





The Fifth Rwanda Population and Housing Census (RPHC2022) was implemented by the National Institute of Statistics of Rwanda (NISR). Field work was conducted from August $16^{\rm th}$ to $30^{\rm th}$, 2022.
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FOREWORD

The Government of Rwanda, through the National Institute of Statistics of Rwanda (NISR) conducted the 2022 Rwanda Population and Housing Census to provide updated demographic, social and economic indicators for policy formulation and planning to support the national development agenda and track the implementation of national, regional, continental and global development goals, such as the First National Strategy for Transformation (NST1 2017-2024); the AU Agenda 2063; and the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

The Population and Housing Census in Rwanda dates back to the year 1978 when the first ever modern census was implemented. The second, third, and fourth censuses were carried out in 1991, 2002, and 2012 respectively. The 2022 Population and Housing Census marks therefore the Fifth in the series following the United Nations Recommendations to conduct a census every ten years.

Considering census' crucial importance for the planning process, the Government of Rwanda has made the Population and Housing Census a priority to be undertaken every 10 years and adopted the use of technologies for timely delivery of census results for use.

Results of the 2022 Population and Housing Census provide population numbers from national to the lowest administrative level, as well as demographic and socio-economic indicators at both national and district levels. The census remains the only national data collection exercise that can provide the lowest levels of disaggregation to support decentralised decision making across the country.

I would like therefore to take this opportunity to thank all stakeholders that contributed to the success of the 2022 Population and Housing Census. They include Ministries and other Government institutions, international organizations such as the World Bank (WB), the European Union (EU), the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA), One-UN, UN Women, UNICEF, UNECA, the United Kingdom AID (UKAID), the African Development Bank (AfDB), the USAID, Enabel, PARIS 21 and others for their support in diverse ways.

My special thanks go to the local government leaders from the province to the village levels who contributed a lot to the success of the 2022 Population and Housing Census. Exceptional gratitude to all enumerators, teachers and young people who collected the information and all respondents for their cooperation and dedication. The National Institute of Statistics of Rwanda (NISR) deserves special appreciation for the excellent operational and coordination of all census activities.

I finally recommend that the invaluable information contained in different thematic reports of the 5th Rwanda Population and Housing Census be used as updated evidence for all decision and policy making for the national, regional and global development programs.



CHAPTER 1: POPULATION SIZE, SPATIAL DISTRIBUTION, AND STRUCTURE

1.1 Size and spatial Distribution of the population

1.1.1 Size and Spatial Distribution of the Population of East Province

The 5th Rwanda Population and Housing Census (PHC5) has enumerated 3,563,145 residents in East Province, which represents 26.9% of the total population of Rwanda (13,246,394 residents). The population of the East Province is predominantly female; 1,828,751 are women corresponding to 51.3% of the total population of the East Province. Nyagatare is the most populated district with 653,861 residents in 2022. Its population represents 18.4% of the total residents' population of East Province. The least populated district in the East Province is Ngoma with 404,048 inhabitants, corresponding to 11.3% of the total resident population of East Province.

1.1.2 Population Density of the East Province by District

Population density is a measurement of population per unit land area. Density is the number of the inhabitant per Km². The Rwanda Population and Housing Census conducted in 2022 revealed that, the population density in Rwanda is 503 inhabitants per Km². The East Province has 2401 inhabitant per Km². The district with a high population density is Kicukiro with 2,944 Inhabitants per km². The district with a lowest population density is Nyagatare with 2,056 Inhabitants per km². The figure below indicates distribution of population density per district.




Figure 1. 2 Distribution of population density by sectors of Nyagatare District

1.1.3 Size and Spatial Distribution of the Population of Nyagatare District

The 5th Rwanda Population and Housing Census (PHC5) has enumerated 653,861 residents in Nyagatare District, which represent 18.4% of the total population of the East Province (3,563,145 residents). The population of Nyagatare District is predominantly female: 335,121 corresponding to 51.3 % of its total population. The results in previous table 1.1 indicates that, the population share of Nyagatare District is 18.4% of the total East Province population.

The table below 1.2 indicates the number of the population of Nyagatare District by sector, by sex and their shares across sectors to the total population of Nyagatare District. Females are predominant in all 14 sectors of the district. Karangazi (96,915 population), Rwimiyaga (82,620 population) and Nyagatare (81,915 Population) are the most populated sectors. They represent 14.8% 12.6 and 12.5% of the total population of Nyagatare District. The two less populated sectors are Kiyombe (18,801 inhabitants) and Mukama (25,659 inhabitants). They represent 2.9% and 3.9% of the total resident population of Nyagatare District, respectively.

1.1.4 Size and Spatial Distribution of the Population of Nyagatare District by residence area

The results of Rwanda Population and housing census 2022 revealed that, the total population of Rwanda are spatially distributed in rural area that represent 72.1% and urban area represent 27.9%. The East Province is predominantly rural (79.1%). Nyagatare District population is also predominantly rural 75.9% while rural represents 18.8%. The sectors of Nyagatare District which are entirely rural are Gatunda, Katabagemu, and Kiyombe. The table below 1.3 illustrates the results.


1.1.5 Size and Spatial Distribution of the Population of Nyagatare District

Nyagatare population is mostly young. 52.2% of the resident population of Nyagatare is under 20 years, as shown by the age pyramid (Figure 4), reflecting the high level of fertility in the recent past. The elderly (60 years and above) represents 5.6% of the total population of the district. The table below 1.4 illustrates the results, and more details of sectors are in the annex.

1.1.6 population share of some specific interventions target groups in Nyagatare District by sex.

The Rwanda population and housing census 2022 indicate the population on specific ages-based programs, policy and strategies interventions in health, education, employment and indicates the population categories in their respective characteristics such as children, youth, working population, among other things. For instance, children under five years for immunization programs (Under 5

years children), children in school age (3-17 years), people in the official working age group (16 years and above), etc. Knowing the size of such groups is of great importance for the design, implementation, monitoring, and evaluation of programs targeting such groups. The below table gives the size of the main interventions target groups by sex, and their share in the entire population of Nyagatare District. The population aged 0-17 represents 47.7% of the total population of the district, 16-30 years represent 27.2%; the economically active population aged 16 years and above represents 57.3% of the same population. The table below shows distribution of Nyagatare Districts population by targeted interventions by their age.

CHAPTER 2: CHARACTERISTICS OF THE POPULATION

2.1 Socio-cultural characteristics of the population

2.1.1 Nationality of the population of Nyagatare District

The results of 5th RPHC-2022 indicate that, the Rwandan population by nationality represent 99.1% and foreigners represent 0.9%. In the East province, foreigners represent 1.7% and Nyagatare District, the Rwandan by nationality represent 99.8% and foreigners represent 0.2% (1,441). All sectors of Nyagatare District have less than one percent with three that have the highest percentage of foreigners compared to others, which are Matimba (0.5%), Rwempasha and Nyagatare (0.4%). The table below illustrates the distribution of the population by nationality with their respective sectors of residence.

2.1.2 Religious affiliation of the resident population of Nyagatare District

In Nyagatare District, Christianity is the predominant religion: 28.7% are catholic, 21.3% are ADEPR, 19.4% are protestant, 12.6% are Adventists, and 8.7 are other Christians. Muslim are 1.4%, Jehovah witnesses are 0.9% and other religion are 3.6%. The resident population who declared themselves to be without religion are 3.1%. The table below displays details:

2.2 Marital Status of the resident population of Nyagatare District

2.2.1 Marital status by sector

The results of 5RPHC-2022 shows that 49.8% of the resident population of Nyagatare District aged 12 and above were living in union (Married to one wife/husband officially or, married to one wife /husband not officially or live in a polygamous union) at the time of the census, while 41.8% were never married. 4.3% were widowed, while separated and divorced were respectively 2.5% and 0.2%. At the sector level, two sectors, Mukama (51.7%) and Mimuri (51.1%), have the highest percentages of the currently married people. Nyagatare (44.6%) and Rwempasha (44%) have the highest percentages of the never married persons. Karama, Gatunda, and Kiyombe sectors have high percentage of widowed persons (5.5%, 5.3% and 5.2% respectively). Details of the resident population of Nyagatare District aged 12 years and above by marital status and sex is presented in the annex.

2.2.2 Marital status by Age groups

The percentages of resident population of Nyagatare District by marital status vary by age: The percentage of never married persons decreases from 99.8% (age group of 12-14 years) to 1.3% (age group of 80 years and above). The percentage of persons currently living in union starts by increasing from 0.2% (age group of 12-14 years) to a maximum of 84.9% (age group of 40-44 years) before decreasing to 48.5% (age group 85+) due mainly to widowhood (47.4%). The highest percentage of the separated persons (4.6%) is found in age group 40-44 years.

2.3 Educational Characteristics of the Population of Nyagatare District

2.3.1 School attendance

Table 2.5 below shows that, in Nyagatare District, 50.7% of pre-primary-age population (3-5 years) are currently attending school, 49.3% of children have never attended. Rukomo Sector has the highest proportion of children (age between 3 to 5) currently attending school in Nyagatare District (63.6%). Karangazi sector has the lowest percentage of children currently attending pre- primary school, with only 40.4% enrolled.

Table 2.6 shows that in Nyagatare District 86.2% of children age 6 to 11 years (the official primary school-going age) are currently attending school 11.7% have never attended school and only 2.1% have previously attended school (which means that 13.8 of children aged 6 to 11 are out of school).

By comparing the distribution of the primary school-age population (6-11 years) across sectors in Nyagatare District, comparisons reveal the disparities in primary school attendance across different sectors within Nyagatare District. Sectors like Karangazi, and Musheri exhibit lower rates of children currently attending school (82.8 against 83.1%, respectively) and higher rates of children who have never attended (14.7 against 14.4%, respectively). On the other hand, sectors like Rukomo, Gatunda and Kiyombe demonstrate higher rates of children currently attending school (91%, 90.7% against 90%, respectively) and lower rates of children who have never attended (7.6, 8.1 against 8.0%, respectively).

In Nyagatare District 24.7.0% of the population aged 12 to 17 have previously attended school (i.e. they dropped out of school), 70.3% are currently attending school and 5% have never attended secondary school.

The distribution of the secondary school-age population (12-17 years) across sectors in Nyagatare District, shows that Rukomo sector has the highest percentage of the population aged 12 to 17 currently attending school at 77.1%. Conversely, Mimuri sector has the lowest percentage of the population aged 12 to 17 currently attending school with 63.6%. Mimuri Sector also has the highest percentage of the population between the ages of 12 and 17 who have never attended school at 6.9%.

2.3.2 Gross and Net Attendance Rate (%) in Primary School

Gross and Net Attendance Ratios are used to measure the extent of coverage of an educational program. It gives a comparison of the children attending school with the total size of the school-age population. It can also be used for assessing how far a country has succeeded in bringing to school all those who are eligible to attend.

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 reveal that not all children attending primary school level are of the official age for that level (6-11 years). The gross attendance rate in Rwanda is 141.7, in the East Province GAR is 141.7 and 140.1 in Nyagatare District. At sector level, GAR are greater than 134 in all sectors, with Gatunda having the biggest GAR (151). The net attendance rate (NAR) in Primary school for Nyagatare District (86.2%) is slightly below the NAR of the East Province (87.4%) and NAR of Nyagatare is lower than the NAR of national level (89.3%). The highest net attendance rate in primary school (91%) is in Rukomo sector followed by Gatunda sector with 90.7% while the sector with the lowest NAR is Karangazi with 82.8%. The table below displays results:

2.3.3. Gross and Net Attendance Rate (%) in Secondary School

The table 2.9 provides information on the gross and net attendance rates in the secondary school level (12-17 years) in Nyagatare District, disaggregated by sex and sector. The East Province and Nyagatare District both have lower NARs than the national average (19.2% and 18.6%, respectively, versus 22.3%) when compared to the national average. Comparing males and females in Nyagatare District in terms of Net Attendance Rates (NAR), the table 2. 9 indicates that a higher proportion of females 20.8%) in Nyagatare District, within the secondary school-age range (12-17 years), are attending school compared to males (16.4%). Female students older or younger than the official secondary school age range made up 43.2% [(GAR36.6-NAR20.8)/GAR36.6] of the female with secondary school age of Nyagatare District, while for male students it made up 50.3 % [(GAR33-NAR16.4)/GAR33].This shows that females have a higher attendance rate in Nyagatare District compared to males when considering the overall attendance rates, regardless of age or grade-level eligibility. At the sector level, the highest net attendance rate is in Matimba (24.4%) and Rukomo (23.7%) the lowest is in Karama and Musheri (14.6% and 15.1% respectively).

2.3.4 Highest level of school attended in Nyagatare District

The results of 5RPHC-2022 indicate the total population of Rwanda aged 3 and above is 11,999,691. The highest level of education attended is categorized into several levels: Never attended School, Nursery, Primary, INGOBOKA/Vocational, Lower secondary, Upper secondary, University, and Not stated. In Rwanda, 16.7% of the population aged 3 years and above has never attended school, while 2.7% have attended nursery, and 59.5% have attended primary school. Other education levels include 0.8% for INGOBOKA/Vocational, 9.6% for lower secondary, 7.1% for upper secondary, 3.6% for university, and 0.0% is not stated.

The population age 3 and above in East Province are 3,215,103. The distribution of the highest level of education attended is like the national level, with slight variations. In the East Province, 19.8% of the population has never attended school, while 3.3% have attended nursery, and 59.5% have attended primary school. Other education levels include 0.4% for INGOBOKA /Vocational, 9.0% for lower secondary, 5.8% for upper secondary, 2.1% for university, and 0.0% is not stated.

It also indicates that, among the population aged 3 years and above 589.280 in Nyagatare District, 19.8% of them has never attended any formal school, 59.5% attained the primary level, 9% attained lower secondary level, 5.8% has attended upper secondary and 2.1% attended university level. The level of educational attainment varies across sectors, Gatunda is highest percentage of primary school attainment (62.2%), Matimba is highest in upper secondary school attainment (7.8%), and Nyagatare has a high percentage of 6.3% of the population attended University than other sectors. The table below indicates the findings:

2.4 Characteristics of the Employed Population

The official working age in Rwanda is 16 years and above. Aggregate employment generally increases with growing population. Therefore, the ratio of Employment to the working age population (employment to population ratio) is an important indicator of the capacity of the Economy to provide employment to a growing population. A decline in the employment-to population ratio is often regarded as an indicator of economic slowdown and a decline in total employment as an indicator of a more severe economic downturn.

2.4.1 Employment to population ratio by sex, Province, District and area of residence

The results presented in the below table 2.9 shows that the employment to population ratio stood at 45.9% in Rwanda, it is lower among females (40.2 percent) than males (52.4%). On the other side, it was observed that the employment to population ratio is higher in urban areas of Rwanda (53.5%) than in rural areas (42.7%).

It was observed that in East Province, the employment to population ratio stood at 47.9 percent, it is higher in urban areas (53.1%) than in rural areas of East Province (46.5%).

It was also revealed that the employment to population ratio is 51.5% among people residing in Nyagatare district, it is higher in urban areas of Nyagatare (54.0%) than in rural areas of Nyagatare (48.7%).



2.4.2 Employment to population ratio (EPR) among the resident population of Nyagatare aged 16 years and above by age group and sex.

Figure 2.1 allows the study of the calendar and intensity of labor force participation and its variation by sex. The figure reveals the following remarks: Early entry and late exit to the labor market in Nyagatare District were around 25.3% at age 16 (the official age for entry into the labour market) and above 43.4% at 60 years (official age of retirement). Labor force participation is intense between ages 25 and 60 with an average of 63.3% of male and 49.3% of female population in labor market. Important gender disparities are remarkable in labor force participation at all age groups; males contribute more than females to labor force.

2.4.3 Proportion of Youth (16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training in city of Kigali by sex, district, and area of residence.

The results of 5RPHC-2022 indicate that, In Rwanda the proportion of Youth (16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training stood at 39.5%. It is higher among females (43.8%) than males (34.9%).

In East Province, the proportion of youth (16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training is 38.9%, it is lower among males (31.9%) than females (43.1%). 2022 census results also revealed that the aforementioned proportion is higher in rural areas of East (40.7%) than in urban areas of Kigali (32.5 percent).

The proportion of youth (16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training among people residing in Nyagatare District stood at 35.1%. It is much higher (36.4 percent) among people residing in rural areas of Nyagatare district than the ones residing in urban areas of Nyagatare District (31.4 percent). The differentials at sector levels are also shown in table 2. 12 below.

3.1 Children Population (0-17 years)

According to the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child (1989), a child is defined as every human being under 18 unless, under the law applicable to the child, majority is attended earlier. It is relevant to underline here that this definition by age coincides with that of Rwanda, as stipulated in Article 3 of the National Law n° 54/2011 of 14 December 2011 relating to the rights and the protection of the child, which stipulates that a child is any person under the age of 18. The age range (0-17) adopted for this report reflects this definition.

3.1.1 The number and share of children age 0-17 years among the total resident population of Nyagatare District by sex and sector of residence

The results of 5Th RPHC-2022 revealed that, the children population constitute 44.5% of the total population of 13,246,394. The East Province has 1,656,727 children with a share of 46.5% of the total resident population. In Nyagatare District, the children constitute 47.7% of the resident population of the district, with a percentage of males slightly greater than the females' one (49.2% vs 46.2%). The children's share is high in Rwimiyaga (49.9%) and Musheri (49.3%), and small in Kiyombe (43.1%) and Mukama (43.7%). The table below indicate distribution of children by sector and by sex.

3.1.2 Children with legal birth registration in Nyagatare District

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 indicate the percentage of children whose birth was registered is 94.3% at the national level. The birth registration rate in Nyagatare District is 90.6%. Birth registration performance is almost the same in urban (90.3%) and (90.6%) in the rural areas of Nyagatare District. The table below illustrates the findings:

3.1.3 Birth registration by sector

The results of 5th RPHC-2022 indicate that birth registration varies across sectors and areas of residence (urban and rural), Gatunda, Katabagemu and Kiyombe sectors have not urban areas. High percentages of birth registrations are found in Gatunda (94.9%), Katabagemu (94.1%) and Kiyombe with Rukomo (94.0%) while the lowest is in Karangazi (86.0%). The percentage of birth registration for males is almost the same as the one for females along with Urban and rural areas which also have almost the same registration rate.

3.2 Youth population in Rwanda

For statistical purposes, the United Nations defines "youth" as those persons between the ages of 15 and 24 years, without prejudice to other definitions by Member States. Considering the current priorities and trends of Rwanda's Development, the definition of Youth in terms of age has been revised in this policy. It was brought from 14-35 years to 16-30 years.

3.2.1 The youth population in Nyagatare District

The results of 5th Population and housing Censuses conducted in 2022 revealed that, the youth represent 27.14% (3,595,670) of the total population (13,246,394). The youth population in Nyagatare District is 177,981 which represents 27.2% of the total resident population of the district (653,8).61 The sector with the highest youth share is Nyagatare (29.7%) while Matimba (25.8%) has the lowest share of youth. The table below indicate distribution of youth by sector, and by sex.

3.2.2 Educational characteristics of youth

Youth who never attended school represent 5.15% of the youth resident population at national level; it represents 6% of the total resident population in East Province and 7.5% of the total resident population of Nyagatare District. The percentage of youth who never attended school varies a lot within sectors of Nyagatare District. The highest percentage was registered in Karangazi 9.7%) while the lowest percentages were registered in Kiyombe (4.2%), Gatunda (4.5%) and Rukomo (4.8%).

3.2.3 Highest level of education attended by youth in Nyagatare District

In Nyagatare District, among all youths, 53.7% attended only the primary school level, 20.7% attended the lower secondary education, 13.8% attended the upper secondary education, 3.6% attended university, and 7.5% have not attended any formal of school. The highest level of education attended varies across sectors of the district. The sectors with the highest percentage of youth with University level is high in Nyagatare (11.3%), while other sectors have an attainment less then 3.5%. In upper secondary education is Matimba (19%) the one with lowest attainment are Mimuri (10.5%) and Mukama with Katabagemu (10.6%) The sectors with the highest percentages of youth with primary education are Mukama (61.5%) and Mimuri (60.7%). 3.2.4 Employment to population ratio among youth (16-30)

The Census results showed that In Rwanda the employment to population ratio among youth stands at 40.3%, it is higher among males than females 44.8% and 36.2% respectively. It was observed that in the district of Nyagatare, the employment to population ratio among youth stands at 45.6%, it is higher in among males (47.7%) than females (43.5%)

The highest employment to population ratio among youth in Nyagatare District was observed in Katabagemu (58.7%), and Mimuri (58.3%), the lowest employment to population ratio among youth was observed in Tabagwe (37.7%), and Musheri (39.8%).

3.2.5 Distribution (%) of the currently employed youth age 16-30 years by Province, District, Sector and status in employment

In Nyagatare District, most of the youth aged 16-30 currently employed are employees (64.5%) followed by self-employed (25.3%). The highest percentage of youth employees is found in Musheri (76.3%), while the lowest is in Kiyombe (43.3%). 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3.3 Persons with disabilities

In 2015, 193 countries agreed to the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and its Sustainable Development Goals with a commitment where possible, "to disaggregate the statistics they generate by disability to provide important insights about the extent to which persons with disabilities (PWDs) are being included in society, benefit from government programmes, or are included in the workforce.

3.3.1 Distribution of persons with disabilities of Nyagatare District aged 5 years and above by Sector of residence and sex

At the national level, 3.4% of the resident population aged 5 years and above have a disability. while in Nyagatare District the disability prevalence rate is 3.7%. At sector level, the highest prevalence rates of the resident population aged 5 years and above with disability are in Kiyombe (4.7%) and Matimba (4.5%) while the lowest is in Tabagwe and Nyagatare (3.1% and 3.2%) respectively.

3.4 Elderly Population (60 years and above)

Rwanda has enacted laws such as the Law No 088/01 of 07/09/2020 (Office of the Official Gazette of Rwanda, 2020) on Presidential order ratifying the protocol to the African charter on human and peoples' rights on the rights of older persons in Africa adopted by the twenty sixth ordinary session of the Assembly, held in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia, on 31 January 2016 through an Official Gazette No.27 of 07/09/2020 and Law No.59/2008 of 10/09/2008 on prevention and punishment of gender- based violence (Office of the Official Gazette of Rwanda, 2008), whose Article 32 sets the penalty for violence against an elderly person.

It is over two decades since the United Nations convened the First World Assembly on Ageing (Vienna, 1982) (National Academy of Sciences, National Research Council, 2001)) that launched an international action program, which was the first international instrument on ageing, to provide a foundation for the formulation of policies and programmes on ageing. This was done to guarantee economic and social security to older persons and other opportunities to contribute to national development.

3.4.1 Elderly population of Nyagatare district by Sector

In 2022, the elderly persons constitute 5.6% of the total resident population of Nyagatare District. The share of the elderly females is higher than the male's one (6.1% vs. 5.1%), reflecting the higher life expectancy for women.

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3.4.2 Employment among elderly people

In Rwanda, people keep on working until old age, the share of employed persons among the elderly population stands at 28.2%. The aforementioned share is higher among the elderly males (33.7%) than elderly females (24.3%). In Nyagatare District, 38.1% of elderly people were Employed, The Employment is Higher among males (45.1) than females (32.6). Elderly residents of Mimuri (47.5%) and Katabagemu (46.4%) are highly employed while in Tabagwe sector (29.6%) and Musheri (29.9) they are least employed.

3.4.3 Marital status of elderly people

In Nyagatare District, more than half of the elderly population (67%) were married and 29.1% were widowed. The rate of celibacy among elderly was 1.3% while divorce or separation rate is 2.6%. Marital status among the elderly varies slightly by sector of residence. Marriage among elderly people is more important in Katabagemu (72,7%) and Rwempasha (70.6%) sectors. widowhood is widespread in Mimuri (35.1%) and Tabagwe (33.1% each). The table below illustrates distribution of elderly people across sectors.

4.1 Household characteristics

In this chapter 5th Population and housing census 2022 investigated households and housing characteristics; those include household size, head of household by sex, type of habitat, housing tenure, materials used for construction, sources of energy used for lighting and cooking, water sources, sanitation facilities, asset possessed by household and mode of waste and disposals.

4.1.1 Number of households and size of household members

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 indicate that there is a total of 3,312,743 Private households in Rwanda, 886,132 in the East Province and 160,435 in Nyagatare District. The average household size in Nyagatare District is 4.1 persons per household. At the Sector level, the highest sizes are found in Musheri (4.4 persons/household) and Rwimiyaga (4.3 persons/household). The smallest household sizes are found in Mimuri (3.7 persons/household). The table below indicates number of households and size of household members per sector.

4.1.2 Private households' heads of Nyagatare District

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 revealed that nationally 28.9% of private households are headed by women. In Nyagatare District, private households headed by females are 27.9%. At sector level, the highest percentages of households headed by women are found in Matimba sector (32.3%) Gatunda (30.4%) and Karama sector (30.2%) while the lowest is found in Rwimiyaga

4.2 Housing Characteristics

4.2.1 Type of habitat


The results of 5th Population and Housing Census 2022 revealed that in the East Province the predominant type of habitat is Umudugudu planned Rural settlement (86.5%) and Dispersed/Isolated housing (7.4%). The most common type of habitat in Nyagatare District is also planned Rural settlement (84.4%) followed by Dispersed/Isolated housing (10.5%) and Spontaneous/squatter housing (2.3%). The type of habitat does not vary across sectors since they are predominantly rural. Planned Rural settlement is most prevalent in all Sectors of Nyagatare, very high in Karama (97%) and Gatunda (68.7%) and low in Rwempasha (53.8%). The sectors with the highest percentages of dispersed/isolated housing units are Rwempasha (26.9%). The table below displays results by sector.

The type of habitat in Nyagatare District does not vary according to the area of residence. In both urban Rural areas, the predominant types are planned Rural settlement (89.1% and 82.8% respectively) and Dispersed/ Isolated housing is the second most predominant, (5% and 10.5% respectively). 4.2.2 Tenure of the housing in Nyagatare District

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 indicate that the ownership of housing in the East Province represents 72.1% and tenants represent 21.1%. In Nyagatare District, 68.4% of housing units are occupied by owner while 26% are occupied by their tenant. At the sector level, the percentage of owners of households' units is high in Kiyombe (88.1%), Gatunda (80.3%) and Karama (79%) and low in Nyagatare (53.7%), and Rwempasha (55.5%). The percentage of tenants of housing units is high in Nyagatare (40.3%), Rwempasha (39.5%), and Matimba (34.5%) and low in Kiyombe (8.3%). The table below indicate details:



In Nyagatare District, 3 types of tenure of housing units (owners, tenants and free lodging) are predominate in urban area as well as in rural area and their percentages vary substantially according to the area of residence. The percentage of owners of housing units is 54.5% in urban areas to 73% in rural areas, The percentage of tenants of housing units is 40.3% in urban areas to 21.3% in rural areas. The percentage of free lodging is same 3.2% in urban and rural areas. The figures below indicate details:

4.2.3 Material of the housing units in Nyagatare District

4.2.3.1 Main materials of the roof

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 indicate that housing units are mainly covered by iron sheets in Rwanda (74.1%), in the East province, the Iron sheet represent (98.9%). In Nyagatare District, housing units are mainly covered by iron sheets (99.4%). Only 0.3% are covered by local tiles, 0.1% by non-durable roofing and 0.1% by other material. The variation by sector is not very significant. The table below displays details:





The results of the census reveal that the materials used for roofing of the households' units in Nyagatare District is mostly Iron sheet. In both rural and urban areas of Nyagatare District, the predominant roofing materials are the iron sheets (99.3% in rural and 99.8% in urban areas). The percentage of housing units covered by local tiles is less than one percent in rural and urban areas. The figure below illustrates details:

4.2.3.2 Main materials of the walls

The results of the census show that the housing units wall are mostly built with sundried bricks in Rwanda (67%), and 66.9% in the East province. In Nyagatare District, walls of the housing units are also mostly built with sundried bricks (91%) and wood/mud (5.9%). At the sector level, sun dried bricks are the mostly used materials in Katabagemu (97.6%), Musheri (95.8%) and Karama (94.5%). Wood/mud is the most frequently used material in Kiyombe (28.1%) and Matimba (13.4%). The table below displays details:



The main materials used for walls of the housing units in Nyagatare District are mostly sundried bricks, wood with mud and burnt bricks and their percentages vary substantially according to the area of residence. In urban areas, the predominant materials are sundried bricks (90%) followed by burnt bricks (6.2%) and wood with mud (2.5%). In rural areas, sundried bricks are predominant materials with 91.30% followed by wood with mud (7.2%) and burnt bricks (0.7%). The figure below provides details:

4.2.3.3 Main materials of the floor

The results 5RPHC 2022 indicate that the main material of the floor in the housing units is earth (60.4%) followed by cement (31.2%) countrywide. In the East province, the Earth is the main material of the floor of the housing units (60.9%). In Nyagatare District, the main material of the floor of the housing units is also Earth (64.9%) followed by Cement (31.9%) and Dung hardened (2%). At sector level, the Earth as the main material used for the floor. With Kiyombe and Mukama having the highest prevalence (83.6% and 81.7% respectively), it is less prevalent in Nyagatare Sector (49.4%) which uses at high level the cement (46.4%). Other housing units using Cement as main material for the floor are Matimba (40.3%) and Karangazi (37.4%). The table below displays details:



The results of census indicate the main materials used for floor of the housing units in Nyagatare District are mostly earth, cement and dung hardened. In urban areas, the predominant materials are cement (51.9%) followed by earth (44.7%) and Ceramic/clays/Granite tiles (1.8%). In rural areas, the predominant materials are earth (71.7%) and cement (25.3%). The figure below provides details:

4.3 Source of energy of the private households

4.3.1 Grid line connectivity in Nyagatare district

At national level, the results of the 5th RPHC 2022 revealed that 52.5% of private households are connected to the national grid while 47.2% are not connected. In East Province, the percentage of private household connected to the national grid line is 47.3% while it is 43.7% in Nyagatare district. At the sector level, Rukomo sector is the most connected (60.8%) of private households. Rwempasha is the least connected with (26.6%) of private household. The table below displays details:



4.3.2 Main source of energy for lighting in Nyagatare district

In Nyagatare District, the main source of energy for lighting used by households is electricity (54.5%). At the sector level, the percentage of households using electricity for lighting is high in Matimba (68.6% each), Rukomo (63.9%), Nyagatare (63.8%) and Karama (62.5%). The sectors with the high percentages of private households using flashlight/phone flashlight for lighting are Katabagemu (47.7%), Rwempasha and Tabagwe (43.4%). Table below provides details:



The sources of energy for lighting in Nyagatare District are mainly electricity, flashlight/phone flashlight and candles. However, the percentages of households using them vary by area of residence. In urban areas, the main source of energy for lighting is electricity (66.7%), followed by flashlight/phone flashlight (26%) and candles (3.2%). In rural areas, 50.6% of private households use electricity as main source of energy for lighting while 40.6% use flashlight and 2.6% use candles. The figure provides details:

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4.3.3 Main sources of energy for cooking in Nyagatare District


At the District level, the main sources of energy for cooking used by the private households are firewood (83.6%) followed by charcoal (7.1%) and crop waste (5.6%). At the sector level, firewood is the most used source of cooking energy by private households. It is very high in Kiyombe (95.8%) and Mukama (94.9%). Sectors with the high percentage of private households using charcoal are Nyagatare (18.8%), Matimba (9.2%) and Rwimiyaga (8.5%). Sectors with the highest percentages of private households using crop waste as main source of cooking energy are Katabagemu (17.4%), Musheri (11.2%) and Tabagwe (9.9%). The main sources of energy for cooking used by private households in Nyagatare District vary by area of residence. In Rural areas, private households use mostly firewood (88.6%) and crop waste (6.2%). In urban areas, private households use most firewood (68.4%) and charcoal (19.4%). 4.3.4 Water and sanitation of the private households in Nyagatare District

4.3.4.1 Main source of drinking water

The results of 5RPHC 2022 reveal that improved water source is the most water sources in Rwanda that represent (82.3%). In Nyagatare District, 78% of private households use improved water sources. At the sector level, the percentage of the private households using water from improved sources is highest in Rukomo (99.9%), and the lowest in Kiyombe (56.9%). The table below provides details:






Figure 4. 9 Distribution (%) of the private households of Nyagatare District by main source of water and by Sector

In Nyagatare District, both urban and rural areas, private households use mainly improved source of water (90.6% in urban and 73.9% in rural). The percentage of private households using unimproved source of water is higher in rural (26.1%) than in urban (9.4%). More details are displayed in figure below:





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4.3.4.2 Main type of toilet facility

The results of census reveal that the main types of toilet facility used by the private households in Rwanda are not shared Pit Latrine with constructed floor slab (68.8%), in Nyagatare District main types of toilet facility used by the private households are Pit Latrine

with constructed floor slab (74.3%), Shared Pit Latrine with constructed floor slab (18.7%) and Not shared Pit Latrine without constructed floor slab (4.7%). At the sector level, the percentage of households using private or not shared pit latrines with constructed floor slab is high in all sectors, with Karama (84.4%) on the first place followed by Kiyombe (84%) while it is low in Nyagatare (59.5%) and Rwempasha (63.6%). Shared Pit Latrine with constructed floor slab high percentages of households using this type are found in Nyagatare (30,2%) and Rwempasha (29.6%). For pit latrines with constructed floor slab used by one household, Mukama (8%) and Mimuri (7.1%) are the sectors with the high percentage of private households using this kind of toilet. the lowest percentage is found in Matimba (1.7%). The table below indicates the types of toilets facilities.



The type of toilet facility used by the private households varies according to the area of residence in Nyagatare District. In urban areas, the types of toilets most used are not shared pit latrine with constructed floor slab (64.9%) and shared pit latrines with constructed floor

slab (29.1%) followed by pit latrine without constructed floor slab (3.1%). In rural areas, the main types of toilets used is not shared pit latrines with constructed floor slab (77.5%) and shared pit latrine with constructed floor slab (15.2%). The figure below indicates details:

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4.3.4.3 Mode of waste disposal in Nyagatare District

The results of the census reveal that, In Nyagatare District, the high percentage of households (62.8%) put their waste in a household compost dumping while 27.5% of private households evacuate their waste in the household's fields and 3.9% in a public compost dumping. At the Sector level, all households put their waste mainly in a household compost dumping, Tabagwe (72.8% and Matimba (69.5%) are the highest. The household's fields are the second used mode of waste disposal it is highest in Kiyombe (36%), Musheri (35.2%) and Rwimiyaga (34.9%). The table below indicates details:

The results of the census indicate the main modes of waste disposal used by the households. modes of waste disposal used vary by area of residence, in urban areas, domestic waste is mainly put in a household compost dumping (58.1%). Other private households evacuate their domestic waste in the household's fields or in the bushes (22%) or iare collected by companies (12%). In rural areas, the households evacuate their waste mainly by compost dumping (64.4%) and others in their fields or in the bushes (29.3%). The figure below illustrates details:

4.4 Assets possessed by private households in Nyagatare District

4.4.1 Communication assets possessed by private households in Nyagatare District

At the district level, 81.9% of private households possess a radio, 78.9% a mobile phone, 14.9% a smartphone, 8.5% a TV and 1.7% a computer. The percentage of private households possessing a radio is high in Matimba (87.7%), Nyagatare (86.3%), and Rwempasha (84.3%). It is low in Mimuri (72.7%). The percentage of private households possessing a television is high in Nyagatare (13.9%) and Matimba (12.3%) while it is low in (Kiyombe (2.4%). Mobile phone is mostly possessed by private households of Matimba and Nyagatare (85.1% and 84.3% each), followed by Rwempasha (82.2%). The sectors with high percentage of households with smartphone are Nyagatare (27.1%), and Matimba (20.4%) while the percentage of households possessing this asset is low in Mukama (7.3%). The computer is mostly possessed in Nyagatare (4.6%). The table below provides details:

4.4.2 Access to the Internet

The results of the 5th RPHC-2022 indicate that the percentages of households with at least one member using internet are 22.2% at national level while they are 18.1% in East province and 16.8% in Nyagatare district. At sector level, the high percentage of households with at least one member using internet is high in Nyagatare (29.7%), Matimba (22.1%) and Karangazi (17.3%). The sectors with the lower percentages of households with at least one member using internet is Mukama (10.1%).



The results of the census show that the access to the Internet varies greatly in accordance with the area of residence in Nyagatare District. CHAPTER 5: AGRICULTURE IN NYAGATARE DISTRICT

The agriculture was the one of the areas of investigation of the 5th Rwanda Population and housing census conducted in 2022. The households engaged in Livestock husbandry; the number of private crop farming households cultivating different types of crops, by Sector, the number of private households raising different types of livestock, by Sector and type of household raised in district were captured in the census.

5.1 The households engaged in crop farming and livestock husbandly

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 revealed that nationally, 2,280,854 of private households (68.9%) are engaged in agriculture, among them 62.6% are engaged in crop farming and 50.4% are engaged in Livestock husbandry. In Nyagatare District, Agricultural households occupy (66.3%) with 59.3% of households engaged in crop farming and 39.2% Households engaged in Livestock husbandry. Nyagatare District is mostly rural where the agriculture activities are practiced on high scale. Kiyombe sector has a high proportion of Households engaged in crop farming (84.7%) and Households engaged in Livestock husbandry (60.5%). The table below provides details:

5.2 Distribution of private household engaged in crop farming of different types of crops, by Sector

The results of 5th Population and housing census 2022 indicate that the most cultivated crops by the private households of Nyagatare District are maize, beans, fruits, cassava, sorghum, Banana, sweet potato, soybean and vegetables. There are differences on the crop that is most cultivated in each sector; Karangazi is the cultivates a big variety of crops, Maize, bean and fruits being the predominant. Rwimiyaga follows with also mostly Maize, bean, and fruits as principal crop. Matimba is the sector that cultivates less crops of the same kind. While Kiyombe is the sector that does not cultivates Maize as its principal crop, rather it is Beans, Sorghum and fruits.

5.3 Distribution of private households engaged in raising different types of livestock, by Sector

Nationally and in the East province, the results of the census indicate that most private households are considerably more engaged in raising cows, goats, and chicken than other livestock. Nyagatare District also follows the same pattern. The sectors that have a high proportion of private households that are engaged in livestock are: Karangazi with 3661 goats and 3,249 Cows followed by Rwimiyaga with 3,392 Goats and 2,447 Chickens. Cows are predominant in Karangazi Sector (3,249 Cows), Katabagemu has the least number of cows (766 Cows). Goats are mostly raised in Karangazi (3,662 Goats) while Matimba has the least (1,416 Goats) Chickens are also predominant in Karangazi (2,989) while they are least in Kiyombe (796 Chickens).
