



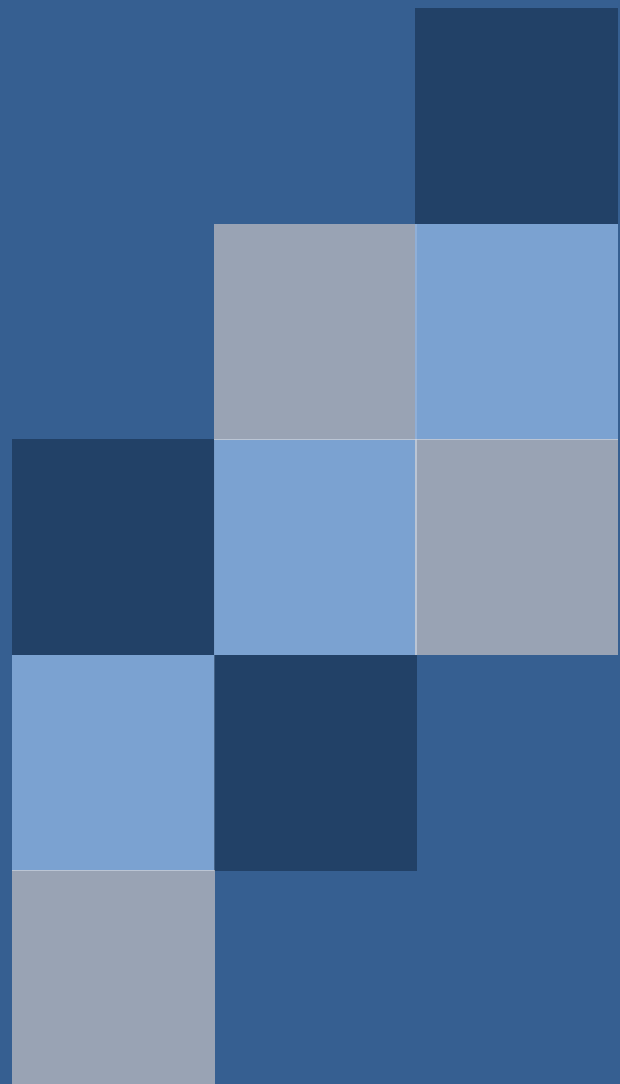

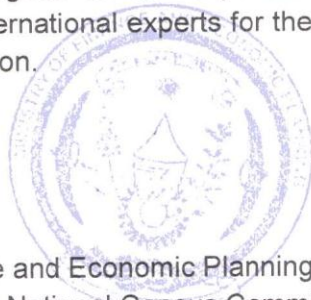

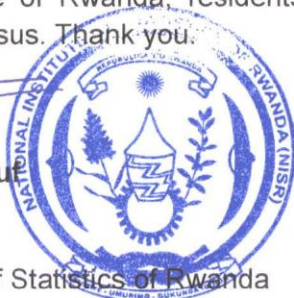


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Figure 1: Administrative map of Nyamagabe district

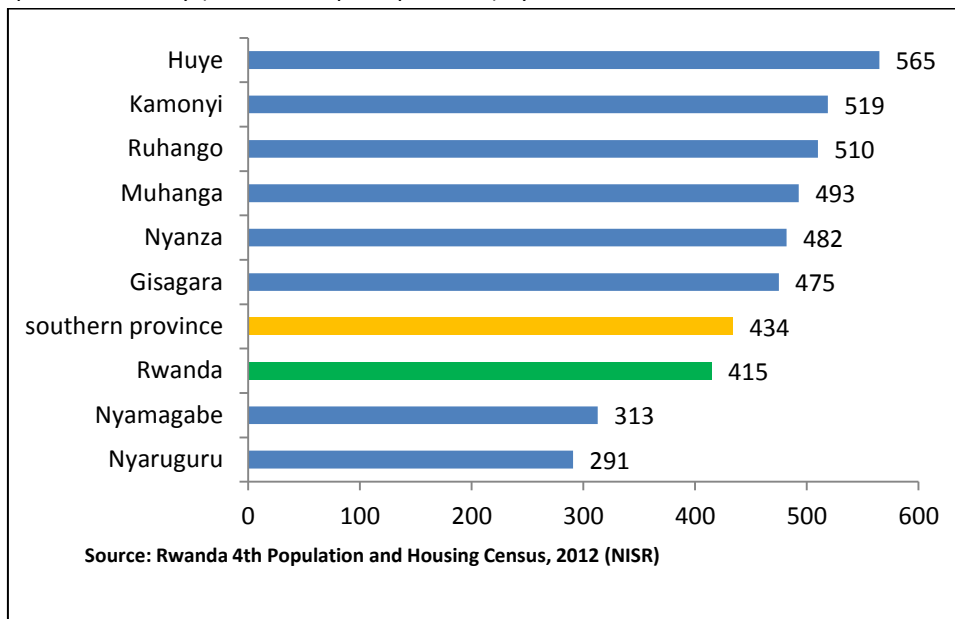

- The 4th Rwanda Population and Housing Census (PHC4) have enumerated 2,589,975 households, residents in the Southern Province represent 24.6% of the total population of Rwanda (10,515,973 residents).
- The population of the Southern Province is predominantly female; 1,356,221 corresponding to 52.4% of the total population of the province.
- Nyamagabe and Kamonyi are the most populated Districts with more than 340 thousand residents each. Their populations represent 13.2% and 13.1% respectively of the total resident population of the southern Province.
- The least populated District is Nyaruguru with about 294 thousand residents corresponding to 11.4% of the total resident population of the Southern Province.
- Three districts with a high population density (Inhabitants per km²) are Huye, (565 inhabitants per km²), Kamonyi (516 inhabitants per km²) and Ruhango (511 inhabitants per km²).
- Two districts with low population density (Inhabitants per Sq.km) are Nyaruguru (291 inhabitants per km²), Nyamagabe (313 inhabitants per km²)

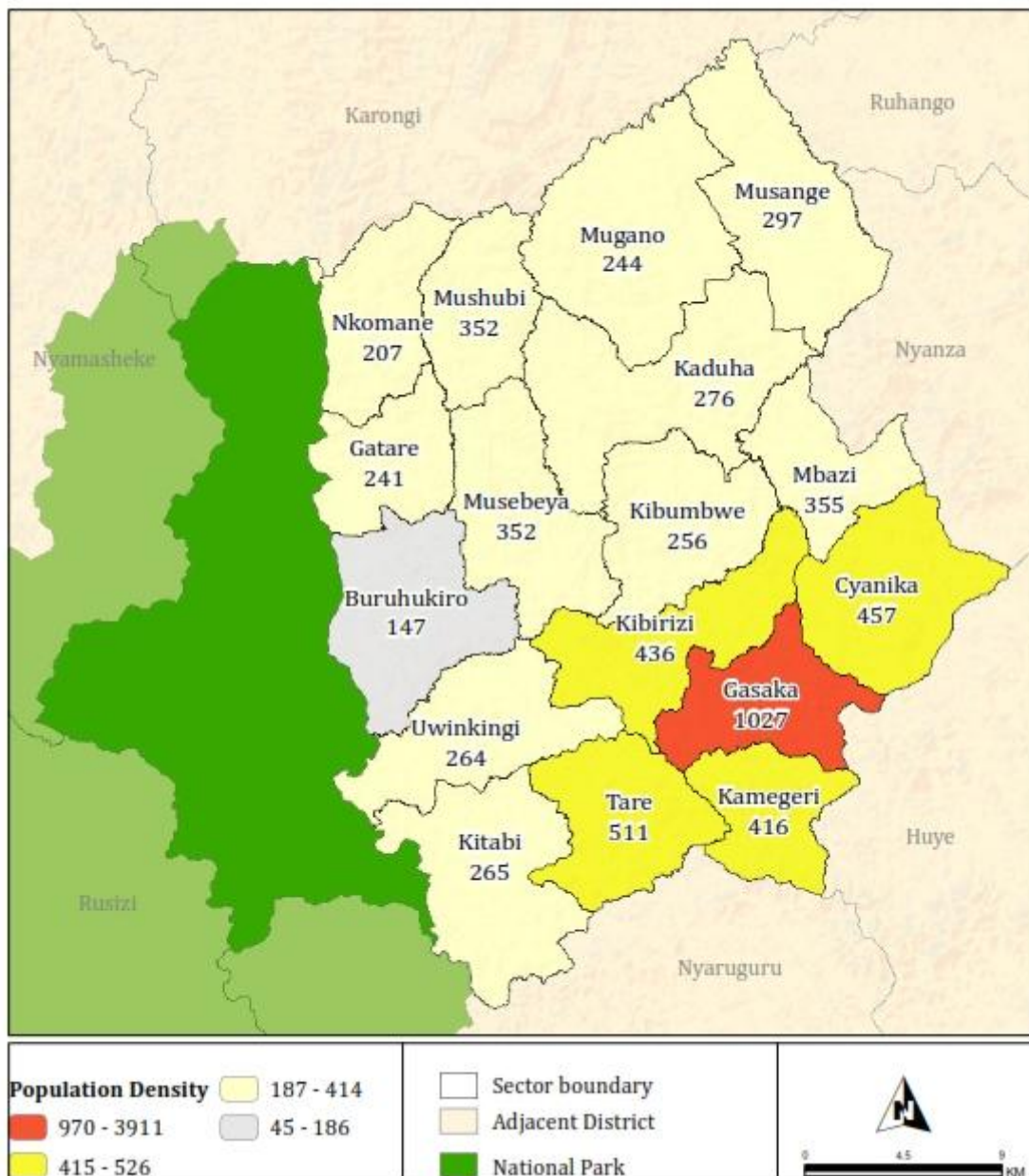

- The 4th Rwanda Population and Housing Census (PHC4) has enumerated 341,491 residents in Nyamagabe District, which represent 13.1% of the total population of the Southern Province (2,589,975)
- The population of Nyamagabe district is predominantly female; 180,272 are women corresponding to 52.8% of the total population.
- In each Sector of Nyamagabe district, the percentage of females is more than 50% except in Gasaka (49.9%) of the total population
- Gasaka is the mostly populated sector with over 40 thousands residents .It represents 12.2% of the total population of Nyamagabe district, .
- Mbazi, Kibumbwe and Mushubi are the least populated sectors in Nyamagabe district with 11,876, 12,518 and 12,777. residents respectively

- 7.3% of the population of Nyamagabe District resides in urban areas. Twelve of seventeen sectors in Kamonyi district are entirely rural.

- The population of Nyamagabe is mostly young, 63.4%% of the resident population of Nyamagabe is under 25 years old, as shown by the age pyramid (Figure 4), reflecting the high level of fertility in the recent past.
- The elderly (60 years and above) represent 6% of the total population of the District. The distribution of the resident population by age and by sector is in the annex.

Figure 4: Age pyramid of the resident population of Nyamagabe District in 2012

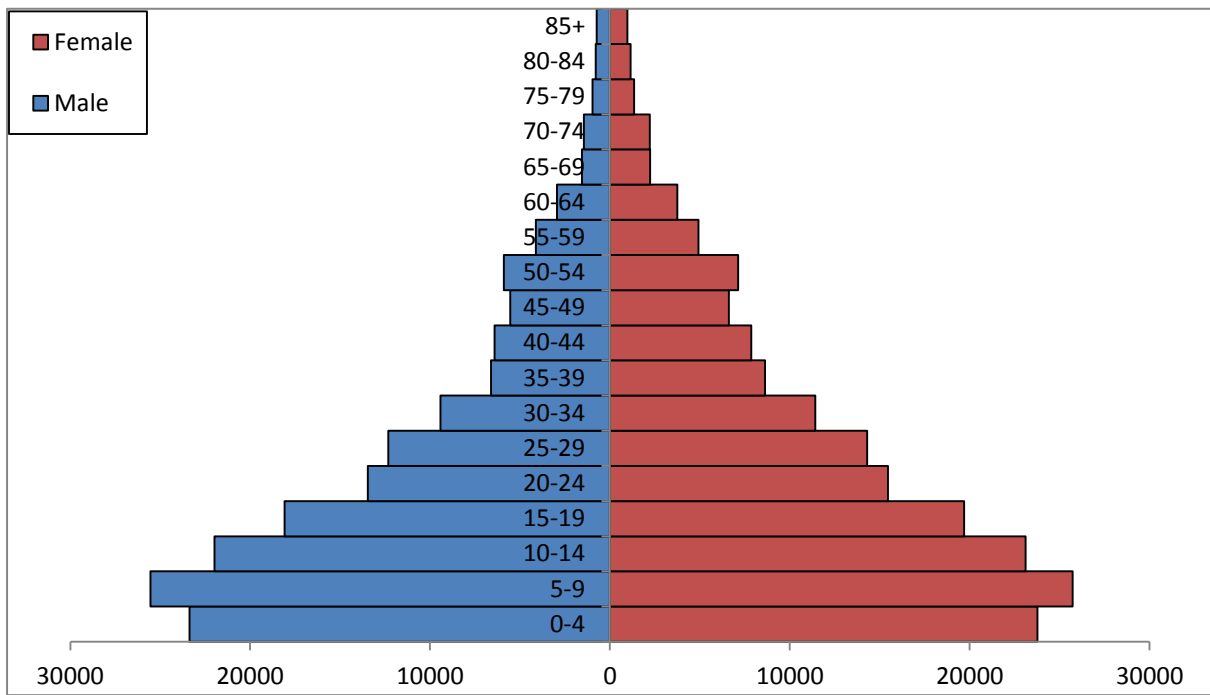

- Some age groups are targets of specific intervention. For instance children under five year for immunization programs, children in primary school age (7-12 years), people in the official e working age group (16-64 years), etc.
- Knowing the size of such groups is of great importance for the design, implementation, monitoring and evaluation of programs targeting such groups. The above table gives the size of the main interventions target groups by sex, and their share in the entire population of Nyamagabe district.
- The population aged 0-17 represents 49.2 % of the total population of the district. The economically active population aged 16 and 64 years represent 51.6%.

- (47.1%) of the resident population of Nyamagabe District aged 12 and above were married at the time of the census, while 44.9% were never married. Up to 6.2% were widowed, while separated and divorced are relatively few (0.6% and 1.3%, respectively).
- At the sector level,
 - Three sectors have the highest percentages of the married people :Buhuruhukiro (51.8%), Uwinkingi and Mugano sectors (49.2% each),
 - Nkomane sector has the high percentage of the never married persons (47%),
 - Musange, Kamegeri and Cyanika sectors have high percentage of widowed persons (above 7% each).

The percentages of the resident population of Nyamagabe district by marital status vary by sex and age:

- The percentage of never married persons decreases from 99.5% (age group of 12-14 years) to 2.2% (age group of 85 years and above).
- The percentage of persons currently married starts by increasing from 0.4% (age group of 12-14 years) to a maximum of 85% (age group of 35-39 years) before decreasing down to 45.2% age group of 85+) due to widowhood ..
- The percentage of divorced persons is less than 3%, while the percentage of the separated persons is below 1.5% among all age groups.

School attendance among children varies across education levels:

- It is very low (21%) for the preschool-age population (3-6 years), very high (91%) for the primary school-age population (7-12 years), and high (79%) for the secondary school-age population (13-18 years) at the time of the census.
- School attendance varies also across sectors:
 - for the pre-school-age, it varies from 8% in Nkomane to 31% in Kibirizi;
 - for the primary school-age, it varies from 85% in Nkomane to 95% in Mbazi, and
 - For the secondary school, it varies from 71% in Gatare to 87% in Mbazi.

Table 11 reveals that not all children attending primary school level are of the official age for that level (7-12 years):

- The gross attendance rates are greater than 100% in all sectors, with minor variations. The net attendance rate (NAR) in Primary school for Nyamagabe district (87.9%) is the same as NAR at Province and low NAR at National level (87% and 88%, respectively).
- The highest net attendance rate in primary school (90.9%) is in Musange sector followed by Cyanika (90.4) sector with 87.9% while the sector with the lowest NAR is Nkomane with 83.5%.

- The net and gross attendance rates in secondary education are below 50%. This means that more than half of the Rwandan children who are supposed to attend secondary school are not actually attending that level.
- There are minor differences in the attendance rates between males and females,
- There are very important variations by sector. For instance net attendance rate is 34.9% in Gasaka sector while it is 9.6% in Mugano sector.

- Among the population aged 3 years and above in Nyamagabe district, 29.9% of them have no education, 56.5% attained primary level and 8.7% attained secondary level, while 0.9% attained university.
- Level of educational attainment varies across sectors; Gasaka sector has the highest proportion which attained secondary level, (16% of residents) and the highest proportion of residents who attained university (3.1%).

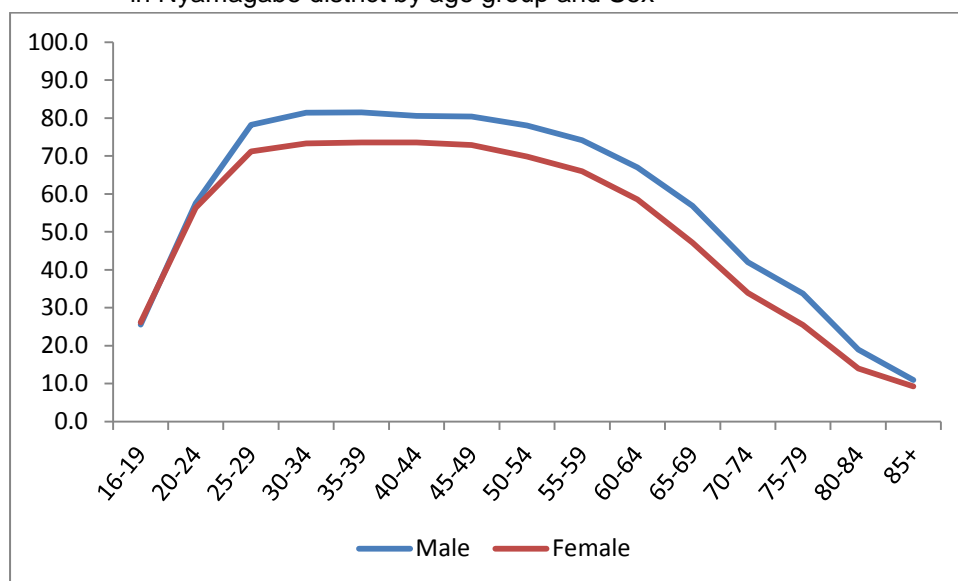

- The official working age in Rwanda is 16 years and above
- The labour force participation varies greatly by district in Southern Province: from 61.2% in Nyamagabe and 79.4% in Muhanga district.
- 61.2% of resident aged 16 years and above are in labour market , either or looking for a job (economically active)
- Labour force participation rate is slightly high among males than females in both urban (69.8 vs 60.1) and rural areas (63.4 vs 59.0)

allows the study of the calendar and intensity of labour force participation and its variation by sex .The figure reveals:

- Early entry and late exit to the labour market in Nyamagabe district.As shown by the graph,the labour market were around 25% at age 16(the official entry age in the labour market) and above 65% at age 65 (official age of retirement).
- Labour force participation is intense (between ages 25 and 60) with more than 60% of the population in the labour market.
- Some gender disparities are remarkable in labour force participation: at all age groups males contribute more than females to labour force.

In the Southern Province, variations of unemployment rate are important by District; from 1.6 % in Muhanga to 3.1% in Nyamagabe District

- At the national level ,the percentage of children whose birth was registered is 79%.
- Nyamagabe District is the district in the Province with the lowest percentage (72.7%) of children whose birth was registered at the time of the census.
- Birth registration does not vary by sex in Nyamagabe district while it varies a lot by area of residence and it is higher in rural areas (79.8%) than in urban area (74%).

Children labour depends on their ages.

- Between 5 and 9 years few children (0.9%) were employed during seven days preceding the Census at the national level. This percentage is 0.8% in Nyamagabe District. There is no difference between girls and boys.
- Between 10 years and 14 years, the percentage of children who were employed during the census were around 2.8% at the national level, while it is 1.7% in Nyamagabe District.
- Between 15-17years, 21% of children were employed during the census at the national level. This percentage is 12.9% in Nyamagabe District.

Figure 6: Employment among children aged 5-17 years in Nyamagabe district by age group and sex

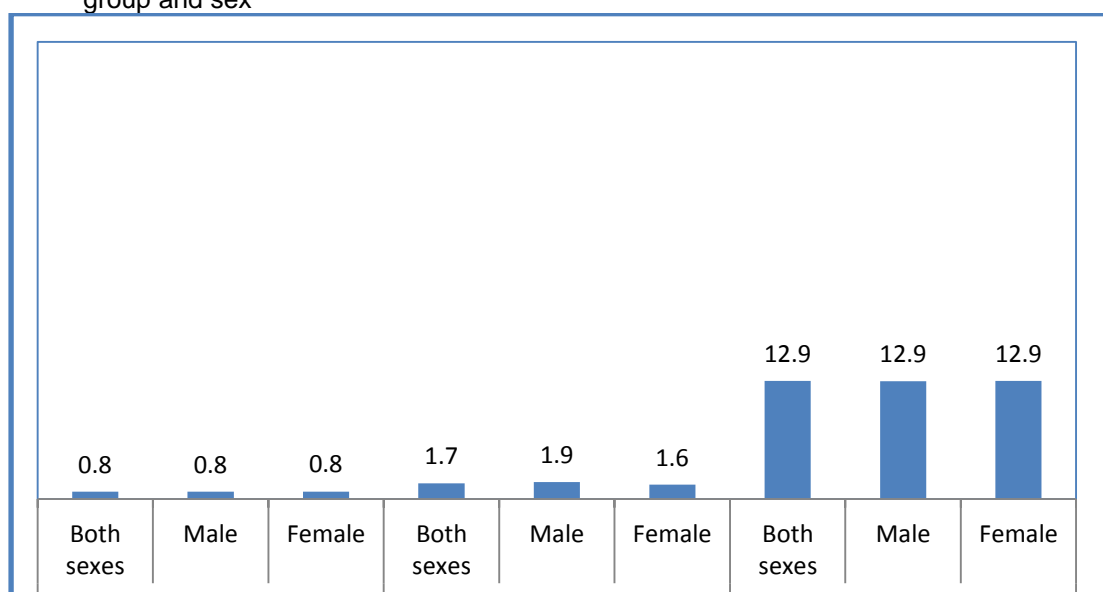

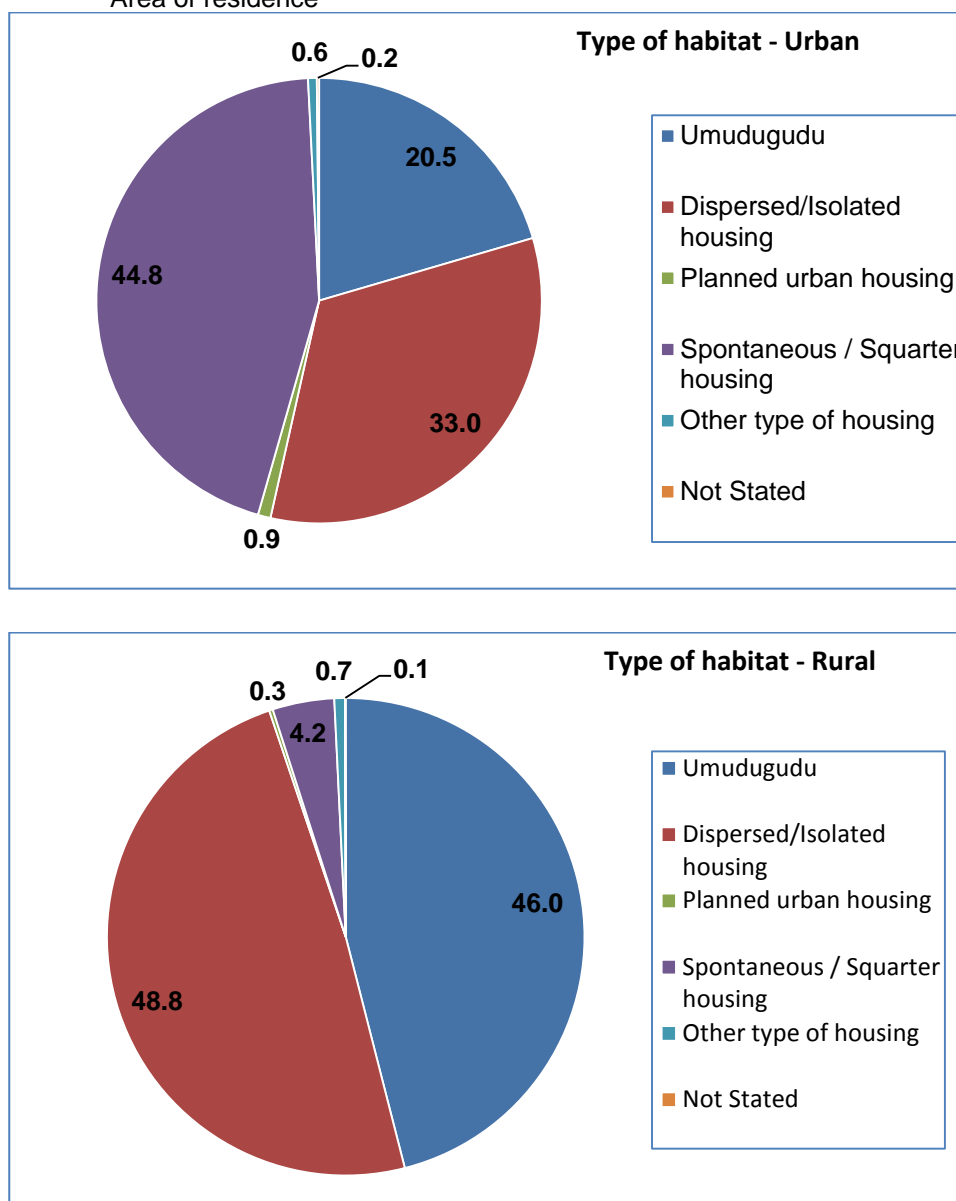

- The most common type of habitat in Nyamagabe district is dispersed/isolated housing (47.8%) followed by clustered rural settlement known as Umudugudu making up 44.3% of private households and spontaneous/squatter housing (6.8%).
- The type of habitat varies a lot across sectors. The clustered rural settlement is more common in sectors of Cyanika with 68.9%, Kibumbwe with 68.2%; Kibirizi, Uwinkingi and Mbazi have 63% respectively. Kitabi sector has the least percentage of population in clustered rural settlement (5.1%) at the same time has the highest percentage of Dispersed/isolated housing with 75%. More spontaneous/squatter housing was found in Gasaka (39.3%) and Kitabi (19%).

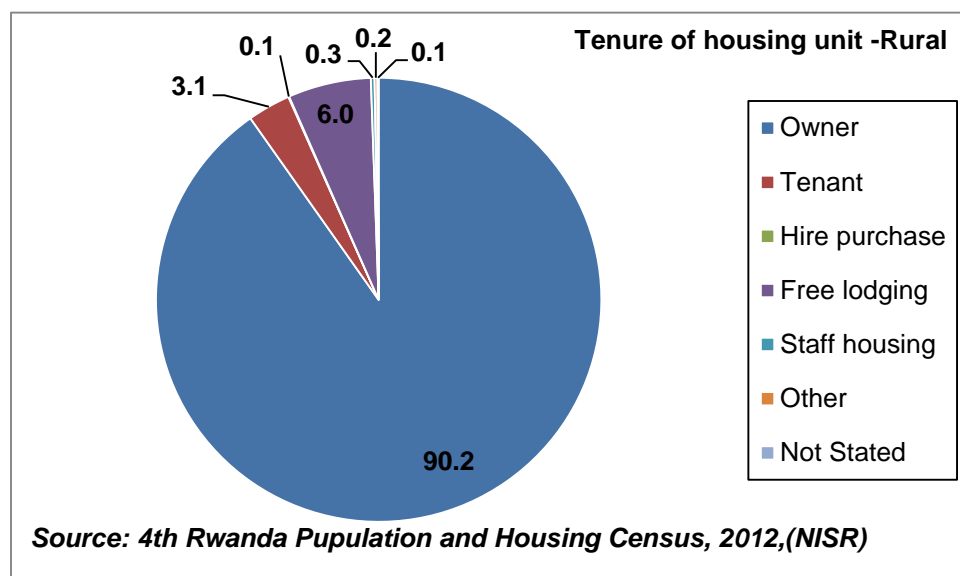
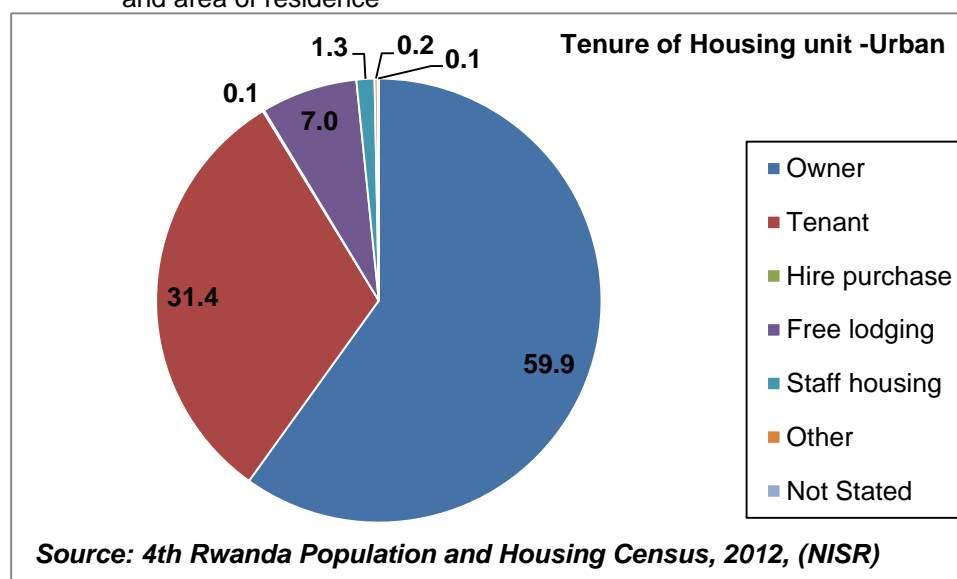

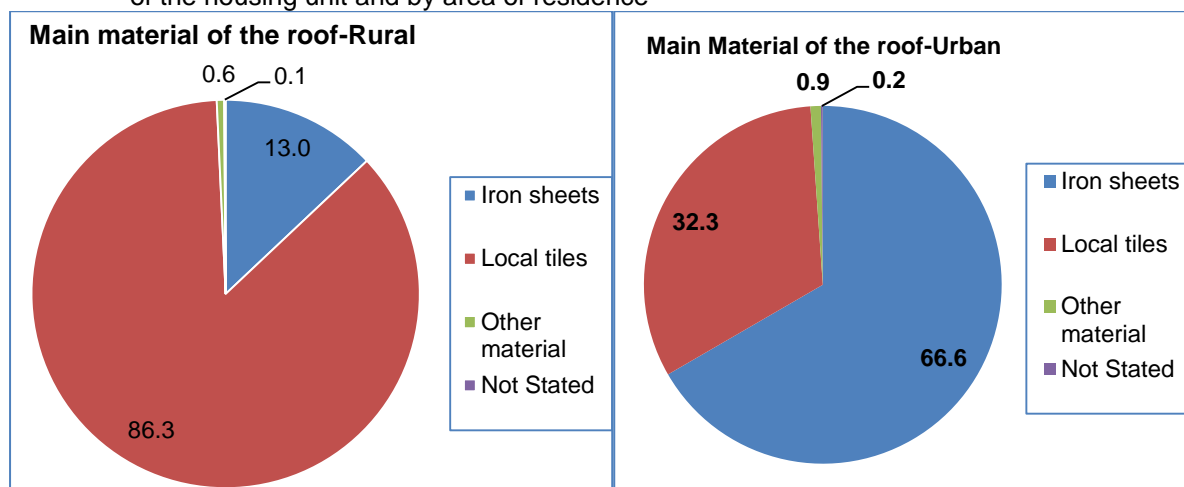

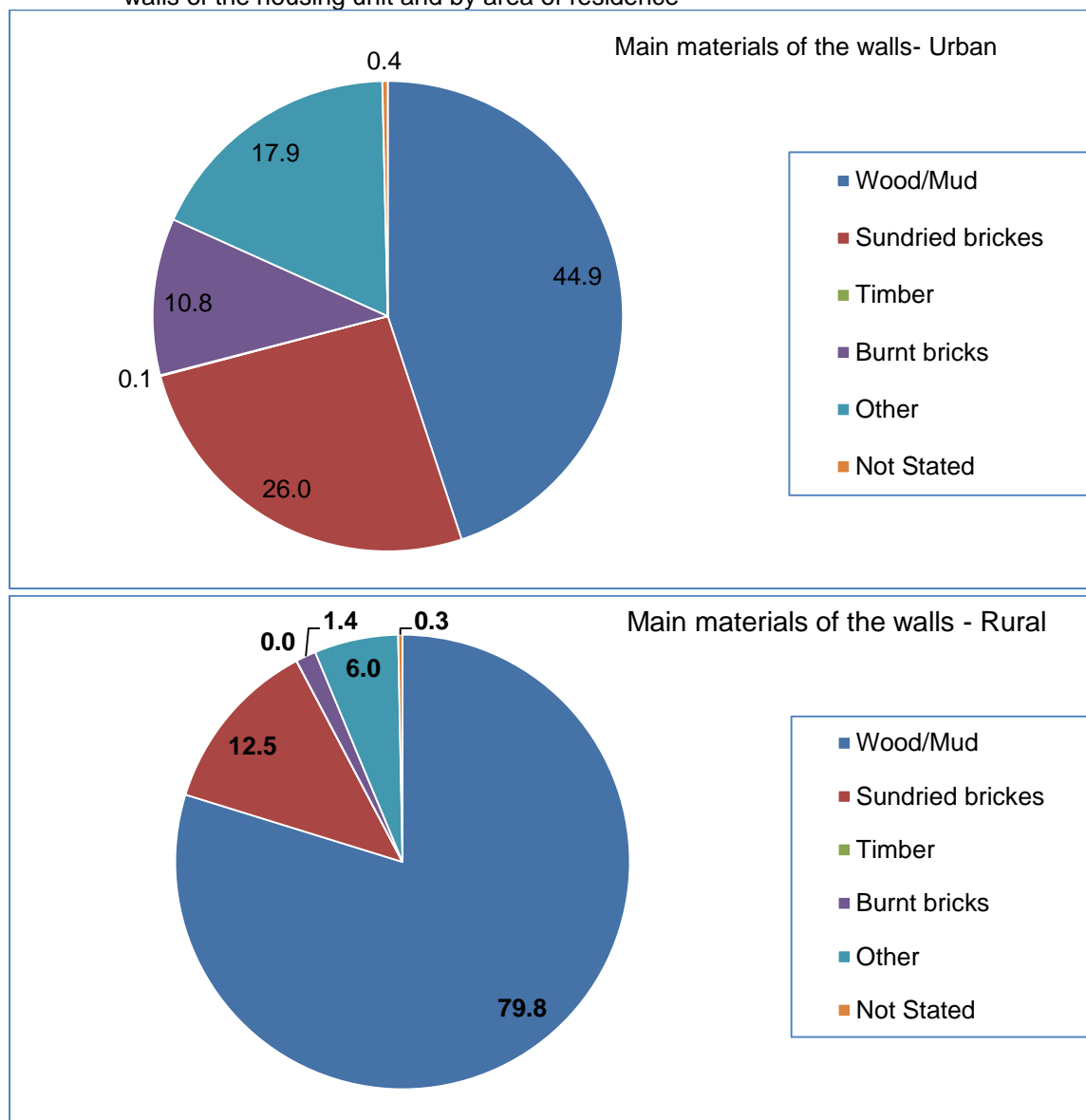

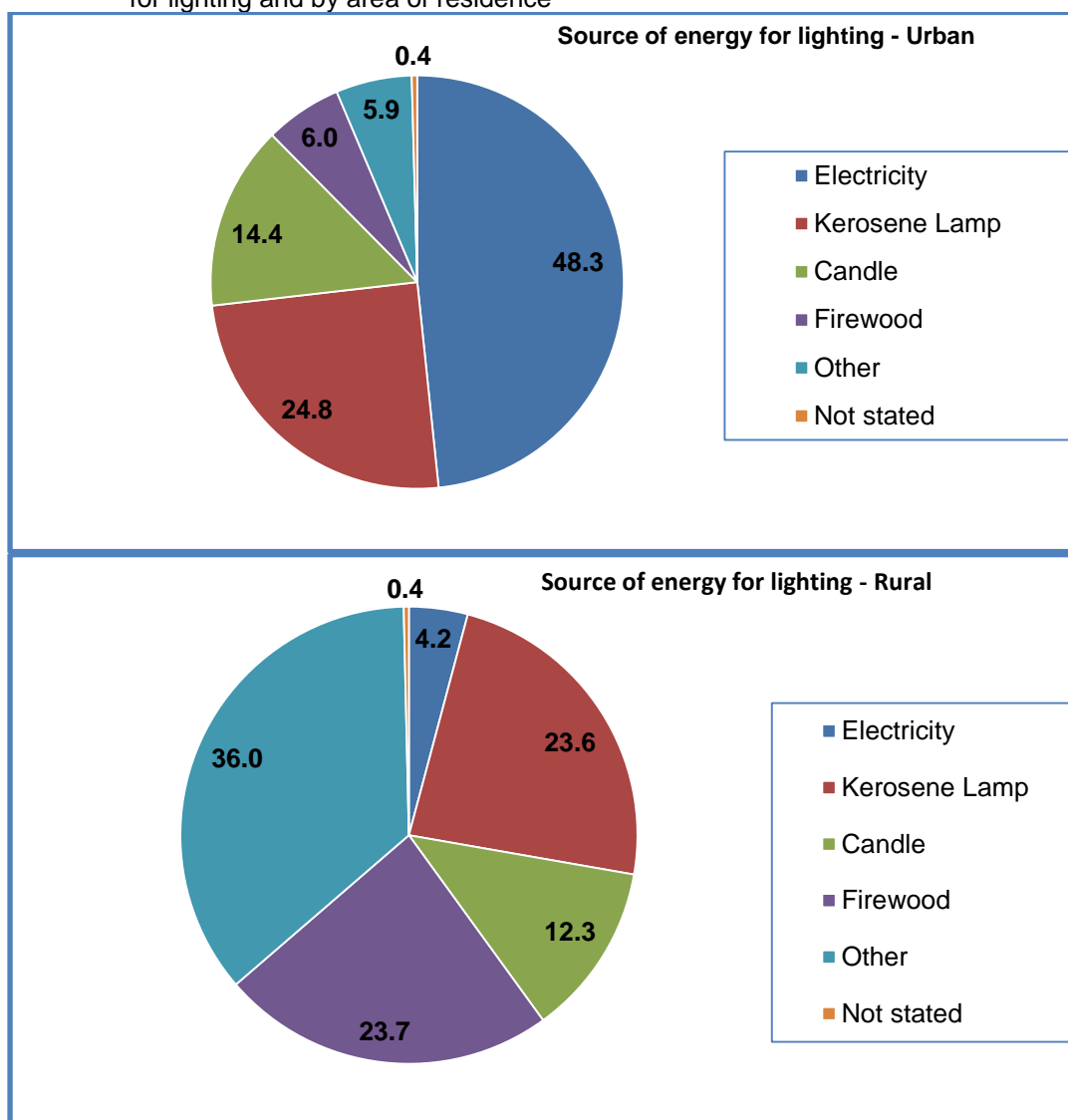

- In Nyamagabe district, the main source of energy for lighting used by the private households is unspecified (34%), followed by kerosene lamp (23.7%), firewood (22.5%) and candle (12.4%).

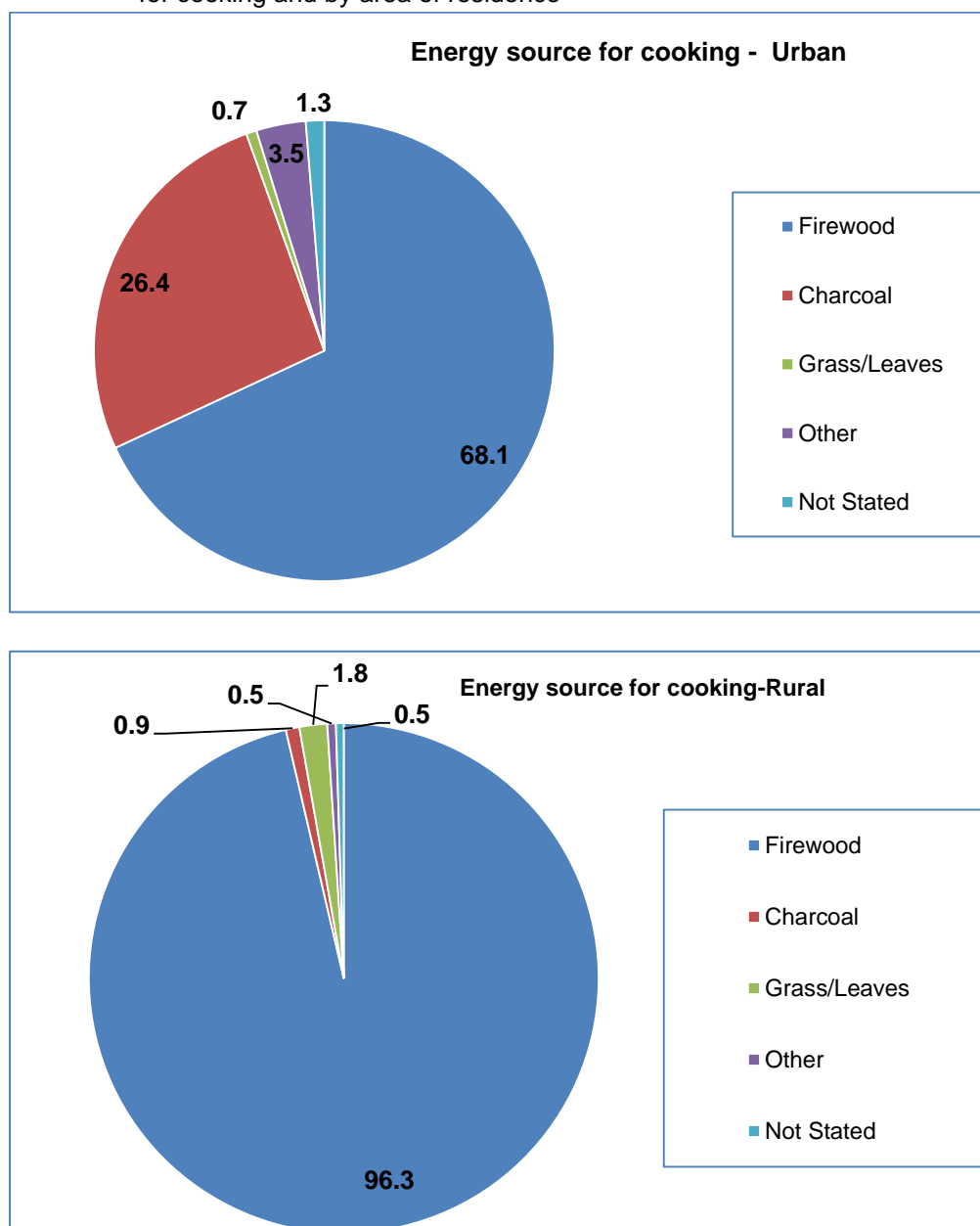

Figure 13: Distribution (%) of the private households of Nyamagabe District by main source of water by Sector

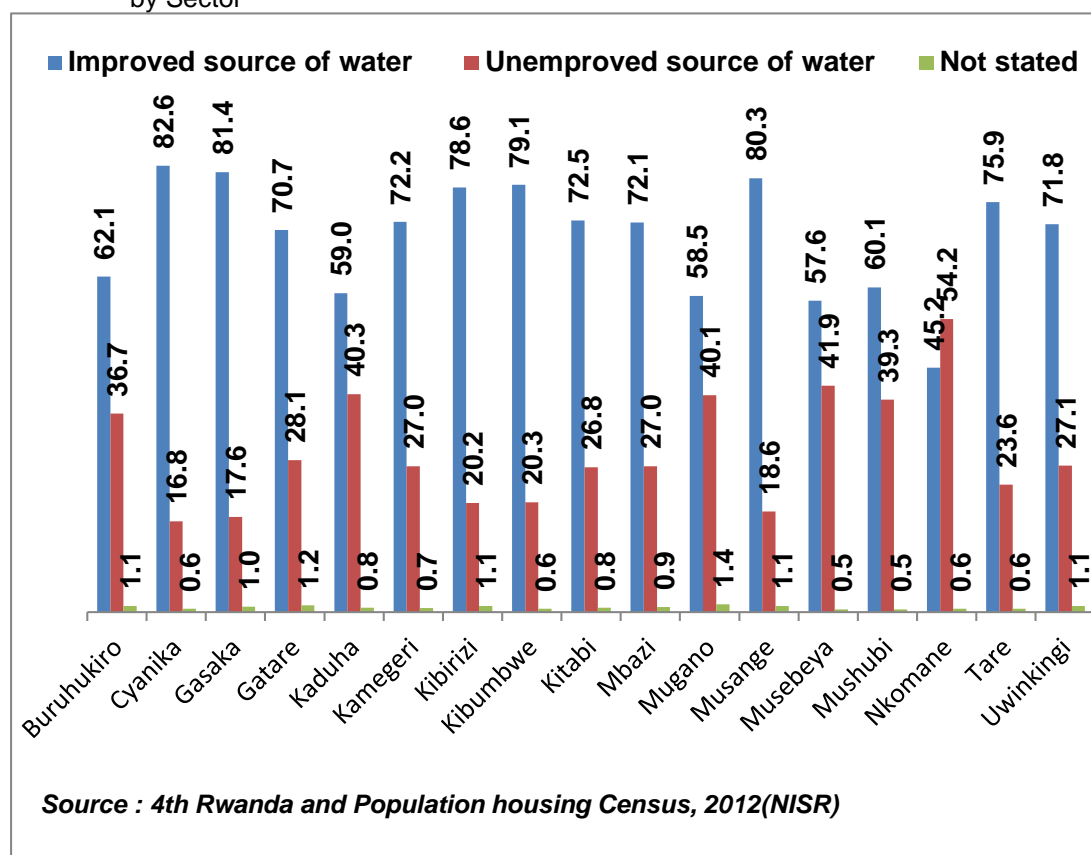
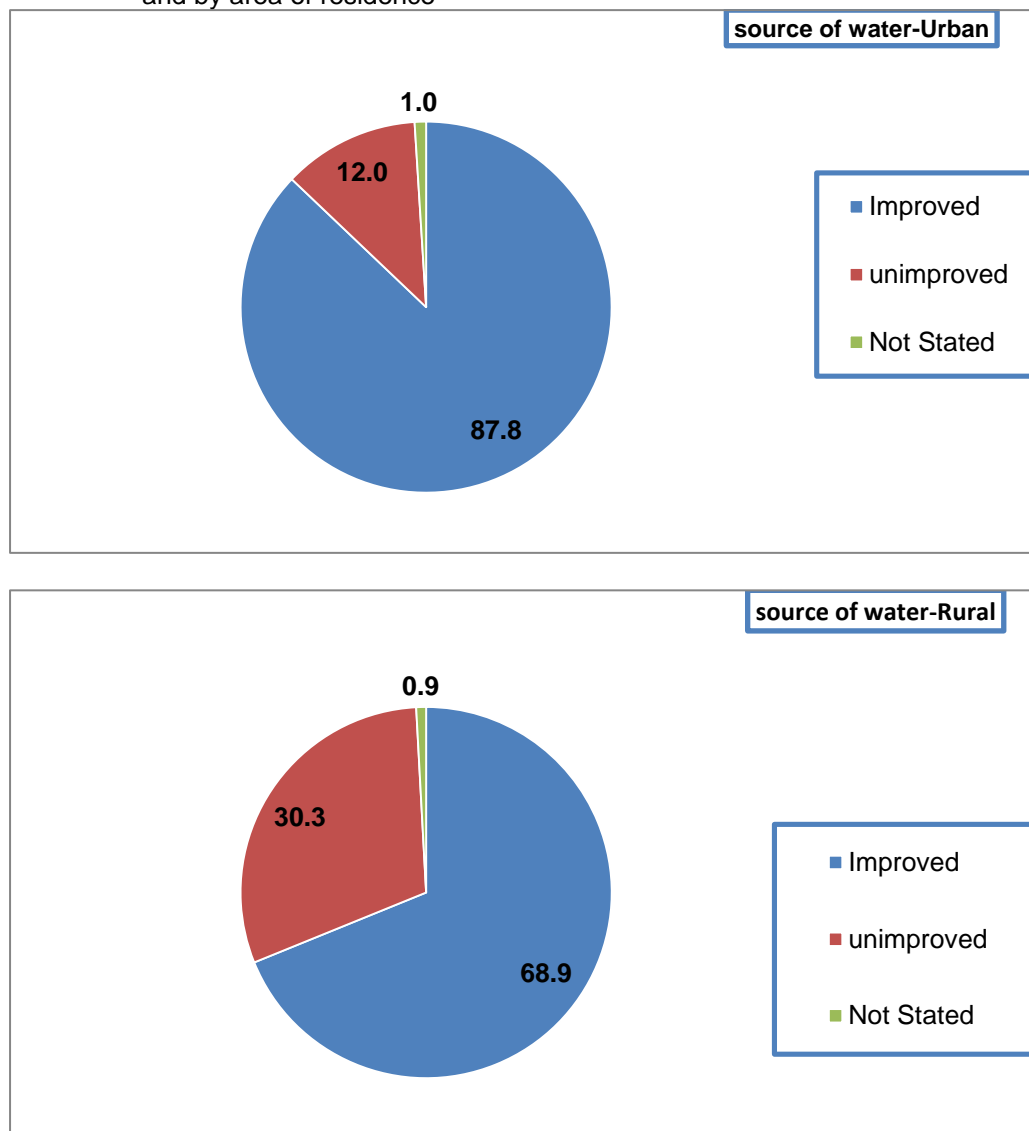


Figure 14: Distribution (%) of the private households of Nyamagabe District by main source of water and by area of residence

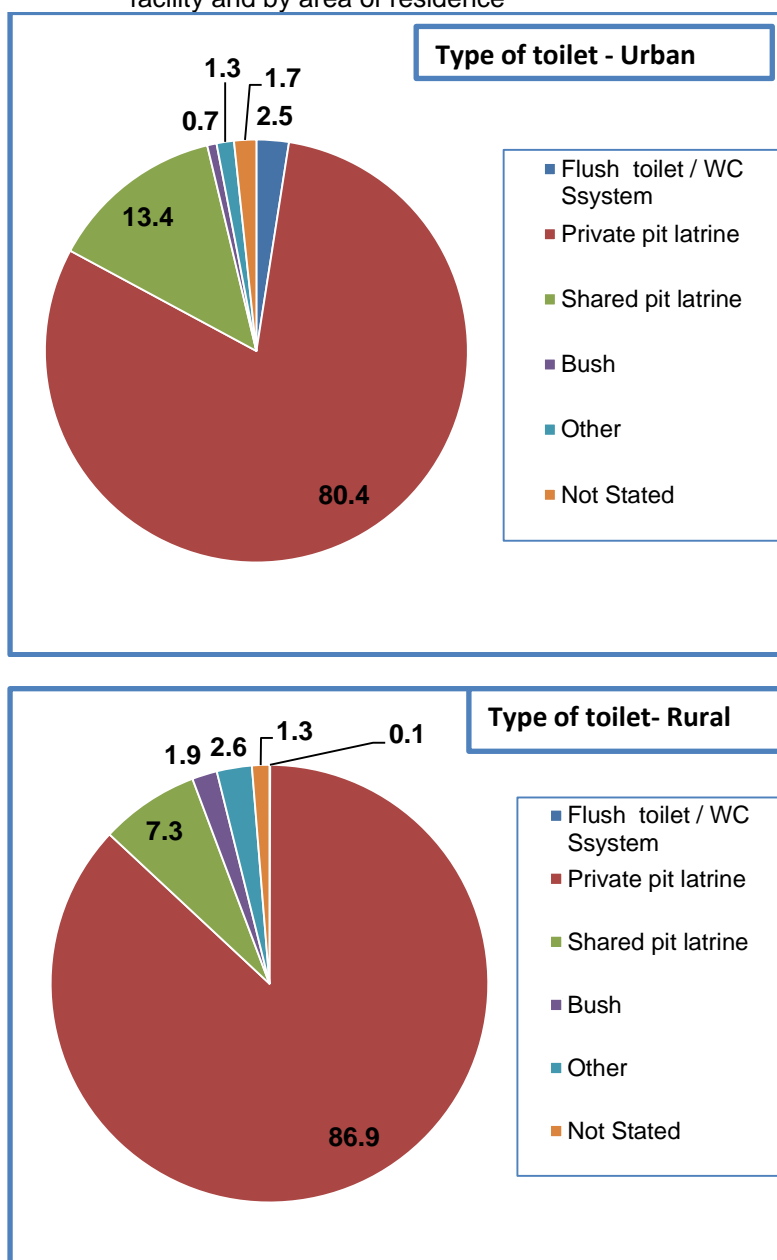

- At district level, the main types of toilet facility used by the private households are private pit latrine (86%) and shared pit latrine (7%). Only 0.2% of the private households of the district are equipped with flush toilet/WC system.
- At the sector level, the proportion of households using private pit latrines is high in all sectors of the district. It varies between 82% and 94% across the sectors.
- For the shared pit latrines, Nkomane is the sector with high proportion of private households using this kind of toilet (13.8%). It varies between 2% and 12% in other sectors.

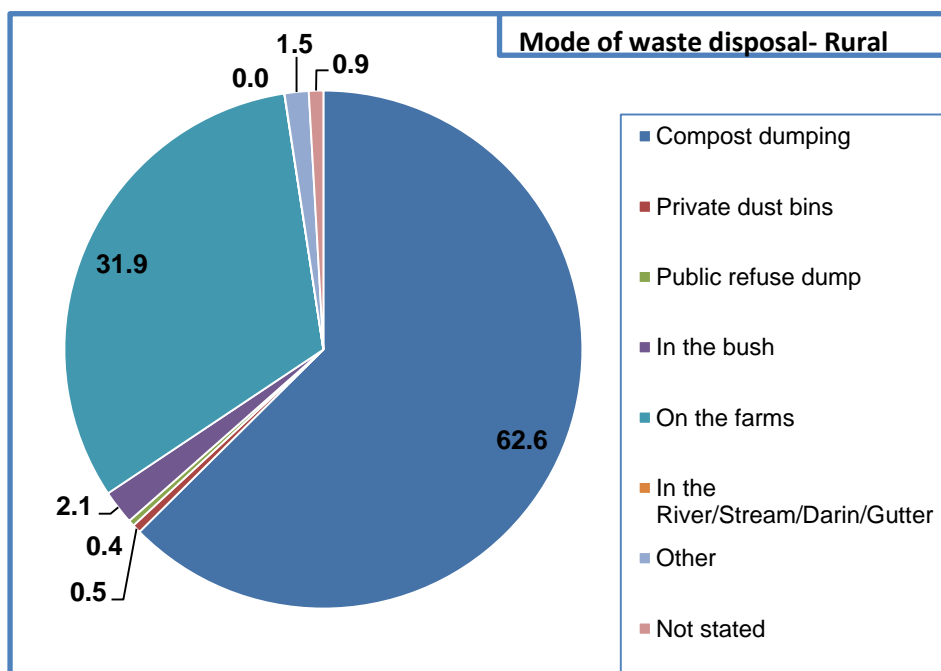
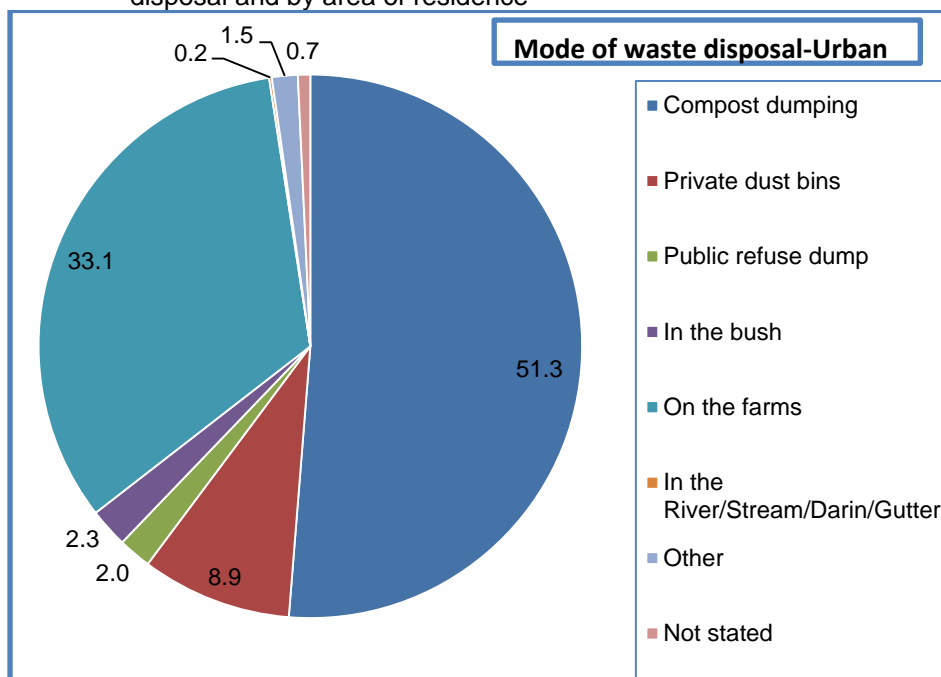

- In Nyamagabe District, the main modes of waste disposal used by the private households are the compost dumping (61.8%), farms (32%), bushes (2.2%) and private dust bins (1.1%).
- Sectors with the highest percentages of households using compost dumping are Mushubi (80%), Gatare (76%) and Uwinkingi (75%),
- Sectors with the highest proportions of households disposing their waste on the farms are Mbazi (50%), Kibirizii (47%) and Kamegeri (49%).

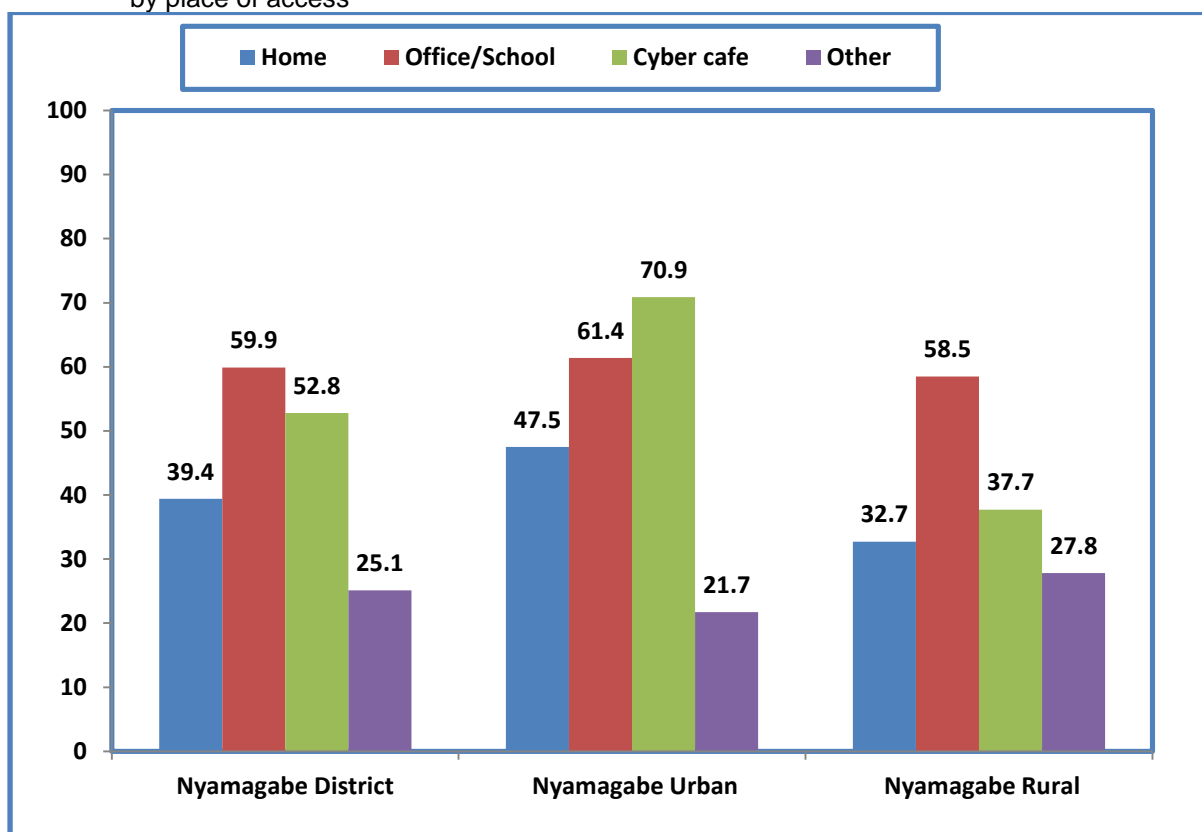
