



- The 4th Rwanda Population and Housing Census (PHC4) has enumerated 2,589,975 residents in the Southern Province, which represent 24.6% of the total population of the Rwanda (10,515,973 residents).
- The population of the Southern Province predominantly female; 1,356,221 are women corresponding to 52.4% of the total population of the province.
- Nyamagabe, Kamonyi are the mostly populated Districts with about 340 and 341 thousands residents respectively. Their populations represent, respectively, 13.2%, 13.1% of the total resident population of the Southern Province.
- The least populated district is Nyaruguru with about 295 thousand inhabitants, corresponding to 11.4% of the total resident population of the Southern Province.
- Three districts with a high population density (Inhabitants /km²) are Huye (565 inhabitants /km²), Kamonyi (519 inhabitants /km²) and Ruhango (510 inhabitants /km²).
- Two districts with a low population density (Inhabitants /km²) are Nyaruguru (291inhabitants /km²), Nyamagabe (313 inhabitants /km²).

- The 4th Rwanda Population and Housing Census (PHC4) have enumerated 294,334 residents in Nyaruguru district, which represents 11.4% of the total population of the Southern Province (2 589 975 residents).
- The population of Nyaruguru district is predominantly female; **155,055** are women corresponding to 52.7% of the total resident population.
- Females are predominant in all Sectors of the District.
- Ruheru, Busanze and Rusenge are the mostly populated Sectors with over 24 thousands residents each. They represent 12.1%, 9.2% and 8.2% of the total population of District, respectively.
- Two less populated sectors are Mata (13.9 thousand inhabitants) and Munini (15.9 thousands inhabitants). They represent 4.7% and 5.4% of the total resident population of Nyaruguru District, respectively.




Figure 3: Population Density of Nyaruguru district by Sector in 2012

- Nyaruguru district population is predominantly rural: 98% of the resident population (2 88 412 inhabitants) lives in rural areas vs. 2% in urban areas.
- Kibeho is only urbanized sector with a share of 27.6%, the rest of sectors of Nyaruguru district with 100% of its population residing in rural areas.

- Nyaruguru population is mostly young. 63.9% of the resident population of Nyaruguru district is under 25 years old, as shown by the age pyramid (Figure 4), reflecting the high level of fertility in the recent past.
- The elderly (60 years and above) represent 5.8% of the total population of the District. The distribution of the resident population by age and by sector is in the annex.



- Some age groups are targets of specific interventions. For instance, children under five year for immunization programs, children in primary school age (7-12 years), people in the official working age group (16-64 years), etc.
- Knowing the size of such groups is of great importance for the design, implementation, monitoring and evaluation of programs targeting such groups.
 The above table gives the size of the main interventions target groups by sex, and their share in the entire population of Nyaruguru district.
- The population aged 0-17 represents 51.2% of the total population of the district. The economically active population aged 16 and 64 years represents 49.6%.

The percentages of the resident population of Nyaruguru district by marital status vary by sex and age:

- The percentage of the never married persons decreases quickly from 99.5% (age group of 12-14 years) to 1.9% (age group of 85 years and above).

- School attendance varies also across the sectors:
 - ➤ for the preschool-age, it varies from 9% in Muganza to 28% in Mata
 - ▶ for the primary school-age, it varies from 84.6% in Nyabimata to 95.6% in Mata, and
 - > for the secondary school, it varies from 71.8% in Nyagisozi to 86.3% in Mata

■ The gross attendance rates are greater than 100% in all sectors, with minor variations. The net attendance rate (NAR) in Primary school for Nyaruguru district

- (85.4%) is below the NAR at Province and National level (88% and 88.2%, respectively).
- The highest net attendance rate in primary school (94.1%) is in Mata sector followed by Ruramba sector with 92.8% while the sector with the less of NAR is Ruheru with 81.0%.

- Labour force participation rate is slightly higher among males than females in both urban (67.6% vs 63.2%) and rural areas (66.5% vs 65.3%).




Figure 5: Labour-force participation rate (LFPR) among the resident population aged 16 and above by age group and by sex

- Early entry and late exit to the labour market in Nyaruguru district. The LFPR is around 25% at age 16 (the official entry age in the labour market) and above 65% at 65 years (official age of retirement).
- Labour force participation is intense between ages 25 and 60 with above 75% of the population in the labour market.
- Some gender disparity is remarkable in labour force participation, where between 16 and 19 years, females contribute slightly more than males, while from at the age group 25-29 years to above, females contribute more than males to labour force.




Figure 6: Employed among children aged 5-17 in Nyaruguru district by age and by sex.




Figure 7: Distribution (%) of the private households in Nyaruguru District by type of habitat and by Area of residence




Figure 9: Distribution (%) of the private households in Nyaruguru District by main material of the roof and of the housing unit and by area of residence






Figure 11: Distribution (%) of the private households in Nyaruguru District by main source of energy for lighting and by area of residence







Figure 13: Distribution (%) of the private households in Nyaruguru District by improved and unimproved source of water and by Sector






Figure 14: Distribution (%) of the private households in Nyaruguru District by main source of water and by area of residence




Figure 15: Distribution (%) of the private households in Nyaruguru District by main type of toilet facility and by area of residence





Figure 16: Distribution (%) of the private households in Nyaruguru District by mode of waste disposal and by area of residence




Figure 17: Percentage of private households whose at least one member have access to the Internet by place of access and by area of residence
