





My greatest gratitude extends to the Government of Rwanda and development partners for availing logistical and technical support.





- The 4th Rwanda Population and Housing Census (PHC4) has enumerated 2,471,239 residents in the Western Province, which represent 23.5% of the total population of Rwanda (10,515,973 residents).
- The population of Western Province is predominantly female; 1,302,794 are women corresponding to 52.7% of the total population of the province.
- Rubavu, Rusizi and Nyamasheke are the mostly populated districts with more than 380 thousands residents for each. Their populations represent, respectively, 16.3%, 16.2% and 15.4% of the total resident population of the Western province.
- The least populated district is Nyabihu with 290 thousand inhabitants, corresponding to 12% of the total resident population of the Western Province.
- Three districts with high population density (Inhabitants per km²) are Rubavu (1,039 inhabitants/km²), Nyabihu (555 inhabitants /km²) and Ngororero (491 inhabitants km²).
- The district with low population density (Inhabitants/km²) is Rutsiro (281 inhabitants /km²).



- The 4th Rwanda Population and Housing Census (PHC) has enumerated **333,713** residents in Ngororero district, which represent 13.5% of the total population of the Western Province (2,471,239 residents).
- The population of Ngororero district is predominantly female; **179,122** are women corresponding to 53.7% of the total population.
- Females are predominant in all sectors of the district.
- Ngororero, Kabaya and Muhanda are the most populated Sectors, respectively with 34,559, 34,085, and 28,247 inhabitants each. They represent 10.4%, 10.2% and 8.5 % of the total population of the district, respectively.
- Two less populated sectors are Bwira sector with 18,632 inhabitants and Muhororo sector with 21,463 inhabitants. They represent 5.6% and 6.4% of the total resident population of Ngororero district respectively.

- Ngororero district is almost rural: 96.3% of the resident population (321,468 inhabitants) lives in rural areas.
- Only two sectors are urbanized i.e. Kabaya with 19% and Ngororero with 16.7% population residing in urban areas.

- Ngororero population is mostly young; 63.2% of the resident population of Ngororero district is under 25 years old, as shown by the age pyramid (Figure 4), reflecting the high level of fertility in the recent past.
- The elderly (60 years and above) represent (4.7) of the total population of the district. The distribution of the resident population by age and by sector is in the annex.

Figure 4: Age pyramid of the resident population of Ngororero district in 2012



- Some age groups are targets of specific interventions. For instance, children under five years for immunization programs, children in primary school age (7-12 years), people in the official working age group (16-64 years), etc.
- Knowing the size of such groups is of great importance for the design, implementation, monitoring and evaluation of programs targeting such groups. The above table gives the size of the main interventions target groups by sex, and their share in the entire population of Ngororero district.
- The population aged 0-17 represent 50.3 % of the total population of the district. Economically active population aged 16 - 64 years represent 51.1%.

- 49% of resident population of Ngororero district aged 12 and above was married at the time of census, while 41.8% was never married. Up to 7.5% were widowed, while divorced and separated are relatively few (1.2%, and 0.4% respectively).
- At the sector level,
 - Two sectors have high percentage of currently married people; Sovu (53%) and Muhanda sectors (52.8%),
 - Percentages of never married persons varies between 38% in Sovu and 44.8% in Kabaya
 - Ndaro and Nyange sectors have high percentages of widowed persons (about 8.7% each) while the low percentage is found in Kavumu (6.2%).

The percentages of the resident population of Ngororero district by marital status vary by sex and age:

- The percentage of never married persons decreases quickly from 99% (age group of 12-14 years) to 2.6% (age group of 85 years and above).
- The percentage of persons currently married starts by increasing from 0.7% (age group of 12-14 years) to a maximum of 85.3% (age group of 30-34 years) before decreasing down to 40% mainly due to widowhood.
- The percentage of divorced persons never reaches 3%, while the percentage of the separated persons is below 1% among all age groups.

School attendance among children varies across education levels:

- School attendance is low (28.1%) for pre-school age population (3-6 years), very high (92.0%) for primary school-age population (7-12 years), and high (69.1%) for secondary school-age population (13-18 years).
- School attendance varies across the sectors:
 - for pre-school age, it varies from 15.7% in Muhanda to 39.5% in Ngororero;
 - for primary schoolage, it varies from 76.7% in Muhanda to 97. % in Muhororo and
 - for secondary school age, it varies from 58.8% in Muhanda to 76.5% in Gatumba.

Table 11 shows that, not all children attending primary school level are of the official age for that level (7-12 years).

- The gross attendance rates are greater than 100% in all sectors, with minor variations. The net attendance rate (NAR) in primary school for Ngororero district is 87.5% which is below the NAR at province and national level (88.7% and 88.2% respectively).
- The high net attendance rate in primary school is in Muhororo (93.6%) sector followed by Ngororero with 93.4%, while the sector with low NAR is Muhanda with 73.0%.

- School attendance in secondary level is far from being universal in Ngororero district. The net attendance rate is below 25% and gross attendance rate is below 45%. This means that more than 50% of Ngororero children who are supposed to attend secondary school are not attending that level.
- There are differences in both attendance rates (GAR and NAR) among males and females: the GAR is 28.6 % for males vs 29.7% for females while NAR is 14.1% for males vs 17% for females.
- There are variations by sector: the net attendance rate is 23.5% in Gatumba while it is 8.9% in Muhanda sector.

- Among the population aged 3 years and above in Ngororero district, 31.2% of them have no education, 56.7% attained primary level and 6.5% attained secondary level, while 0.6% attained university.
- Level of educational attainment varies across sectors and Gatumba sector has high percentage who attained secondary level (9.8%), while Kabaya has high percentage of residents who attained university (1.3%).



- The official working age in Rwanda is 16 years and above.
- The labour force participation varies greatly by district in Western province: from 65.2% in Rubavu and 80.1% in Ngororero district.
- 80.1% of resident aged 16 years and above are in the labour market, either working or looking for a job (economically active).
- Labour force participation rate is higher in rural areas (80.6%) than in urban areas (66.8%) of Ngororero districts; and among females (80.2%) than (79.9%).

Figure 5 allow the study of the calendar and intensity of labour force participation and its variation by sex .The figure reveals:

- Early entry and late exit to the labour market in Ngororero district .The labour force participation is around 45% at age 16 (the official entry age in the labour market) and above 70% at age 65 (official age of retirement).
- Labour force participation is intense between ages 25 and 60 with more than 80% of population in the labour market.
- Some gender disparities in labour force participation were observed between 16 and 19 years, females contribute more than males, while from age 25 and above, females contribution becomes less than males’.

- In western Province, variations of unemployment rate are important by district: from 2.0% in Karongi and Ngororero each to 5.2% in Rubavu district.
- 2.0% of the total active population aged 16 years and above in Ngororero district were unemployed during the week preceding the time of census.
- Unemployment rate is higher in urban areas than rural (4.1% vs 1.9%) and among females than males' (2.2% vs 1.7%).

- Birth registration varies slightly by sex in Ngororero district (76.1% for male and 76.0% for female) while it varies a lot by area of residence and it is more common in urban (78.3%) than in rural areas (76.0%).

The situation is better in Rusizi (87%), Nyamasheke (86%), Karongi (80%) and Ngororero (76.1%) whose percentages of birth registration is higher than the average of western province (75.6%).

- 0.9% of children between 5 and 9 years, few children (0.9%) were employed at the time of census at the national level. This percentage is 0.5% in Ngororero district. There is a slight difference between girls (0.9%) and boys(1.0%).
- Among children aged between 10 and 14 years, the percentage of children who were employed during seven days preceding the census is 2.8 % at national level, while it is 4.4% in Ngororero district.
- Between 15-17years, 21.2% of children were employed during seven days preceding the census at the national level. This percentage is 28.4% in Ngororero district.

Figure 6: Employment among children aged 5-17 in Ngororero district by age group and sex.



In Ngororero district, 54.6% of elderly are married and 41.6% are widowed. Marital status among elderly varies slightly by sector of residence. Celibacy, divorce and separation are rare among the elderly (less than 3.5% all together).




- The most common type of habitat in Ngororero district is dispersed / Isolated housing 69.7%, followed by clustered rural settlement (Umudugudu) (26.3%) and spontaneous/squatter housing (3.5%).
- The percentage of dispersed/isolated housing across sectors varies between 57.0% and 85.1%.










- In Ngororero district, the main sources of energy for lighting used by private households are kerosene lamp (36.8%), firewood (26.9%), candle (5.5%) and electricity (4.7%). However a high percentage of the households (19%) use an unspecified source of energy for their lighting (25.6%)..
- At the sector level, the percentage of private household using kerosene lamp for lighting is high in Ngororero (65.3%) and Matyazo (60.2%) sectors.
- The sector with high percentage of private households using firewood for lighting is high in Muhanda (53,9%) and Kavumu(52.4%) sectors.



Figure 13: Distribution (%) of the private households of Ngororero district by improved and unimproved source of water and by Sector





Figure 14: Distribution (%) of the private households of Ngororero district by main source of water and by area of residence





- In Ngororero district, the main modes of waste disposal used by the private households are compost dumping (50.7%), farms (34.9%), bush (10.9%) and private dust bins (1.6%).
- Sectors with high percentages of households using compost dumping are Matyazo (63.1%) and Nyange (60.1%).
- Sectors with high percentages of households disposing their waste on the farms are Sovu (53.7%) and Kageyo (52.7%).



Sectors with high percentages of private households with access to internet from office or school are Muhanda (66.7%) and Bwira (65%), and low in Ndaro (48.6%), Muhororo (48.7%) and Kavumu (48.8%).

- Sector with high percentage of private households with access to internet through Cyber-cafes is Nyange (62.7%), and low in Muhanda (11.8%),
