rural settlement) type is most found in Kibangu(94.6%), Mushishiro(92.2%) and Rugendabari(90.0% while it is less in Nyamabuye(21.1%). Dispersed/Isolated housing type predominates in Kabacuzi(31.3%), Nyarusange(26.6%) and Kiyumba(24.6%).

The type of habitat that predominates in Nyamabuye district is Spontaneous/squatter at 66.9%.



By area of residence, the predominant types are spontaneous/squatter housing (54.4%) and Umudugudu/planned rural settlement (36.9%) in urban areas.

In rural areas, the predominant type is Umudugudu(planned rural settlemet) (76.5%) followed by dispersed/isolated housing(17.6%).

4.2.2 Tenure of the housing

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 indicate that the ownership of housing in the Southern Province represents 77.6% and tenant represent 14.5%. In Muhanga District, 77.0 % are occupied by their owners while 17.1 % are occupied by occupied by tenants.

At the sector level, the percentage of owners of households' units is high in Rongi (90.6%), Nyabinoni(89.7%), Kibangu(88.5%) and Nyarusange (88.0%) and it is low in Nyamabuye (45.0%) and Shyogwe (68.2%).



According to the area of residence, 2 types of tenure of housing units (owners, tenants and free lodging) predominate in urban area as well as in rural area.

The percentage of owners of housing units is 46.8% in urban areas while it is 85.9% in rural areas and the percentage of tenants of housing units is 48.3% in urban areas and 8.0% in rural areas. The percentage of free lodging is 3.6% in urban areas while it is 5.4% in rural areas.

4.2.3 Material of the housing units

4.2.3.1 Main materials of the roof

The results of the 5th RPHC 2022 indicate that housing units are mainly covered by iron sheets in Rwanda (74.1%). In Southern Province, many housing units are covered by local tiles (60.7%. In Muhanga District, housing units are mainly covered by local tiles (72.9%) followed by those covered by iron sheets (26.8%.


At sector level, it shows that is not very significant. More than 70% of housing units are covered by local tiles in 9 sectors out of 12 of the Muhanga District. The lowest percentages are in Nyamabuye with 43.0%, Nyabinoni(59.6%) and Shyogwe(64.0%), by consideration the households covered by iron sheets 55.7% is found in Nyamabuye sector. According to the area of residence, the predominant roofing materials are the iron sheets in urban areas (58.4%) while local tiles occupy 41.1% In rural areas, 82.2% of housing unit are covered by local tiles while those covered by iron sheets are 17.6%. The figure below illustrates details:

4.2.3.2 Main materials of the walls

The results of the census show that the most materials of the walls of the housing units are sundried bricks with cement: 36.3% in Rwanda, 35.8% in the Southern Province and 48.6% in Muhanga District.

At the national level and in Muhanga district, it is followed by sundried bricks without cement (30.7% and 40.2% respectively) while the second most materials of the walls of the housing units in Southern Province are wood with mud without cement (26.7%).

At the sector level, sun dried bricks with cement are the mostly used materials in Nyamabuye (68.2%) and Shogwe (60.5%). Sun dried bricks without cement is the most frequently used material in Nyabinoni (73.4%).



According to the area of residence in Muhanga District, the main materials used for walls of the housing units are mostly sun-dried bricks with cement (69.2%) followed by sun-dried bricks without cement (12.7%) and burnt bricks with cement (10.8%) in urban areas. In rural areas, sun-dried bricks without cement are predominant materials 48.2%) followed by sun-dried bricks with cement (42.6%). The figure below provides details:

4.2.3.3 Main materials of the floor

The results 5RPHC 2022 indicate that the main material of the floor for the housing units at national level, province level and district level is earth (60.4%, 64.2% and 57.1% respectively), followed by cement (31.2%, 26.4% and 36.7% respectively).

At sector level, earth as main material is used at rate of more than 50% in 10 sectors out of 12. Cement is more used in Nyamabuye sector at 71.2% while it is at rate of less than 50% (for each) in all remaining sectors. Burnt brick is used in Shyogwe at 12.8% in other sectors is at rate less than 4% for each. The table below displays details:



By area of residence, the results of census indicate that the predominant materials used for the floor of the housing units are cement (70.7%) followed by earth (16.8%) and ceramic/clay/granite tiles (6.8%) in urban areas.

In rural areas, the predominant materials for the floor are earth (68.9%) and cement (26.8%). The figure below provides details:

4.3 Source of energy of the private households in Muhanga District

4.3.1 Grid Line connectivity in Muhanga District

At national level, the results of the 5th RPHC 2022 revealed that 52.5% of private households are connected to a grid line while 47.5% are not connected.

In Southern province, the percentage of private household connected to a grid line is 43.8% while it is 46.8% in Muhanga District.

At the sector level, Nyamabuye(85.3%) and Shyogwe(70.2) are the sectors with high percentage of private households connected to a grid line, while Nyabinoni is the sector with less private households connected to a grid line(9.0%).



4.3.2 Main source of energy for lighting

In Muhanga District, the main source of energy for lighting used by households is electricity (57.2%).

At the sector level, Nyamabuye sector is the sector with the high percentages of private households using electricity at 86.6%, followed by Shyogwe(72.7%), Cyeza(58.4%, Muhanga(57.7%) and Mushishiro(56.3%).

Nyabinoni(31.3%) and Rongi(33.8%) are the sectors with less more private households using electricity.

The second source of energy for lighting is flashlight or phone flashlight. That source is more used in Rongi(59%), Nyabinoni(55.7%) and Kiyumba(51.3%).



According to the area of residence, the main source of energy for lighting is electricity (88.6%) followed by flashlight or phone flashlight (6.7%) and candles (2.4%) in urban areas.

In rural areas, 48.0% of private households use electricity as main source of energy for lighting while44.3% use flashlight or phone flashlight and 2.7% use firewoods.

4.3.3 Main sources of energy for cooking in Muhanga District

At the district level, the main sources of energy for cooking used by the private households are firewood (80.9%) followed by charcoal (15.9%) and gas (1.8% each).

At the sector level, firewood is the most used source of cooking energy by private households at a rate more than 90% in 9 sectors out of 12.

Sector with the high percentage of private households using charcoal as main source of cooking energy is Nyamabuye (58.2%). It is used in Shyogwe sector at 28.0% while it represents less than 20% (for each) in other sectors.

Nyamabuye(6.7%) and Shyogwe(3.4%) are the sectors in which we find private households that use gas as one of source of energy for cooking at a rate more than 1%. The table below illustrates details:



4.3.4 Water and sanitation of the private households in Muhanga District

4.3.4.1 Main source of water

The results of 5RPHC 2022 reveal that improved drinking water sources are used by 82.3% of private households in Rwanda while they are 78.4% in the Southern Province.In Muhanga District, the percentage of private households using improved drinking water is 84.8%.

At the sector level, 4 sectors have private households using improved drinking water sources at a rate more than 90%: Nyamabuye(96.7%), Shyogwe(93.5%), Kibangu(90.8%) and Cyeza(90.2%). There is other 4 sectors (Mushishiro, Kabacuzi, Muhanga and Kiyumba), the percentage of private households using the improved drinking water is at a rate between 80% and 85% while in other remaining 4 sectors, the percentage of private households using improved drinking water is between 70% and 79%.



Figure 4. 9: Distribution (%) of the private households of Muhanga District by main source of drinking water and by sector





4.3.4.2 Main type of toilet facility

The results of census reveal that the main types of toilet facility used by the private households in Rwanda are "pit latrine with constructed floor slab used by one household" (68.8%).

In Muhanga District, main types of toilet facility used by the private households are "pit latrine with constructed floor slab used by one household" (80.2%), "pit latrine with constructed floor slab used by several households" (13.6%) and pit latrine without constructed floor slab used by one household (3.0%).

At the sector level, the percentage of households using "pit latrine with constructed floor slab used by one household" is high in Kiyumba (92.0%), Kibangu(90.7%) and Kabacuzi (90.1%) while it is low in Nyamabuye (54.9%) and Shyogwe (72.2%).

For pit latrines with constructed floor slab used by several households is more used in Nyamabuye (34.0%), Shyogwe(16.5%) and Cyeza(11.8%).

The high percentages of households using pit latrine without constructed floor slab used by one household are more found in Shyogwe (4.5%), Rongi(4.2%), Nyabinoni and Nyarusange(4.0% each).

The type of toilet facility used by the private households varies according to the area of residence in Muhanga District.

In urban areas, the types of toilets most used are Pit Latrine with constructed floor slab used by several households (31.7%), Pit Latrine with constructed floor slab used by one household (56.1%) and flush toilet used by one household (7.9%).

In rural areas, the main types of toilets used are Pit Latrine with constructed floor slab used by one household (87.3%) and Pit Latrine with constructed floor slab used by several households (8.4%) and Pit Latrine without constructed floor slab used by one HH (3.2).

By area of residence, private households use mainly Pit Latrine with constructed floor slab used by several households" in both urban and rural areas of Muhanga District (56.1% in urban and 87.3% in rural).

The percentage of private households using Pit Latrine with constructed floor slab used by several households is higher in urban (31.7%) than in rural (8.4%).

The following type in urban areas is the flush toilet used by one household (7.9%) while it is Pit Latrine with constructed floor slab used by one household (3.2%) in rural areas.

4.3.4.3 Mode of waste disposal in Muhanga District

The results of the census reveal that, in Muhanga District, the high percentage of households (46.5%) evacuate their waste through Household compost dumping while 42.7% of private households evacuate their waste in the household's fields or bushes ,6.3% in the waste collection companies and 3.7% public the compost dumping.

At the Sector level, the high percentages of households evacuating their waste through Household compost dumping are in Kibangu (63.0%) and Rugendabari (60.8) the household's fields or bushes as main mode of waste disposal is the most used kiyumba (57.0%), Kabacuzi(52.9%), Nyarusnge(50.7) and Rongi (50.0%). The collection companies as main mode of waste disposal is the most used in Nyamabuye (29.6) and Shyogwe (7.6%).

The results of the census indicate that the main modes of waste disposal used by the households vary also by area of residence.

In urban areas, domestic waste is mainly collected and evacuated Through Household compost dumping while (32.6%), thrown in the household's fields or in the bushes (31.3%) and collection companies (27.4%).

In rural areas, domestic waste is mainly collected and evacuated Through Household compost dumping while (50.5%), thrown in the household's fields or in the bushes (46.0%) and public the compost dumping (2.5%).

4.4 Assets possessed by private households in Muhanga District

4.4.1 Communication assets possessed by private households in Muhanga District

At the district level, 82.7% of private households possess a radio, 77.9% a mobile phone, 19.5% a smartphone, 11.7% a TV and 3.6% a computer.

The percentage of private households possessing a radio is high in Nyamabuye (92.6%) and Shyogwe (87.1%). It is low in Nyabinoni (71.3%).

The percentage of private households possessing a television is high in Nyamabuye (31.3%), while it is low in Nyabinoni(1.6%) and Rongi (1.8%).

Mobile phones are mostly possessed by private households of Nyamabuye (90.5%) and Shyogwe(83.9%) while it is low in Nyabinoni(71.3%).

The sectors with the highest percentage of households with smartphone are Nyamabuye (46.5%) and Shyogwe (33.0%) while the percentage of households possessing this asset is low in Rongi(5.9%), Nyabinoni (6.0%).

The computer is mostly possessed in Nyamabuye (10.0%) and shyogwe (9.1%) while it is at a rate less than 3% in the remaining sectors at each.

4.4.2 Access to the Internet

The results of the 5th RPHC-2022 indicate that the percentages of households with at least one member using internet are 22.2% at national level while they are 15.7% in Southern Province and 21.0% in Muhanga District. At sector level, the percentage of households with at least one member using internet is high in Nyamabuye (47.0%) and Shyogwe (33.4%).

The sectors with the lower percentages of households with at least one member using internet are Rongi (6.7%) and Nyabinoni (7.4%).


According to the area of residence in Muhanga District, the results of the census show that the access to the Internet varies greatly.

CHAPTER 5: AGRICULTURE IN MUHANGA DISTRICT

The agriculture was the one of the areas of investigation of the 5th Rwanda Population and housing census conducted in 2022. The households engaged in Livestock husbandry; the number of private crop farming households cultivating different types of crops, by Sector, the number of private households raising different types of livestock, by Sector and type of household raised in district were captured in the census.

5.1 Crop farming and livestock husbandly in Muhanga District

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 revealed that nationally, we have 3,312,743 Households where we have 2,280,854 of private households (68.9%) are engaged in agriculture, and 2,074,928 (62.6%) are engaged in crop farming and 1,669,273(50.4%) are engaged in livestock husbandry with respecting to the total households at national level.

Muhanga District is one of districts of the Southern Province where crop farming and animal husbandly are at moderate level: agricultural households occupy (79.5%) with 74.0% of households engaged in crop farming and 67.1% of households engaged in livestock husbandry.

At the sector level, the highest percentages of agricultural households are found in Kibangu (95.7%) and Rugendabari (95.3%. Households engaged in crop farming are more represented in these sectors: Kibangu (93.6%) and Rugendabari (91.7%) while those engaged in livestock husbandry are more represented in Kibangu (86.1%) and Kabacuzi (85.9%).

5.2 Types of crop farming in Muhanga District

The results of the 5th Population and housing census 2022 indicate that the most cultivated crops by the private households of Muhanga district are sweet potatoes, cassava, fruits, beans, yams &taro,banana, vegetables, soybean and maize. Private households cultivated sweet potatoes are more found in Rongi and Kabacuzi while they are less in Nyabinoni.

Private households cultivated cassava are more found in Kabacuzi and it has the high number Private households cultivated fruits. Cyeza and Shyogwe have more households cultivated beans.

5.3 Livestock husbandly in Muhanga District

Nationally the results of the census indicate that most private households are considerably more engaged in raising cows, goats and Pigs rather than other livestock. In the Southern Province It is in the same extent as in Muhanga district where the most private households are considerably more engaged in raising cows, Pigs and goats rather than other livestock.

The sectors that have a high proportion of private households that are more engaged in raising cows are Kabacuzi and Rongi. Households engaged in raising pigs are more found in Cyeza, Muhanga and Nyarusange. Households engaged in raising goats are more in Rongi and kabacuzi while those engaged in raising chickens are more found in Kabacuzi and Nyarusange The table below displays details:
