



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FOREWORD

The Government of Rwanda, through the National Institute of Statistics of Rwanda (NISR) conducted the 2022 Rwanda Population and Housing Census to provide updated demographic, social and economic indicators for policy formulation and planning to support the national development agenda and track the implementation of national, regional, continental and global development goals, such as the First National Strategy for Transformation (NST1 2017-2024); the AU Agenda 2063; and the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

The Population and Housing Census in Rwanda dates back to the year 1978 when the first ever modern census was implemented. The second, third, and fourth censuses were carried out in 1991, 2002, and 2012 respectively. The 2022 Population and Housing Census marks therefore the Fifth in the series following the United Nations Recommendations to conduct a census every ten years.

Considering census' crucial importance for the planning process, the Government of Rwanda has made the Population and Housing Census a priority to be undertaken every 10 years and adopted the use of technologies for timely delivery of census results for use.

Results of the 2022 Population and Housing Census provide population numbers from national to the lowest administrative level, as well as demographic and socio-economic indicators at both national and district levels. The census remains the only national data collection exercise that can provide the lowest levels of disaggregation to support decentralised decision making across the country.

I would like therefore to take this opportunity to thank all stakeholders that contributed to the success of the 2022 Population and Housing Census. They include Ministries and other Government institutions, international organizations such as the World Bank (WB), the European Union (EU), the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA), One-UN, UN Women, UNICEF, UNECA, the United Kingdom AID (UKAID), the African Development Bank (AfDB), the USAID, Enabel, PARIS 21 and others for their support in diverse ways.

My special thanks go to the local government leaders from the province to the village levels who contributed a lot to the success of the 2022 Population and Housing Census. Exceptional gratitude to all enumerators, teachers and young people who collected the information and all respondents for their cooperation and dedication. CHAPITER 1: POPULATION SIZE, SPATIAL DISTRIBUTION, AND STRUCTURE

1.1. Size and Spatial Distribution of the population

1.1.1 Size and Spatial Distribution of the Population of Western Province

The 5th Rwanda Population and Housing Census (PHC5) has enumerated 2,896,484 residents in the Western Province, which represents 21.86% of the total population of Rwanda (13,246,394 residents). The population of Western Province is predominantly female; 1,511,849 are women corresponding to 52.2% of the total population of the Province. Rubavu is the most populated district with 546,683 residents in 2022. Its population represents 18.9% of the total residents' population of Western Province. The least populated district in the Western Province is Nyabihu with 319,047 inhabitants, corresponding to 11.0 % of the total resident population of Western population.

1.1.2 Population Density of the Western province by District

Population density is a measurement of population per unit land area. Density is the number of the inhabitant per Km². The Rwanda Population and Housing Census conducted in 2022 revealed that, the population density in Rwanda is 503 inhabitants per Km². The Western province has 693 inhabitants per Km². The district with a high population density is Rubavu with 1,614 Inhabitants per km². The district with a lowest population density is Karongi with 482 Inhabitants per km². The figure below indicates distribution of population density per district.




Figure 1. 3 Distribution of population density by sectors of Nyabihu District

1.1.3 Size and Spatial Distribution of the Population of the Nyabihu district

The 5th Rwanda Population and Housing Census (PHC5) has enumerated 319,047 residents in Nyabihu district, which represent 11% of the total population of the Western Province (2,896,484 residents). The population of Nyabihu district is predominantly female: 168,975 are women corresponding to 53% of its total population. The results in previous table 1.1 indicates that, the population share of Nyabihu district is 2.4% of the total Rwandan population.

Females are predominant in all 12 sectors of the district (Rugera with 53.4%, Rambura 53.4%, Kintobo 53.3%, Karago 53.2%, Jomba 53.2%, Muringa 53.1%, Mukamira 53.1%, Shyira 53%, Rurembo 52.9%, Jenda 52.6%, Kabatwa 52.5% and Bigogwe 52.4%).

Jenda (43,168 population) and Bigogwe (34,439 population) are the most populated sectors. They represent 13.5% and 10.8% of the total population of Nyabihu district, respectively. The two less populated sectors are Kintobo (15,315 inhabitants) and Kabatwa (20,841 inhabitants). They represent 4.8% and 6.5% of the total resident population of Nyabihu district, respectively. The table below 1.2 indicates the number of the population of Nyabihu district by sector, by sex and their shares across sectors to the total population of Nyabihu district.

1.1.4 Size and Spatial Distribution of the Population of Nyabihu district by residence area

The results of Rwanda Population and housing census 2022 revealed that, the total population of Rwanda are spatially distributed in rural area that represent 72.1% and urban area represent 27.9%. The western Province is predominantly by the rural area (77.9%) and urban area (22.1%). Nyabihu district population is predominantly by rural area 75.5% while urban represents 24.5%. The sectors of Nyabihu district which are entirely rural are Jomba, Kabatwa, Karago, Kintobo, Muringa, Rugera and Rurembo. The table below 1.3 illustrates the results.

1.1.5 Age-Sex Structure of the Population of Nyabihu district

Nyabihu population is mostly young. 60.38% of the resident population of Nyabihu is under 25 years, as shown by the age pyramid (Figure 1.4), reflecting the high level of fertility in the recent past. The elderly (60 years and above) represents 6.26% of the total population of the district. The table below 1.4 illustrates the results, and more details of sectors are in the annex.

1.1.6 Population share of some specific interventions target groups in Nyabihu District by sex

The Rwanda population and housing census 2022 indicate the population on specific age-based programs, policy and strategies interventions in health, education, employment and also indicates the population categories in their respective characteristics such as children, youth, working population, among other things. For instance, children under five years for immunization programs (Under 5 years children), children in school age (3-17 years), people in the official working age group (16 years and above), etc. Knowing the size of such groups is of great importance for the design, implementation, monitoring, and evaluation of programs targeting such groups. The below table gives the size of the main interventions target groups by sex, and their share in the entire population of Nyabihu district. The population aged 0-17 represents 46.5 % of the total population of the district, 16-30 years represent 28.1%; the working age population 16 years and above represents 58.9% of the same population. The table below shows distribution of Nyabihu districts by targeted interventions by their age.

CHAPITER 2: CHARACTERISTICS OF THE POPULATION

2.1 Socio-cultural characteristics of the population

2.1.1 Nationality of the population of Nyabihu District

The results of 5th RPHC-2022 indicate that, the Rwandan population by nationality represent 99.1% and foreigners represent 0.9%. In the Western Province, foreigners represent 0.5% and Nyabihu districts, the Rwandan by nationality represent 99.9% and foreigners represent 0.1% (365). There are seven sectors of Nyabihu district that do not have any foreigners (with100% Rwandans by nationality); those are Jomba, Kabatwa, Karago, Kintobo, Rugera, Rurembo, and Shyira. The table below illustrates the distribution of the population by nationality with their respective sectors of residence.

2.1.2 Religious affiliation of the resident population of Nyabihu District.

In Nyabihu district, Christianity is the predominant religion. 29% are catholic, 19.7% are ADEPR, 13.2% are protestant, 26.5% are Adventists, and 0.7% are Muslim, and Jehovah witness are 0.6%. 3.8% of the resident population declared themselves to be without religion. 2.2 Marital Status of the resident population of Nyabihu district

2.2.1 Marital status by sector

The results of 5RPHC-2022, revealed that 49.6% of the resident population of Nyabihu district aged 12 and above were living in union at the time of the census, while 43.5% were never married. 5.2% were widowed, while separated and divorced were respectively 1.5% and 0.1%. At the sector level, three sectors, Rurembo (52.1), Jenda (51.8%) and Kabatwa (51.8%) have the highest percentages of the currently married people. Bigogwe (47%) has the highest percentage of the never married persons. Shyira and Rugera sectors have high percentage of widowed persons (6.5% and 6.1% respectively). Details of the resident population of Nyabihu district aged 12 years and above by marital status and sex is presented in the annex.

2.2.2 Marital status by Age groups

The percentages of resident population of Nyabihu district by marital status vary by sex and age: The percentage of never married persons decreases from 99.8% (age group of 12-14 years) to 1.0% (age group of 80 years and above). The percentage of persons currently living in union starts by increasing from 0.1% (age group of 12-14 years) to a maximum of 88.7% (age group of 35-39 years) before decreasing to 45.7% (age group 85+) due mainly to widowhood (53.1%). The highest percentage of divorced persons (0.3%) is observed from age group 35-64, 40-44, 45-49, 50-54 and 60-64 while the highest percentage of the separated persons (2.8%) is found in age group 30-34 years.

2.3 Educational Characteristics of the Population of Nyabihu district

2.3.1 School attendance

The table 2.5 below shows that, in Nyabihu district, 65.0% of pre-primary age population (3-5 years) are currently attending school, 35.0% of children have never attended and no children have previously attended (i.e children who have already had prior exposure to nursery school education before the time of census but who were not attending nursery school/dropped-out during census time). Shyira Sector has the highest proportion of children (age between 3 to 5) currently attending school in Nyabihu District (83.9%), followed by Kintobo Sector that has a percentage of 77.3% of children currently attending school. Rambura sector has the lowest percentage of children currently attending school, with only 51% enrolled. On the other hand, Rambura and Karago sectors have the highest proportion of children aged 3 to 5 who have never attended school (49% and 46.6%, respectively).

The table 2.6 shows that in Nyabihu District 90.8% of children age 6 to 11 years (the official primary schoolgoing age) are currently attending school 7.5% have never attended school and only 1.7% have previously attended school (which means that 9.2% of children aged 6 to 11 are out of school).

By comparing the distribution of the primary school-age population (6-11 years) across sectors in Nyabihu District, comparisons reveal the disparities in primary school attendance across different sectors within Nyabihu District. Sectors like Muringa, Rambura and Karago exhibit lower rates of children currently attending school (85.6%, 86.5 and 86.9% respectively). On the other hand, sectors like Shyira, Kintobo and Rugera demonstrate higher rates of children currently attending school (97.1%, 95.5% and 95.2%, respectively) and lower rates of children who have never attended (1.9%, 3.2% and 3.4%, respectively).

In Nyabihu District 22.7% of the population aged 12 to 17 have previously attended school (i.e. they dropped out of school), 72.3% are currently attending school and 5% have never attended secondary school.

The distribution of the secondary school-age population (12-17 years) across sectors in Nyabihu District, shows that Kabatwa sector has the highest percentage of the population aged 12 to 17 currently attending school at 77.4%. Conversely, Muringa sector has the lowest percentage of the population aged 12 to 17 currently attending school with 62%. Muringa Sector also has the highest percentage of the population between the ages of 12 and 17 who have never attended school at 11.2%.

2.3.2 Gross and Net Attendance Rate (%)in Primary School in Nyabihu district

Gross and Net Attendance Ratios are used to measure the extent of coverage of an educational program. It gives a comparison of the children attending school with the total size of the school-age population. It can also be used for assessing how far a country has succeeded in bringing to school all those who are eligible to attend.

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 reveal that not all children attending primary school level are of the official age for that level (6-11 years). The gross attendance rate in Rwanda is 141.7, in the Western Province GAR is 139.8 and 149.5 in Nyabihu district. The net attendance rate (NAR) in Primary school for Nyabihu district (90.8%) is greater than the NAR of the Western province (87.8%) and the NAR of Nyabihu is also greater than the NAR of the national level (89.3%).

A Gross Attendance Rate (GAR) of 149.5% in Nyabihu District for the population 6 to 11 years indicates a high percentage of those who attended primary schools aged below 6 years and or above 11 years. On the other hand, the NAR of 90.8% for the population 6 to 11 years indicates that only 90.8% of the population 6 to 11 years were attending primary schools in Nyabihu District by 2022 (Table 2.6). In 2022, students older younger than the official primary school age range made up 39.2% [(GAR149.5-NAR90.8)/GAR149.5] of the primary school population of Nyabihu District.

With a NAR of 97.1%, Shyira Sector has the greatest percentage of pupils that are attending primary school and are of primary school-age. In comparison to other sectors, Muringa sector has the lowest NAR at 85.6%, indicating a lower percentage of pupils who are attending primary school within the eligible age range. Almost all sectors have gender parity indexes greater than 1.00 except Mukamira and Shyira sectors (1.00), suggesting better access to education for female students compared to male students.

2.3.3 Gross and Net Attendance Rate (%) in Secondary School

The table 2. 9 below provides information on the gross and net attendance rates in the secondary school level (12-17 years) in Nyabihu District, disaggregated by sex and sector. The Western Province and Nyabihu District both have lower NARs than the national average (20.6% and 19.9%, respectively, versus 22.3%) when compared to the national average. Comparing males and females in Nyabihu District in terms of Net Attendance Rates (NAR), the table 2. 9 indicates a higher proportion of females (23.3%) in Nyabihu District, within the secondary school-age range (12-17 years), are attending school compared to males (16.5%). Female students older or younger than the official secondary school age range made up 44.1% [(GAR41.7–NAR23.3)/GAR41.7] of the female with secondary school age of Nyabihu District, while for male students it made up 51.3% [(GAR33.9–NAR16.5)/GAR33.9]. This shows that females have a higher attendance rate in Nyabihu District compared to males when considering the overall attendance rates, regardless of age or grade-level eligibility.

Among the sectors in Nyabihu District, Bigogwe and Mukamira have the highest GAR for both sexes, with a rate of 50.5% and 48.4%, respectively. Sectors such as Rurembo, Muringa, and Karago have relatively lower GAR compared to others (24.5%, 25.6% and 28.3% respectively). Kabatwa has the highest NAR for both sexes in Nyabihu District, with a rate of 27.1%. Sectors like Karago, Rurembo, and Muringa have relatively lower (less than 15%) NAR compared to others (14.1%, 14.1% and 12.9% respectively).

2.3.4 Highest level of school attendance in Nyabihu district

The results of 5RPHC-2022 indicate that, among the population of Rwanda aged 3 years and above is 11,999,691. The highest level of education attended is categorized into several levels: Never attended School, Nursery, Primary, INGOBOKA/Vocational, Lower secondary, Upper secondary, University, and Not stated. In Rwanda, 16.7% of the population aged 3 years and above has never attended school, while 2.7% have attended nursery, and 59.5% have attended primary school. Other education levels include 0.8% for INGOBOKA/Vocational, 9.6% for lower secondary, 7.1% for upper secondary, 3.6% for university, and 0.0% is not stated.

The total population of the Western Province aged 3 and above is 2,613,461. The distribution of the highest level of education attended is like the national level, with slight variations. In the Western Province, 19.4% of the population has never attended school, while 2.2% have attended nursery, and 60.7% have attended primary school. Other education levels include 0.6% for INGOBOKA/Vocational, 8.7% for lower secondary, 6.2% for upper secondary, 2.2% for university, and 0.0% is not stated.

The total population of Nyabihu District aged 3 and above is 286,472. In Nyabihu District, 18.1% of the population has never attended school, while 2.5% have attended nursery, and 60.1% have attended primary school. Other education levels include 0.5% for INGOBOKA/Vocational, 10.3% for lower secondary, 6.8% for upper secondary, 1.8% for university, and 0.0% is not stated. The distribution of the highest level of education attended varies among sectors, with differences in the percentage of individuals at each education level. For example, Muringa has a higher percentage (28.1%) of individuals who have never attended school compared to other sectors, while Mukamira has a higher percentage (10.4%) of individuals attended upper secondary school. Each sector has its own unique distribution of education levels attended by the population. The table below indicates the findings:

2.4 Characteristics of the Employed Population

The official working age in Rwanda is 16 years and above. Aggregate employment generally increases with growing population. Therefore, the ratio of Employment to the working age population (employment to population ratio) is an important indicator of the capacity of the Economy to provide employment to a growing population. A decline in the employment-to population ratio is often regarded as an indicator of economic slowdown and a decline in total employment as an indicator of a more severe economic downturn.

2.4.1 Employment to population ratio by sex, Province, District and area of residence

The results presented in the below table 2.11 show that the employment to population ratio stood at 45.9 in Rwanda, it is lower among females (40.2%) than males (52.4%). On the other side, it was observed that the employment to population ratio is higher in urban areas of Rwanda (53.5%) than in rural areas (42.7%). It was observed that in the Western province, the employment to population ratio stood at 42.3 %, it is higher in urban areas (48.2 %) than in rural areas of Western province (40.6%).

It was also revealed that the employment to population ratio is 46.2% among people residing in Nyabihu district, it is higher in urban areas of Nyabihu (47.9%) than in rural areas of Nyabihu (45.6%).



2.4.2 Employment to population ratio (EPR) among the resident population of Nyabihu district aged 16 years and above by age group and sex

Figure 2.1 allows the study of the calendar and intensity of Employment to population ratio and its variation by sex. The figure reveals the following remarks: The employment to population ratio among males as well as females increases from age group 16-19 to 35-44 and starts decreasing from age group 45-49 up to 85 years and above as people starts getting very older and retire. It was observed that in Nyabihu district, the highest employment to population ratio among males stands at 67.2% and was observed in age group 35-39, On the other side the highest employment to population among females is 55.7% and was observed in the age group 40-44. The lowest employment to population ratio among males stands at 10.8% and was observed among males in the age group 85+, the lowest employment to population ratio among females is 4.9% and was also observed among females in the age group 85+.

CHAPITER 3: SUB-POPULATION

3.1 Children Population (0-17 years)

According to the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child (1989), a child is defined as every human being under 18 unless, under the law applicable to the child, majority is attained earlier. It is relevant to underline here that this definition by age coincides with that of Rwanda, as stipulated in Article 3 of the National Law n° 54/2011 of 14 December 2011 relating to the rights and the protection of the child, which stipulates that a child is any person under the age of 18. The age range (0–17) adopted for this report reflects this definition.

3.1.1 The number and share of children in Nyabihu district

The results of 5th RPHC-2022 revealed that, at national level, the children population constitute 44.5% of the total population of 13,246,394. The Western province has 1,355,679 children with a share of 46.8% of the total resident population. In Nyabihu District, the children constitute 46.5% of the resident population of the district, with a percentage of males slightly greater than the females' one (49.3% vs 43.9%). The children's share is high in Rugera (47.8%) and small in Kintobo (44.5%). The table below indicates the distribution of children by sector and by sex.

3.1.2 Children with birth registration in Nyabihu District

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 indicate that the percentage of children whose birth was registered is 94.3% at the national level. The birth registration rate in Nyabihu district is 93.6%. The variation by sex is not very significant but the birth registration in rural areas is higher (94.1%) than in urban (91.9%). The table below illustrates the findings:

3.1.3 Birth registration by sector

The results of 5th RPHC-2022 indicate that birth registration varies across sectors and areas of residence (urban and rural), Jomba, Kabatwa, Karago, Kintobo, Muringa, Rugera and Rurembo sectors do not have urban areas. High percentages of birth registrations are found in Rugera (97%), Shyira (96.7%) and Rurembo (96.4%) while the lowest is in Jenda (89.6%). The percentage of birth registration for males is almost the same as the one for females. In urban areas of Nyabihu district, birth registration is 91.9% while in rural areas, it is 94.1%.

3.2 Youth population (16-30 years)

The United Nations, for statistical purposes, defines "youth", as those persons between the ages of 15 and 24 years, without prejudice to other definitions by Member States. Considering the current priorities and trends of Rwanda's Development, the definition of Youth in terms of age has been revised in this policy. It was brought from 14–35 years to 16–30 years.

3.2.1 The youth population in Nyabihu District

The results of 5th Population and housing Censuses conducted in 2022 revealed that, the youth represent 27.1% (3,595,670) of the total population (13,246,394). The youth population in Nyabihu district is 89,609 which represents 28.1% of the total resident population of the district (319,047). The sector with the highest youth share is Kabatwa (29.9%) while Rugera has the lowest share of youth (26%). The table below indicate distribution of youth by sector, and by sex.

3.2.2 Educational characteristics of youth

Youth who never attended school represent 5.1% of the youth resident population at national level; it represents 6.6% of the total resident population in Western province and 7.9% of the total resident population of Nyabihu district. The percentage of youth who never attended school varies a lot within sectors of Nyabihu district. The highest percentage was registered in Muringa (14.6%) while the lowest percentages were registered in Shyira (2.9%).

3.2.3 Highest level of education attended by youth in Nyabihu District

In Nyabihu district, among all youths, only 49.3% attained the primary school level, 23.5% attained the lower secondary education, 15.7% attained the upper secondary education, 3% attained university, and 7.9% have never attended school. The highest level of education attained varies across sectors of the district. The sectors with the highest percentage of youth with no schooling are Muringa (14.6%), Rambura (12.4%) and Karago (11.1%). The percentage of youth with university level is high in Bigogwe (5.8%) and Mukamira (5.4%). The sectors with the highest percentages of youth with primary education are Jomba (61.2%) and Rurembo (60.2%). The table below indicates details:

3.2.4 Employment to population ratio among youth (16-30).

The Census results showed that in Rwanda the employment to population ratio among youth stands at 40.3%, it is higher among males (44.8%) than females (36.2 %) respectively. It was observed that in Nyabihu district, the employment to population ratio among youth stands at 39.2%, it is also higher in among males (41.8%) than females (36.9%)

The highest employment to population ratio among youth in Nyabihu district was observed in Kabatwa sector (55.5%) and the lowest employment to population ratio among youth was observed in Rugera (24.3%), Jomba (25.6%) and Bigogwe (29.1%).

3.2.5 Distribution (%) of the currently employed youth age 16-30 years by Province, District, Sector and status in employment

In Nyabihu district, the majority of youth aged 16-30 currently employed are employees (68.2%) followed by own account worker without regular employees (23.0%). The highest percentage of youth employees is found in Muringa (81.5%) and Karago (80.9%), while the lowest is in Rurembo (50.7%). The highest percentage of currently employed population who worked as own account worker without regular employees among youth is found in Rambura (39.6%) and Shyira (35.4%) while the lowest is observed in Kabatwa (11.6%), Karago (13.1%) and Muringa (13.1%).

3.2.6 Proportion of Youth (16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training in Nyabihu District by sex, district, and area of residence.

The results of 5RPHC-2022 indicate that, in Rwanda the proportion of Youth (16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training stood at 39.5 %. It is higher among females (43.8 %) than males (34.9 %). In the Western province, the proportion of Youth (16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training is 42.6% and it is lower in males (38.5%) than in females (46.3%). The 2022 census results also revealed that the aforementioned proportion is higher in rural areas (44.6%) than in urban areas of Kigali (36.1%). The proportion of youth (16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training among people residing in Nyabihu district stood at 39.7%. It is much higher among people residing in rural areas of Nyabihu district (41.4%) than the ones residing in urban areas of Nyabihu district (34.9%). The table below (Table 2.12) indicates results on Proportion of Youth (16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training in the Western province by Sex, District, and Area of Residence.

3.3 Persons with disabilities

In 2015, 193 countries agreed to the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and its Sustainable Development Goals with a commitment where possible, "to disaggregate the statistics they generate by disability to provide important insights about the extent to which persons with disabilities(PWDs) are being included in society, benefit from government programmes, or are included in the workforce.

At the national level, 3.4% of the resident population aged 5 years and above have a disability while in Nyabihu district the disability prevalence rate is 3.7%. At sector level, the highest prevalence rates of the resident population aged 5 years and above with disability are in Muringa (4.6%) while the lowest is in Rambura (2.3%).

Regarding the prevalence of disability among the population age 5 years and above by type of disability, 1.4% have a disability of not seeing, 1.1% have a disability of walking. All the remaining type of disabilities (Hearing, communicating, Remembering or concentrating, self-care, short stature and albinism their respective prevalence is under 1%. The table below indicates that in Nyabihu District the prevalence of disability of seeing is at 1.47 %. All the remaining disabilities have a prevalence below 1.2%.

3.4 Elderly Population (60 years and above)

Rwanda has enacted laws such as the Law No 088/01 of 07/09/2020 (Office of the Official Gazette of Rwanda, 2020) on Presidential order ratifying the protocol to the African charter on human and peoples' rights on the rights of older persons in Africa adopted by the twenty sixth ordinary session of the Assembly, held in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia, on 31 January 2016 through an Official Gazette No.27 of 07/09/2020 and Law No.59/2008 of 10/09/2008 on prevention and punishment of gender- based violence (Office of the Official Gazette of Rwanda, 2008), whose Article 32 sets the penalty for violence against an elderly person.

It is over two decades since the United Nations convened the First World Assembly on Ageing (Vienna, 1982) (National Academy of Sciences, National Research Council, 2001)) that launched an international action programme, which was the first international instrument on ageing, to provide a foundation for the formulation of policies and programmes on ageing. This was done to guarantee economic and social security to older persons and other opportunities to contribute to national development.

3.4.1 Elderly population of Nyabihu District by sector

In 2022, the elderly persons constitute 6.3% of the total resident population of Nyabihu district. The share of the elderly females is higher than the male's one (7.5% vs. 4.9%), reflecting the higher life expectancy for women. By sector, Jomba (7.5%) has the highest share of elderly among their total population while Jenda has the lowest (4.6%).

3.4.2 Employment among elderly people

In Rwanda, people keep on working until old age, the share of employed persons among the elderly population stands at 28.2%. The aforementioned share is higher among the elderly males (33.7%) than elderly females (24.3%).

In Nyabihu district, 29.5% of elderly people were employed during the week preceding the time of the census. The percentage of employed elderly people is higher among males than females (35.5% vs. 26.0%). Employment among elderly residents is high Kabatwa (50.1%). It is low in Rugera (16.6%) and Jomba (17.9%) sectors.

3.4.3 Marital status of elderly people.

In Nyabihu district, more than half of the elderly population (63.8%) were married and 33.8 % were widowed. The rate of celibacy among elderly was 1.4% while divorce or separation rate is 1.1%. Marital status among the elderly varies slightly by sector of residence. Marriage among elderly people is more important in Rambura (55.4%) and Rurembo (53.0%) sectors. widowhood is widespread in Shyira (39.5%)

and Rugera (37.5% each) and lowest in Rambura (23.6%)sector. The table below illustrates distribution of elderly people across sectors.

CHAPTER 4: HOUSEHOLDS AND HOUSING CHARACTERISTICS

4.1 Household characteristics

In this chapter the 5th Population and housing census 2022 investigated households and housing characteristics; those include household size, head of household by sex, type of habitat, housing tenure, materials used for construction, sources of energy used for lighting and cooking, water sources, sanitation facilities, asset possessed by household and mode of waste and disposals.

4.1.1 Number of households and mean size of private households

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 indicate the total of 3,312,743 households in Rwanda, 671,506 in the Western province and 76,391 in Nyabihu District.

The average household size in Nyabihu District is 4.2 persons per household. At the Sector level, the highest sizes are found in Bigogwe (4.3 persons/household). The smallest household sizes are found in Shyira (3.9 persons/household). The table below indicates number of households and size of household members per sector.

4.1.2 Private households' heads of Nyabihu District

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 revealed that 28.9% of private households are headed by women at national level. In Nyabihu district, private households headed by females are 30.9%. At sector level, the highest percentages of households headed by women are found in Mukamira sector (35.1%) while the lowest is found in Kabatwa sector (26.4%).

4.2 Housing Characteristics

4.2.1 Type of habitat in Nyabihu District

The results of 5th Population and Housing Census 2022 revealed that in the Western province the predominant type of habitat is Planned rural settlement (Umudugudu) (70.5%). It is in same as in Nyabihu district as one of the districts of the Western province. The most common type of habitat in Nyabihu district is Planned rural settlement (61.8%) followed by dispersed or isolated housing (18.1%). The type of habitat varies across sectors. Spontaneous/squatter housing is most prevalent in Bigogwe (13.5%) and Kintobo (13.3%) and low in Rugera (0.2%) and not present in Kabatwa (0%). The sectors with the high percentages of dispersed/isolated housing units are Rurembo (45.8%) and Jomba (37.9%). The table below displays results by sector.



According to the area of residence, the predominant types is umudugudu/planned rural settlement (74.9%) in urban areas. In rural areas, the predominant types are umudugudu/planned rural settlement (57.6%) followed by dispersed/isolated housing (22.2%). The figures below indicate details:

4.2.2 Tenure of the housing in Nyabihu district.

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 indicate that the ownership of housing in the Western province represents 80.5% and tenant represent 13.5%. In Nyabihu district, 11.8% of housing units are occupied by tenants while 79.1% are occupied by their owners. At the sector level, the percentage of owners of households' units is high in Rurembo (88.1%), Jomba (87.8%) and Rugera (87.6%) and low in Bigogwe (68.8%), and Jenda (69.7%). The percentage of tenants of housing units is high in Bigogwe (26.2%), and Jenda (22.0%) and low in Rurembo (2.3%), Muringa (3.2%) and Jomba (3.3%). The table below indicate details:



According to the area of residence, 3 types of tenure of housing units (owners, tenants and free lodging) predominate in urban area as well as in rural area of Nyabihu district and their percentages vary substantially according to the area of residence. The percentage of owners of housing units is 65.7% in urban areas to 83.4% in rural areas. The percentage of tenants of housing units is 27.4% in urban areas to 6.9% in rural areas. The percentage of free lodging is 5.9% in urban areas to 9.2% in rural areas. The figures below indicate details:

4.2.3 Material of the housing units

4.2.3.1 Main materials of the roof

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 indicate that housing units are mainly covered by iron sheets in Rwanda (74.1%), in the Western province, the Iron sheets represent (59.0%). In Nyabihu district, housing units are mainly covered by iron sheets (54.2%) followed by local tiles (45.5%). Only 0.2% are covered by industrial tiles and no asbestos and concrete in the district. The variation by sector is not very significant. The high percentages of housing units covered by iron sheets are found in Kabatwa (97.9%) and Bigogwe (90.4%).

The lowest is Muringa with only 14.8% of housing units covered by local tiles. The highest percentage of the housing units covered by local tiles is found in Muringa sector (85%). The table below displays details:



The results of the census reveal that the materials used for roofing of the households' units in Nyabihu district vary according to the area of residence. In urban areas of Nyabihu district, the predominant roofing materials are iron sheets (76.4%) while in rural areas predominant roofing materials are local tiles (52.7%). The percentage of housing units covered by local tiles is 23.2% in urban areas while in rural areas 47.1% is covered by iron sheets. Housing units covered by others type of roofing materials are only 0.3% in urban areas and 0.2% in rural areas. The figure below illustrates details:

4.2.3.2 Main materials of the walls

The results of the census show that the main materials of the walls of the housing units mostly used are sundried bricks with cement: 36.3% in Rwanda. In the Western province, the main materials used for walls are sundried bricks without cement (47.5%) and 54.2% in Nyabihu district. At the national level, it is followed by sundried bricks without cement (30.7%) while the second most materials of the walls of the housing units in Western province and Nyabihu district are sundried bricks without cement (26.7% and 29.1% respectively). At the sector level, sun dried bricks without cement are the mostly used materials in Muringa (78.3%) and Jomba (75.2%). Sun dried bricks with cement is the most frequently used material in Bigogwe (46.4%) and Mukamira (41.0%). The table below displays details:



According to the area of residence, the main materials used for walls of the housing units in urban areas are mostly sun-dried bricks with cement (52.3%). Other materials used for walls with relative percentages are sun-dried bricks without cement (39.1%) and wood with mud without cement (2.8%). In rural areas, sun dried bricks without cement are predominant materials with (59.0%) followed by sun dried bricks without cement (21.7%) and wood with mud without cement (14.6%). 4.2.3.3 Main materials of the floor.


The results 5RPHC 2022 indicate that the main material of the floor of the housing units is Earth (60.4%) countrywide. In the Western province, Earth is the main material of the floor of the housing units (74.6%) followed by Cement (22.4%). In Nyabihu district, the main material of the floor of the housing units is earth (77.8%) followed by cement (20.2%). At sector level, the cement as main material used for the floor is most found in Bigogwe (37.1%) and Mukamira (35.8%). The highest percentage of the housing units with earth as main material used for the floor is found in Rurembo (92.9%), Muringa (92.1%) and Kintobo (91.2%). The table below displays details:

4.3 Source of energy of the private households

4.3.1 Grid line connectivity in Nyabihu district.

At national level, the results of the 5th RPHC 2022 revealed that 52.5% of private households are connected to the national grid while 47.5% are not. In the Western province, the percentage of private household connected to the national grid line is 49.0% while it is 41.2% in Nyabihu district. At the sector level, only four sectors out of twelve have higher percentages of private households connected to the national grid line (with more than a half of private households in the sector). Those are Bigogwe (58.2%), Kabatwa (57.6%), Mukamira (56.6%) and Jenda (53.8%). Sectors with lower percentages of private households connected to the national grid line are Rurembo (19.3%) and Karago (24.0%). The table below displays details:



4.3.2 Main source of energy for lighting in Nyabihu district.

In Nyabihu district, the main source of energy for lighting used by households is electricity (47.0%). At the sector level, the percentage of households using electricity for lighting is high in Bigogwe (61.4%) and Mukamira (60.4%). The sectors with the high percentages of private households using flashlight/phone flashlight for lighting are Rurembo (41.2%) and Karago (40.3%). Table below provides details:



According to the area of residence, the main source of energy for lighting is electricity (39.4%), followed by flashlight/phone flashlight (36.6%) and Firewood (18.7%) in rural areas. In urban areas, 71.1% of private

4.3.3 Main sources of energy for cooking in Nyabihu district


At the district level, the main sources of energy for cooking used by the private households are firewood (85.6%) followed by charcoal (13.6%). At the sector level, firewood is the most used source of cooking energy by private households in Rurembo (98.6%), Muringa (98.5%), Kintobo (98.0%) and Jomba (97.5%). Sectors with the high percentage of private households using charcoal as main source of cooking energy are Bigogwe (41.3%), Jenda (28.9%) and Kabatwa (21.1%). 4.3.4.1 Main source of drinking water


The results of 5RPHC 2022 reveal that improved drinking water source is the most water source used in Rwanda that represent 82.3%. In Nyabihu district, 77.9% of private households use improved water sources. At the sector level, the percentage of the private households using water from improved sources is highest in Kabatwa (99.9%) and Bigogwe (98.2%), and the lowest in Kintobo (49.7%). 
Figure 4. 9: Percentage of the private households of Nyabihu District by main source of water and by Sector

In Nyabihu district, both urban and rural areas, private households use mainly improved source of water (94.1% in urban and 72.8% in rural). 4.3.4.2 Main type of toilet facility

The results of census reveal that the main types of toilet facility used by the private households in Rwanda are Pit Latrine with constructed floor slab used by one household (68.8%), in Nyabihu district main types of toilet facility used by the private households are unshared Pit Latrine with constructed floor slab (72.9%), shared pit latrine with constructed floor slab used by several Hhs (17.1%) and not shared Pit Latrine without constructed floor slab (7.0%). At the sector level, the percentage of households using private or not shared pit latrines with constructed floor slab is high in Rugera (82.7%), Jomba (82.0%) and Karago (80.0%) while it is low in Jenda (58.5%). For shared pit latrines with constructed floor slab, Jenda (26.5%) and Bigogwe (23.3%) are the sectors with the high percentage of private households using this kind of toilet. the lowest percentage is found in Rugera (8.9%). 

The type of toilet facility used by the private households varies according to the area of residence in Nyabihu district. In urban areas, the types of toilets mostly used are pit latrine with constructed floor slab use by one household (67.8%) and pit latrines with constructed floor slab (25.0%) used by several households. In rural areas, the main types of toilets used is unshared pit latrines with constructed floor slab (74.5%) and shared pit latrine with constructed floor slab (14.6%) followed by shared pit latrines without constructed floor slab (7.9%). 4.3.4.3 Mode of waste disposal in Nyabihu district.

The results of the census reveal that, In Nyabihu district, the high percentage of households (51.7%) evacuate their waste in the household compost dumping while 39.5% throw them in their fields or bushes and only 6.5% evacuate the waste in the public compost dumping. At the Sector level, the household's compost dumping as main mode of waste disposal is the most used Jomba (66.6%), Kintobo (61.3%), Karago (60.8%) and Rugera (60.7%). The high percentage of households throwing waste in fields or bushes are in Kabatwa (70.9%). The table below indicates details:

The results of the census indicate the main modes of waste disposal used by the households by area of residence, in urban areas, household compost dumping is the main mode of waste disposal (46.1%). Other private households evacuate their domestic waste in the household's fields or in the bushes (40.2%) or in the public compost dumping (10.6%). In rural areas, the households evacuate their waste mainly by household

4.4 Assets possessed by private households in Nyabihu District

4.4.1 Communication assets possessed by private households in Nyabihu District

At the district level, 78.3% of private households possess a radio, 76.1% a mobile phone, 13.1% a smartphone, 4.1% a TV and 1.2% a computer. The percentage of private households possessing a radio is high in Mukamira (84.6%), Kabatwa (84.2%), Bigogwe (83.7%) and Jenda (80.4%). It is low in Muringa (70.6%). The percentage of private households possessing a television is high in Mukamira (9.1%) and Kabatwa (7.2%) while it is low in Rurembo (0.8%). Mobile phone is mostly possessed by private households of Bigogwe (82.8%), Kabatwa (82.6%) and Mukamira (82.5%). The sectors with high percentage of households with smartphone are Bigogwe (23.3%), Mukamira (21.6%), Jenda (16.2%) and Kabatwa (15.2%) while the percentage of households possessing this asset is low in Muringa (5.9%). The computer is mostly possessed in Mukamira (2.7%). The table below provides details:

4.4.2 Access to the Internet.

The results of the 5th RPHC-2022 indicate that the percentages of households with at least one member using internet are 22.2% at national level while they are 16.6% in the Western province and 13.7% in Nyabihu district. At sector level, the high percentage of households with at least one member using internet is high in Mukamira (23.4%) and Bigogwe (22.4%). The sectors with the lower percentages of households with at least one member using internet are Rurembo (6.7%) and Muringa (6.9%). The table below provides details:



According to the area of residence in Nyabihu district, the results of the census show that the access to the Internet varies greatly. CHAPITER 5: AGRICULTURE IN NYABIHU DISTRICT

The agriculture was the one of the areas of investigation of the 5th Rwanda Population and housing census conducted in 2022. The households engaged in Livestock husbandry; the number of private crop farming households cultivating different types of crops, by Sector, the number of private households raising different types of livestock, by Sector and type of household raised in district were captured in the census.

5.1 The households engaged in crop farming and livestock husbandly

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 revealed that Nationally, 2,280,854 of private households (68.9%) are engaged in agriculture, among them 62.6% are engaged in crop farming and 50.4% are engaged in Livestock husbandry. Nyabihu district is the one of districts of the Western province where crop farming and animal husbandly are on large scale. In Nyabihu district, Agricultural households occupy 68.9% with 64.3% of households engaged in crop farming and 51.9% Households engaged in Livestock husbandry. A big part of Nyabihu district sectors is located in rural areas where the agriculture activities are applied, Rurembo sector has a high proportion of Households engaged in crop farming (89.7%) and Households engaged in Livestock husbandry (70.7%). 5.2 Distribution of private household engaged in crop farming of different types of crops, by Sector

The results of 5th Population and housing census 2022 indicate that the most cultivated crops by the private households of Nyabihu district are beans, maize, fruits, Irish potatoes, sweet potato, wheat, vegetables, banana, cassava, sorghum, yams & taro and soybean. Those households that apply agriculture activities are found in almost all the sectors of Nyabihu district.

5.3 Distribution of private households engaged in raising different types of livestock, by Sector

Nationally and in the Western province, the results of the census indicate that most private households are considerably more engaged in raising cows, goats, sheep, pigs and chicken than other livestock. In Nyabihu district, households are engaged more in raising cows, sheep and pigs than others. The sectors that have high proportion of private households that are engaged in livestock are: Rugera, Rurembo, Shyira, Muringa and Jomba where more than 2,000 households declared engaged in livestock.
